

Do This in Memory of Me

At our wedding reception as we were making the customary visit to each table, a friend and co-worker said to me, “Remember to remember.” Gina was a wonderful mentor, but she’d never been married, and I wasn’t sure at the time what she meant. I decided to try to commit everything to memory. She was urging me to soak up, to take in all that had happened that day and all that was still unfolding. As many of you know, weddings and many other sacramental celebrations are full of symbols, overwhelmed with emotions, and the challenge of remembering the guests one has not seen in years. Gina’s advice was to not lose sight of the big picture amid the minutiae. After nearly eleven years, I’ve done a much better job remembering the Mass than the after-party.

Jesus invited his disciples to partake of bread and wine as memorial. How do we remember? Are we supposed to recreate every detail of that night? We can’t. Those details are lost to time. Furthermore, if we get lost in the details, we miss the big picture. This meal these friends shared was the culmination of many experiences they’d had together. Eucharist is our ritual for recalling all the ministry. The gospel passage offered for today is the feeding of 5000 men with loaves and fish. What always nabs my attention in this passage is the generosity and abundance. The generous sharing of food—likely all who could were moved to make contributions—is paired with the baskets of leftovers. When we participate in Eucharist do we remember the generosity and abundance of Christ? Jesus blesses, offers, and sustains us with his very self; it is his flesh and blood we consume. If we consume, we pledge to also be abundantly generous (recall the father of the Prodigal Son). We don’t eat to think about Jesus, we eat to do what Jesus did and what he invites us to do. In so doing, we keep Jesus’ memory alive.

God help us, we pray, to remember our Lord Jesus by acting compassionately, sharing generously of goods and talents, and to do all we do for your glory. We are blessed people and we ask your help to bless others. Amen.
