I completed my Master of Divinity degree in December 2018, and graduated with my class in May 2019. Having served as Deacon at St. John Paul II in Kankakee, I was then ordained a priest that same month and year.

For the past three years, I have served as Parochial Vicar for Holy Family in Shorewood. Along this path, I have received guidance and help from priests and parishioners alike (along with staff members, of course!), and I look forward to the same within the community of Saints Peter and Paul. Likewise, I am very happy and excited to be able to share my vocation and ministry with all of you. To be sure, I await this new assignment with great anticipation.

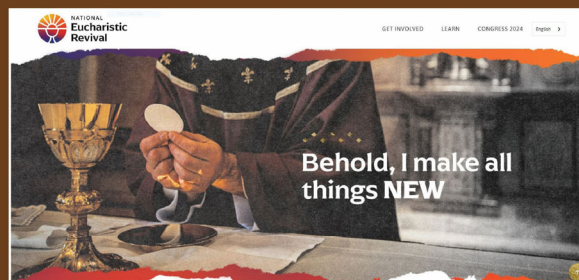
USCCB's National Eucharistic Revival

“The Eucharist is ‘the source and summit of the Christian life.’ The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch. (CCC 1324)

The mission of the National Eucharistic Revival (eucharisticrevival.org) is to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. This revival movement is in answer to a call by the Holy Spirit, and all the fruits belong to Him.

The revival is an unprecedented movement of Catholics across the United States—healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—sent out on mission “for the life of the world.”

The revival is a grassroots call and a challenge for every Catholic across the United States to rekindle the fire of love and devotion for the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus.



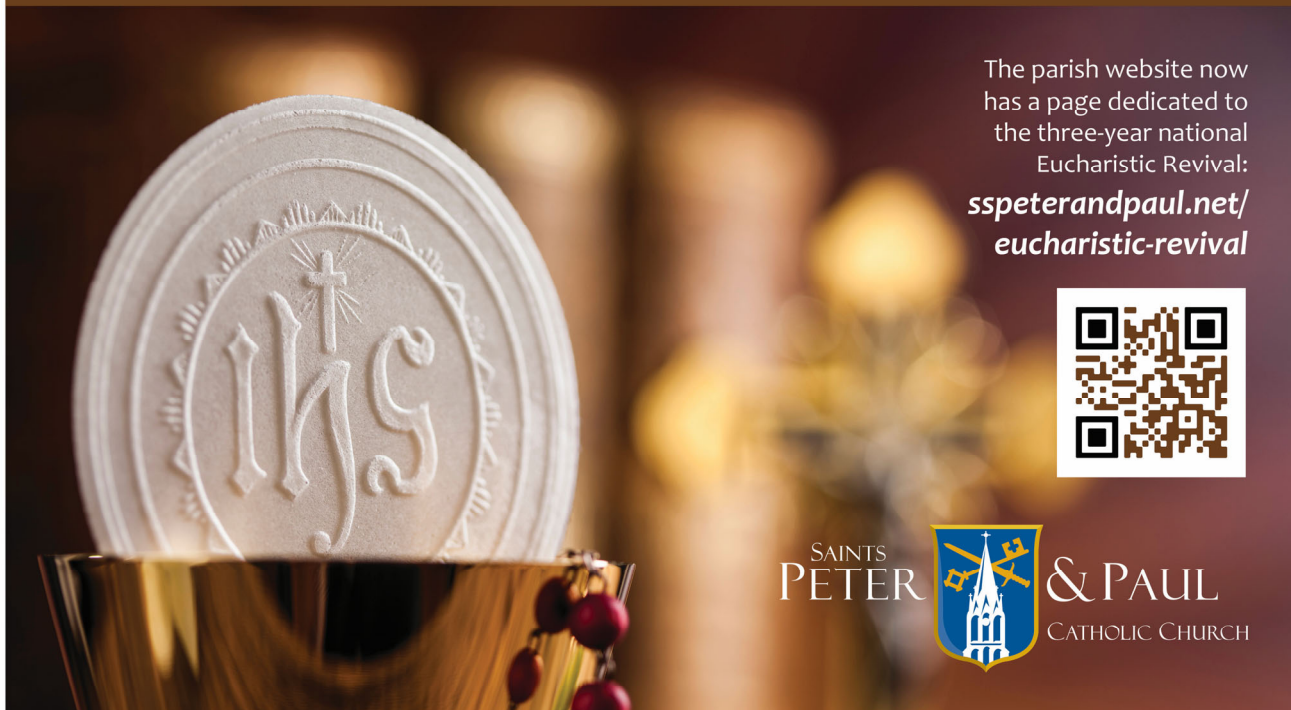
Initiatives at Saints Peter and Paul

CORPUS CHRISTI 2022

To kick off this movement, Saints Peter and Paul's Eucharistic procession took place on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ—Corpus Christi—on June 19, 2022. To highlight the importance of the start of the three-year revival, a temporary outdoor art display was installed on the front of the church steps. The 19th-century German design's Eucharistic medallion honored the lineage of the parish's founding families, and was implemented with assistance from St. John Cantius in Chicago. 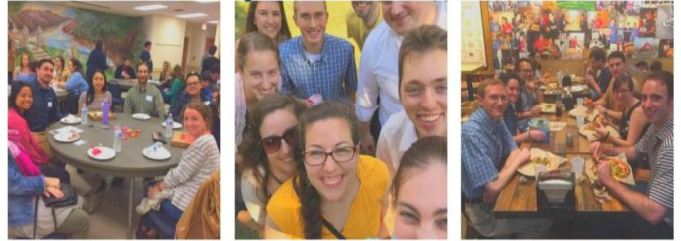

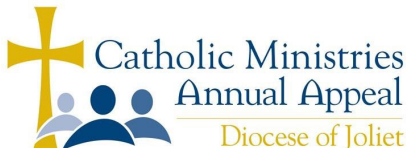

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION COMMISSION SEEKING NEW MEMBERS

The RE Commission serves as an advisory board to the pastor and his representatives in the Religious Education Department. It works to establish clear and open communication between parishioners and staff regarding the formation of children in the parish.

For the past two years, the Religious Education Commission has been on hiatus due to COVID and, more recently, lack of members. Without a leader for the Commission, the RE program lacks a representative on Parish Council. To that end, the Religious Education Commission is looking for interested parishioners to fill multiple vacancies, including a Commission leader.

Specific functions of the Commission include:

- Advise the Pastor, Parish Pastoral Council and Religious Education Director

- Assist in the coordination of our Religious Education Program with the objectives of the Diocesan Religious Education Program

- To recommend policy within the Religious Education Programs

- To assist in identifying and maintaining Religious Education goals

- To assist in establishing long range objectives for Religious Education programs and devise strategies to achieve these objectives

The Commission generally meets on the second Tuesday of the month from 6:00 – 7:30 PM. Members are asked to serve a three year term.

Applicants must be over 18 and a registered parishioner of Saints Peter and Paul. Since the Commission's primary concern is the Religious Education program, parishioners who are involved in the RE program or who have children attending classes in the program are especially encouraged to consider serving the parish in this manner.
