DRESS CODE

All students must be in full uniform by the 7:55 AM bell. If changing at school, students must be in a bathroom or locker room area. No changing into the uniform is permitted in the hallway.

Uniform

- The Little Flower uniform consists of:
- a maroon jumper, hemmed to **no more than one (1) inch above the knee**;
- a white long-sleeved or short-sleeved blouse
- maroon Trimfit Cotton Spandex socks worn at the knee or maroon stockings;
- maroon & white saddle shoe; the solid-color maroon shoe may be worn if the maroon and white is unavailable.
 - o If a student has a medical condition that prevents her from wearing the regulation shoe a **doctor's note** indicating why/for how long and requesting a shoe pass must be presented in the Student Life Office;
- the appropriate class emblem, <u>sewn</u> on the upper left side of the jumper;
- the official Little Flower uniform maroon cardigan school sweater sold at Flynn & O'Hara
- Only seniors are permitted to wear the "senior sweater." Orders will take place in the spring of junior year and again in September.

Students whose uniforms need to be hemmed are responsible for making certain that the **hemline is regulation length.**Students are advised to avoid having the uniform cut. Those whose uniforms have been cut too short are in violation of the dress code and will receive the appropriate consequences.

Other characteristics of the Little Flower uniform policy:

- IDs must be worn during the school day on Little Flower lanyards. Only official school pins may be worn on the uniforms. **Pocketbooks and purses are not part of the uniform.** Students must keep their pocketbooks and purses in their book bag or lockers. Pocketbooks and purses are not permitted at Mass or any assembly.
- Hats, scarves, bandanas (except those "rolled" as headbands), and headbands wider than three (3) inches are not permitted.
- Students' hair color and style is to be appropriate (no mohawks, spikes, etc). If a student decides to dye her hair she must choose a <u>naturally occurring</u>, human color (No blue, burgundy, green, gold, orange, purple, neon red, stripes, half blond-half brunette, etc.)
- Jewelry, spangles, glitter etc. in the hair are not permitted.
- Make-up is to be appropriate for school attire; that is, no black or blue lipstick, no glitter eye shadow or face powder, etc.
- Excessive jewelry is not appropriate with the school uniform. Excessive earrings should not be worn, no earning larger than the size of a quarter are permitted. Gauge and disk earrings may not be worn. One chain with a moderate-sized charm may be worn. One small ring on each hand may be worn.
- Multiple bracelets may not be worn.
- Septum piercings, eyebrow rings, lip rings/studs, tongue studs, visible tattoos, face/ neck piercings, finger piercings, hand piercings, hand-web piercings and the like **ARE NOT PERMITTED.** This also pertains to students who continue to wear masks. No facial piercings are permitted unless it is a nose stud.

Depending on the nature of the violation, class/school attendance may be affected for those who choose to ignore the dress code.
