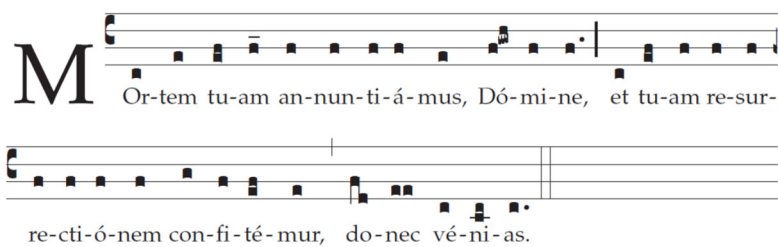

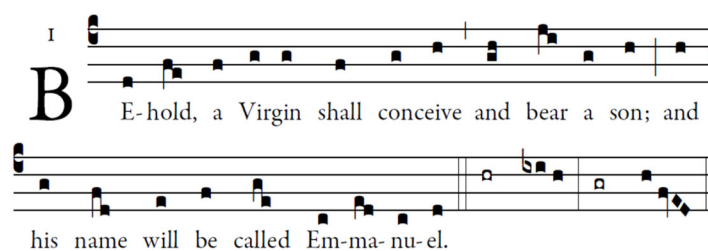

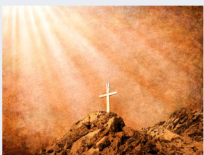

Light the Way 2022 was a huge success thanks to our sponsors, auction donors, volunteers, and attendees!

This year marked the 25th anniversary of the Light The Way event, which has raised more than \$1.8 million over its history. Your generosity has allowed us to address many needs within our parish and community.

Proceeds from the December 1 event will support the parish's outdoor lighting project, including the illumination of its historic church. As one of the tallest structures in downtown Naperville—the heart of the city—the steeple serves as a true beacon in the community, a sign of faith and hope for all.

In advance of the 100th anniversary of the building's dedication in 2027, Saints Peter and Paul is embarking on a major beautification project that will visually enhance the stunning architecture of the church, while also providing additional safety and security for parishioners, students, clergy, staff, and pedestrians. Enhancements will include architectural flood and spotlight fixtures, statuary and landscape lighting across the seven-acre campus, as well as the electrical wiring infrastructure to support it.

The lighting project will be completed in Spring or Summer 2023. The parish will update parishioners as information is finalized.

Las Posadas (“The Inns”) commemorates the journey that Joseph and Mary made from Nazareth to Bethlehem in search of a safe refuge where Mary could give birth to the baby Jesus. Travel with us as we process around campus, praying, singing carols, and immersing ourselves in the Nativity story.

- 7 p.m.** Las Posadas begins with the recitation of the Rosary (in English and Spanish) in the Ministry Center’s Holy Family Chapel.
- 7:30 p.m.** Attendees will then form a procession, caroling to various outdoor locations (dress for the weather) with prayers at each. Children are welcome to bring tambourines.
- 8 p.m.** The event concludes with a gathering in the Social Hall with tamales, hot chocolate, Christmas cookies, and piñatas!

Star-shaped piñatas represent the Star of David, which guided the three wise men to the newborn Jesus. And beating a piñata represents fighting sin; the candy pouring out represents the reward for fighting evil.

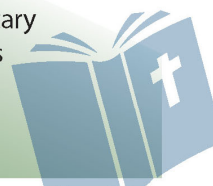

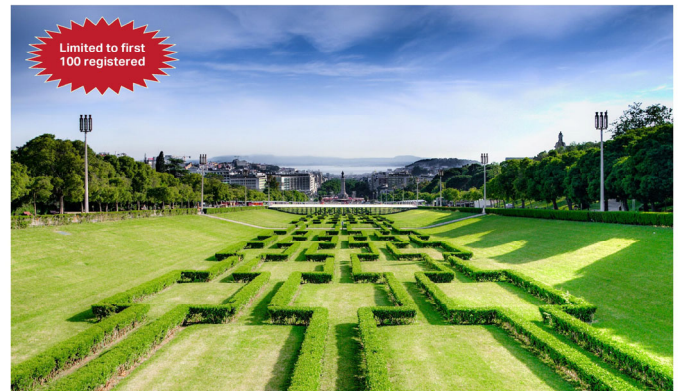
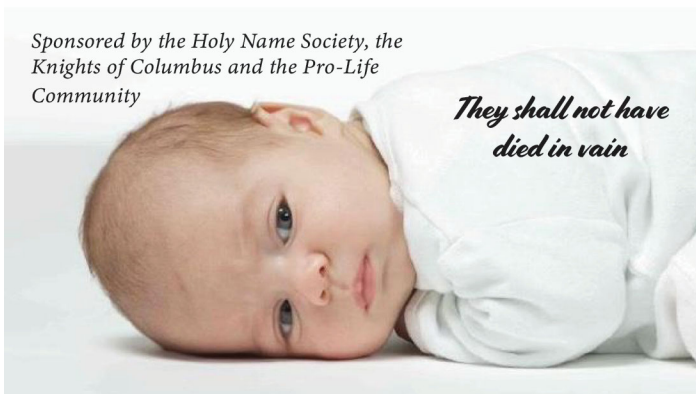
