Happy Father's Day to all the dads in our parish, and to those visiting us this weekend. Do something to remember your father, and to make the day special, especially if he has gone home to the Lord. As we celebrate Father's Day today, and honor those men in our lives who have been "Father" to us.... our own fathers, the Holy Father - Pope Leo, our bishops, priests, who we call "Father," our spiritual fathers, and all those men who have cared for us and nurtured us in anyway, let's offer to God our Loving Father a prayer of thanksgiving for His continued care for us.

This weekend, at all the masses, we hold a second collection to help support the retirement and healthcare needs of our retired priests. You'll recall that the December collection for "Retired Religious" is for the women and men who have given their lives in service to the Church through the various religious orders of the Church. There is so much more to God than we can ever comprehend. This is the mystery we celebrate today, Trinity Sunday. The Trinity — three persons in one God — offers us a model for living. Just as three persons of the Trinity are united as one, we must strive to live in ever-greater unity with God and with one another.

So much can be said about the nature of God, and as much as we can ever say there is infinitely more that we can't say or ever know. Today's Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, is one of a number of what we call the "Summer Feasts"... the others being Pentecost, Corpus Christi, and the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. They are meant to focus our attention on the various ways God makes Himself known to us, and His consistent and faithful invitation to grow in our love for Him.

The most important, the most beautiful gift the Lord gives us, His most special presence among us is seen in the gift of the Holy Eucharist. In the Eucharist we receive the most sacred body and blood of Jesus Christ Himself. Every Family Needs a Father

Every family needs a father, and I would like to talk about this role starting from several phrases we find in the Book of Proverbs, words that a father addresses to his son: "My son, if your heart is wise, then my heart will be glad indeed. My inmost being will rejoice when your lips speak what is right."

One could not better express the pride and emotion of a father who acknowledges that he has transmitted to his son what truly counts in life, a wise heart, he affirmed, explaining that the phrase in the Book of Proverbs is that of father who says, "This is what I wanted to leave to you, so that it might become yours: feeling, acting, speaking and judging with wisdom and rectitude. And in order for you to be able to do this, I taught you things you did not know, I corrected errors you did not see. I myself, first of all, had to test the wisdom of my heart, and monitor my excesses of sentiment and resentment, to bear the weight of the inevitable misunderstandings, and to find the right words to make myself understood."

A father knows well how to transmit this legacy: with closeness, gentleness and firmness. However, what consolation and compensation he receives, when his children honor his legacy! It is a joy that repays every hardship, that overcomes every misunderstanding and heals every wound

To be a good father, the first requirement is to be present in the family. To be close to his wife, to share in everything, joy and pain, burdens and hopes. And to be close to the children as they grow: when they play and when they make efforts, when they are carefree and when they are distressed, when they dare and when they are afraid, when they make missteps and when they return to the right path. A father must always be present, but being present is not the same as controlling. Fathers who seek to control end up stifling their children; they do not let them grow.

The Gospel provides us with the example of the Father in heaven, the only one, Jesus says, who can truly be described as a "good father." Everyone knows the extraordinary parable of the prodigal son, or better of the merciful father in the Gospel according to Luke. How much dignity and tenderness we find in the father who stays at the door of his house awaiting the return of his son! Fathers need to be patient. Sometimes you can do nothing other than wait; pray and wait with patience, gentleness, magnanimity, and mercy. A good father knows how to wait and how to forgive, from the bottom of his heart. He certainly also knows how to correct firmly. A father who knows how to correct without humiliating is the same as he who knows how to protect unstintingly.

If there is anyone who knows how to explain in depth the Lord's Prayer, taught by Jesus, it is precisely he who experiences paternity in the first person. Without the grace that comes from the Father in heaven, fathers lose courage, and abandon the field. But children need to find a father who awaits them when they return home after their failures. They will do everything to avoid admitting or showing this, but they need him, and not finding him opens up wounds that are difficult to heal.

The Church, our mother, is committed to supporting with all her power the good and generous presence of fathers in families. And, like St. Joseph, they are the indispensable guardians and mediators of the faith for new generations, in goodness, justice and God's protection.



Fatherhood

Father is a universal word, known to all. It indicates a fundamental relationship that is real and ancient as the history of mankind. Today, however, we have reached the point of affirming that ours would be a "society without fathers." In other words, in particular, in western culture, the figure of the father would be symbolically absent, to have vanished. At first, this was perceived as a form of liberation: freedom from the father-master, from the father as the representative of a law imposed from the outside, from the father as the censor of the happiness of his children and an obstacle to the emancipation of the autonomy of the young. Indeed, in the past in some cases authoritarianism, indeed even oppression reigned in some homes: parents who treated their children like servants, who did not respect the personal needs of their growth, fathers who did not help them to embark on their path in freedom, to assume their own responsibilities for building their future and that of society.

And, as often happens, we have passed from one extreme to the other. The problem of our times no longer seems to be the invasive presence of fathers, but rather their absence. Fathers are so focused on themselves, on their work and at times their personal fulfilment, that they even forget their families, leaving children and the young to their own devices. I would like to say to all Christian communities that we must be more careful: the absence of the paternal figure in the life of children and the young produces wounds that can be very serious. And in effect the deviance of children and adolescents may, to a considerable extent, be due to this lack of examples and authoritative guidance in their everyday life, to this lack of closeness and love from their fathers.

The feeling of orphan-hood experienced by many young people is more profound than we might think. They are orphans in their families because their fathers are often absent, also physically, from the home, but above all because when they are present, they do not act like fathers: they do not speak with their children, they do not give their children, by their example accompanied by words, those principles, those values, those rules for life that the young need in the same way as they need bread. At times it seems as if fathers are not sure what position they should occupy in the family, or how to educate their children. And so, in doubt, they abstain, they withdraw and neglect their responsibilities, possibly seeking refuge in an improbable relationship of parity with their children

Civil Society, with its institutions, too, has a certain responsibility towards the young, that might be described as paternal: A responsibility that at times it neglects or exercises poorly. This too leaves them as orphans, and does not offer them true prospects. The young are therefore orphaned of sure paths to follow, orphaned of teachers in whom they can trust, orphaned of ideals to warm their hearts, orphaned of values and hopes that support them day by day. They are filled with idols but robbed of their hearts; they are driven to dream of enjoyment and pleasure, but they are not given work; they are deluded by the god of money and denied true richness.

Therefore, it is good for all of us, fathers and children, to listen once again to the promise that Jesus made to His disciples: *I will not leave you orphans*. Indeed, He is the path to follow, the master to listen to, the hope that the world can change, that love will conquer hate, that there can be a future of brotherhood and peace for all.

THE MASS EXPLAINED



The Mass: Music at Mass

"Shouldn't it be uplifting and upbeat?..."

To live and love our Catholic Faith, we have to know it!

Each week we will examine the mass, piece by piece, looking at all the elements that go into this great prayer, the greatest act of worship of the Roman Catholic Church.

Tt's a familiar question: Should the music at mass be upbeat Land motivating, pleasing to the taste of the listener? A popular genre of music making head-way in the Catholic Church is the popular/rock style "Praise Music." Understandably, the music is comfortable and familiar in sound to the music we hear on the radio all day long. "Praise Music" is full of emotion, able to motivate, and create an energy like none other. However, Praise Music (a genre developed in/by, and primarily used in the Protestant tradition), is not Liturgical Music — another genre of sacred music: composed, approved, and directed to liturgical use. The approved, preferred, and carefully legislated musical style for Catholic Worship. Often, Protestants don't understand why some of our Catholic congregations rush to bring this Praise genre into "official worship." While used in the Protestant tradition, it is not used in the official worship services of the traditional "high" churches in the Protestant traditions. Praise music fulfills a certain function, but is not a "catch-all."

While beautiful and able to stir the emotions of the listeners it is not Liturgical Music, composed for sacred use, at the service of the Liturgy. The liturgical music "scene" in the U.S. seems to be a more eclectic repertoire, the days of a "contemporary mass" or even (at the opposite extreme) a "Mozart Mass" full of classical sacred music, are pretty much a thing of the past. Such "themed" masses seem to be contrary to the mind of the bishops, and the Holy Fathers, in their attempts to "reform the reform" and restore a sense of the sacred to the liturgy which has been lost over the past several decades... due, in part, to the introduction of non-liturgical music. Ultimately, those experiments failed, using such nonliturgical music destroyed piety and devotion, and shifted the emphasis of the liturgy from the Divine to the human. Particularly in a secular mind set the emotions become the "measuring rod" of good music. The *music* became the point and "salvation" of the liturgy for the young, the old, those not really "connected" to the Church, etc.. When, actually, Jesus Christ is the Savior, not the elements we use to bring us closer to the Lord... music, like all elements of the liturgy are at the service of the worship of God. They are not an explanation for or a substitute for our focus on the Lord. Not catering to fleeting human emotions, liturgical music is based on sound liturgical, aesthetic, theological, and music principles— it has a certain "function" to perform at the liturgy. Like all the elements of good liturgy, music and art are at the service



of the liturgy, they are not the focus. When they become the focus, their "use" has failed, and reform is needed. Praise music, like liturgical music is successful when it is used in the context in which it is intended, and does not detract, in any way from the liturgy.

Liturgical music serves the liturgy and aids us in the worship of God, He is the focus. While emotionally appealing, uplifting and motivating, the praise music genre doesn't seem to accomplish that ultimate goal. It was never meant to. It's not liturgical music (i.e. composed for liturgical use — although it is certainly sacred). If you have witnessed that type of music used in parishes, it becomes the focus, the "emotional high." Often times, it takes center-stage and is seen as the ultimate good, and the worship of the Lord becomes the backdrop for such displays. Liturgical music, on the other hand, in all its styles, keeps the focus on the worship of the Lord, in keeping with its intended use.

A "sampling," now and then, would go a long way to bring some variety and "spirit" to the liturgy, but it should not be the focus and point of our worship. To some extent, the Catholic Church already uses it outside of the liturgy, where it is most appropriate. That delicate balance needs to be maintained. Fidelity to the Liturgy, and to the Church is a means to holiness for all of us. Comments about people leaving a parish because they didn't like the music, because the parish wouldn't compromise Church teaching, are disturbing. Though sad, priests and parishes can't base their actions on the lack of knowledge and desire for fidelity upon the emotions of a few. After all, emotions are fleeting. Trying to "lure" people back with dis-obedience and infidelity will produce no good, and will not ultimately attract a whole new cadre back to Mass. Both Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis specifically addressed this misguided pastoral approach and warned against such strategies.

Obedience is not optional, it's necessary to grow in holiness. Some parishes abandon such notions in favor of building-up the emotional high (on all sorts of issues/levels). That will not ultimately make us faithful, loyal, and obedient sons and daughters of the Church. Faith is a choice, not an emotion. Emotions change and are fleeting. Not being ruled by our emotions, or the emotional highs we can easily create, is not easy in this increasingly secular age. That's why we need to keep our focus on Christ and the Church he gave us... and not so much the Church we envision, and on "what every one else is doing." It's a non-argument to say "we should do it because everyone else is doing it." It doesn't make sense. The old adage is true: Just because something is loud and popular, it doesn't mean it's important.

2025 ALTAR AND CHURCH RESTORATION

The Altar


While the parish priests were performing the traditional washing of the Altars and sanctuary floor in preparation of the Good Friday Services, Father De Salvo discovered that all eight of the black marble supports/legs holding up the massive marble top of the Main Altar of Sacrifice in our church were shattered. The weight of the mensa [the top of the Altar], is too heavy to be supported by the eight marble pillars/legs of the Altar. Installed in the 1970s for the reformed liturgy, the Altar has failed.

Total cost to properly repair the Altar of Sacrifice in our Church:

\$59,200

Total cost to restore High Altar [Tabernacle Altar] and Baptismal Font:

\$82,400 [if available/provided]

Church Pews and Floors

The pews in the church need refinishing. During the Covid shutdown, harsh chemicals were mandated to be used to sanitize the church. Because of this, the finish on the pews was ruined and must be replaced. Additionally, new kneelers need to be installed on the pews. They are more than 40 years old and are failing. Most importantly, the 100 year old wooden floor under the pews MUST be refinished. The old finish is completely worn. Sanding and refinishing the floors before further damage is done will save us the expense of completely replacing the wood floors under the pews.

Total cost to refinish/repair pews: \$274,000
Total cost of new kneelers: \$49,400
Total cost to refinish the wood floor: \$35,000
*to totally replace the wood floor would be hundreds of thousands of dollars. Our 100 year floor has one more refinishing in it, saving us a lot of money.
