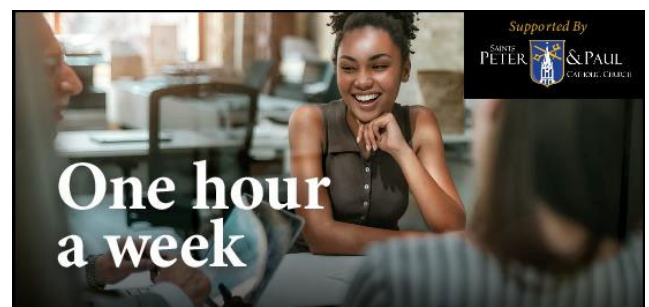

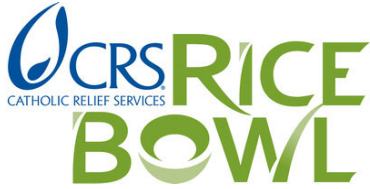

MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID COURSE APRIL 30 at St. Thomas the Apostle Church

What would you do if you encountered someone having a mental health crisis? Since you may be more likely to come upon someone experiencing an emotional crisis than someone having a heart attack, it's a good idea to know how to handle the situation calmly and efficiently.

Learn exactly what to do in such an emergency through "Blended Mental Health First Aid: CPR for the Brain," a training program that will be held from 9:00 a.m. – 4 p.m. *Saturday, April 30, at St. Thomas the Apostle Catholic Church, 1500 Brookdale Road, Naperville.*

Through the program, First Aiders will learn the signs and symptoms of mental health distress, risk and safety assessment, and intervention strategies. Participants also will learn how to safely and effectively support a person experiencing mental health distress.

After completing a two-hour, self-paced online class, First Aiders will participate in a six-hour in person instructor-led class. Instructors include Diane McQueen and Trina Lueckhoff, members of the Linden Oaks Hospital Mental Health First Aid Consortium which is sponsoring the course. Linden Oaks Hospital is a partner of Edward-Elmhurst Healthcare.

Registration for "Blended Mental Health First Aid: CPR for the Brain" is required by 11:30 p.m., Wednesday, April 20, and is available online at:

Cost of the program is \$23.95. Continuing education units also are available for LCPC/LPC, LCSW/LSW, LMRT, and psychologists.

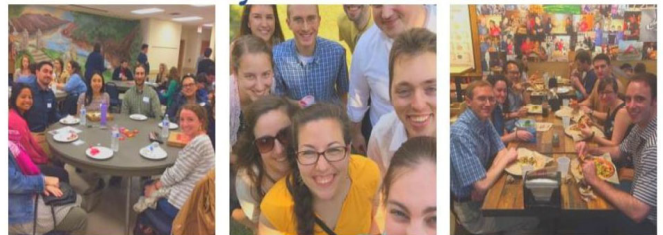

ANNULMENT FIELD ADVOCATE TRAINING

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Quite often, a person investigating the possibility of an annulment has a difficult time beginning the process. Those who help the person at a parish normally become the field advocate for that person's annulment case. This training, co-sponsored by the Office of Family Ministry and the Joliet Diocesan Tribunal, will provide potential "field advocates" and existing field advocates with pertinent information about the annulment process. It will also offer practical ways for the field advocate to assist, coach, and be spiritually supportive with the annulment petitioners.

Those who come to this training are selected and sent by their parish staff and, in turn, will serve their own parish in this ministry. The training will take place via Zoom from 9:00AM to 12:00PM and will be conducted by Tom Kerber and Dr. Valerie Maty, Associate Director of the Office of Family Ministry.

Fast and Abstinence Regulations

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on **Ash Wednesday** and all the **Fridays of Lent**.
2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast and to abstain on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**.
3. On **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year; all, in addition to following the Lenten regulations, are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

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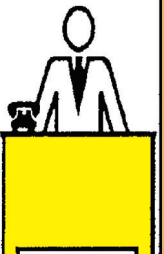
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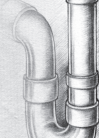
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
