A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

ear Parish Family,

On June 1st I shared with you the news that we discovered that all eight legs of the marble Altar of Sacrifice in our church have, overtime, failed. The damage to the altar requires immediate attention. The unexpected and crucial repairs to the altar provides the opportunity to undertake the other pressing repairs needed in the church. We are going to refinish the church pews [harsh chemicals required to sanitize during the Covid restrictions/shutdown ruined the finish on the pews]. With the pews removed, we are able to do a more extensive repair and refinishing of the 100-year old wood floor under the pews, providing another 20-30 years of use. Rather than replacing the 100 year-old floor, we were told that our old floor has one more sanding and refinishing in it. Doing so would save us an additional hundreds of thousands of dollars. But, we need to act quickly, before winter comes, and save additional wear and damage to the "exposed" wood of the floor, long past due for repair. We are also going to replace the kneelers on our pews.

In early June, I asked for the \$500,000 needed to fund the unexpected and necessary repairs being made to our church. I want to thank you for your quick and generous response. As mentioned in the appeal material, those contributing \$250 or more to the project will be included on the memorial scroll being prepared to place inside the support leg of the altar with the inscription... "With faith, devotion, and zeal for God's house, we, who have refurbished this altar beg a remembrance in all of the masses and prayers offered upon it..." All the names of those contributing to the fund to repair our church will be included upon the scroll to be contained in the altar for generations to come. Donations to the Capital Fund for the repairs in our church will be received until August 11th. After that date, the scroll will be finalized and sealed-up in the altar. Additions/changes will, therefore, be impossible. Thank you so much for your generosity and timely response to the need. If you have yet to make your gift, there is still time. Contact the Parish Office and make your donation by August 11th.

Work will begin on the altar of the church on July 28th. The immense weight of the marble, the shattered legs, and the rate at which the damage progresses makes the condition a dangerous situation which we must immediately address. Marble for the repairs has been received from Italy, and fabrication of the altar supports has already begun. The onsite work begins July 28th and, depending on what is found when the altar is dismantled, I am told could take up to three weeks. However, we will not know for sure until the work begins. Granted, it's a rather nebulous time-frame, but as it was explained to me, stone-work and fabrication is more of an "art form" than an exact science — yet it involves incredible efforts with machinery to move such large pieces of stone. To allow the stone masons to work efficiently, uninterrupted, and in a safe and responsible manner, ALL weekday masses and funerals will be held in the Holy Family Chapel of the Ministry Center... beginning July 28th. Possibly, for as long as three weeks, as long as the stone masons are working in the church, services during the week will be in the Chapel. For now, our plan is to use the church for Saturday evening and Sunday Masses. Please note, some temporary modifications and accommodations should be expected. Thank you for your patience and understanding in the matter.

Once the pews of the church are removed, temporary seating will be set-up in the church to be used until the pews are ready to be re-installed and the floor refinished. I am told it will take around 8 weeks to refinish the pews and have them ready to reinstall. As the company hired for the project sets the time-line and sets out for us the exact way in which the work will be done, I will share those details with you.

As I have mentioned before, with such a large, substantial, and

old church building.... nothing goes quick or easy. We want quality work done in an efficient and economical manner, and, we want it done right. The care and repairs we do on our 100 year-old church now are being done to last decades, not months or years. Anyone who has done work on their own home realizes that it's not a quick, easy, or cheap job. Inconvenience is just part of the equation, and is to be expected, no matter how high emotions should run. No time is right, and everyone has an idea on what, how, and by what list of priorities things should be done. My goal is to repair the church. The shattered Altar makes the whole project more pressing. With an "end in sight" we should be able to charitably and patiently be able to see our way through the inconveniences that are inevitably part of the project being done on such a large scale. Our Director of Communications, Kayla Knisley, will be keeping you informed as work begins and continues over the next several weeks.

Once again, I sincerely thank you for your patience, understanding, and charity as we go through these next several weeks of repair, inconvenience and, for some people, "upset." But, the work we're doing to repair the church has to be done, there's no good time, but the time has presented itself to us, and, with faith and love for our parish and our beautiful church building we must embrace the moment to preserve the heritage of faith given to us through the sacrifice and efforts of past generations. We should be proud and eager to take our part to... *Preserve the Heritage*!

We're at the end of July, the beginning of August is just a few days away. For many families, and for our parish family, thoughts are starting to turn to the new school year which begins in a few weeks.

Not only is the school building being made ready, but we continue to welcome new students and families to Saints Peter and Paul School. It's not too late to enroll — give your children the gift of an outstanding Catholic Education in our award winning, "Blue Ribbon School." Children receive a first rate academic formation. And, primarily, your children will receive a wonderful education in the ways of our Catholic Faith. A Catholic education is a gift for life! Consider Saints Peter and Paul School for your family. I had the great blessing of growing up in a family in which faith was lived in a simple, practical way. However, it was my paternal grandmother in particular who influenced my journey of faith. She was a woman who explained to us, who talked to us about Jesus, who taught us the catechism... The first proclamation is at home, in the family! And this makes me think of the love of so many mothers and in the transmission of faith.

One day in particular, though, was very important to me: September 21, 1953. I was almost 17. It was "Students' Day." Before going to the celebration, I

passed through the church I normally attended, I found a priest that I did not know, and I felt the need to go to confession. For me this was an experience of encounter: I found that someone was waiting for me.

... After making my confession, I felt something had changed. I was not the same. I heard something like a voice, or a call. I was convinced that I should become a priest.

An Indulgence is a special form of God's infinite mercy. His love is so great that He forgives us all our sin. But also, He wants to free us from all the consequences of suffering, wounds, pain and bitterness that have been caused by our sins. He wants to give us the grace of sincere and profound repentance that opens us to Him and enables us to reconcile with all the people with whom we are in conflict in any way because of wounds inflicted on each other in the past and not yet truly forgiven. Indulgence is like a super abundance of love that also eliminates the penalty of Purgatory.

By making a special visit to Saints Peter and Paul Church and by fulfilling certain conditions, the Jubilee Holy Year Indulgence may be obtained by the faithful. Individuals fulfilling the following conditions may gain a Plenary Indulgence once a day for themselves or for the souls of the deceased:

Requirements for gaining the Jubilee Indulgence: [1] Performance of the indulgenced work (making a visit to the church and assisting at a liturgical/devotional celebration).

[2] Fulfill the conditions of Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion and prayers for the intention of the Holy Father (Our Father, the Profession of Faith, and a prayer to the Blessed Virgin Mary).


An Indulgence is the remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sin whose guilt has already been forgiven. In other words, we can receive from God a partial or complete canceling of our "purgatory time" by gaining an indulgence. An indulgence is NOT a way of buying your way into Heaven, as it is sometimes erroneously thought. The practice of "buying" an indulgence was never approved of by the Catholic Church, and the practice

of it was forbidden when various preachers attempted to do so. Salvation is God's free will gift to us. As Saint James says: "So faith, by itself, if it has no works, is dead" [James 2:17]. Receiving the Jubilee Year Indulgence is an act of faith, a response of love, a deepening of the desire within us to pursue holiness and turn from sin.

Ask and You Shall Receive

It's easy to look at today's Gospel reading and come away with a view of God as disinterested and irritated, reluctant to give us what we need unless we bang down his door, hound him to the furthest reaches of heaven, wrench him from his reverie and force him to answer just so we'll finally go away.

Well, that's not what Jesus means by the parable of the friend at midnight — but it's also not surprising that we would think that it is. The whole point of this Gospel is that communication between God and man has been broken. It's not as easy as it once was, as it should be, as it could be.

In this parable, there exists many barriers between the supplicant and his friend. The time of day is not ideal. The door is locked. Their dispositions are opposite — one is in the middle of a REM cycle and the other is deeply agitated. They appear to be two people who are not primed to communicate well. Everything is working against them.

The same could well be said of God and the human race. Here we are in a fallen world, surrounded by sin and pain and sickness and death to the extent that it infiltrates not just our bodies but our souls, our minds, our attitudes.

We are the friend caught unprepared in the dead of night. We don't always know how to talk to God (That door is thick! Will he hear us if we knock?). We don't always know if we should (It's all my fault that I ran out of loaves, after all). We don't even know if we want to (It's nighttime! He might be angry!).

Everything is working against us.

It doesn't matter, Jesus tells us. Whatever is interrupting communication between your heart and the One who crafted it, the One who desires its full and irrevocable attention, it can be overcome. There is no door thick enough, no night dark enough, no sleep strong enough.

So knock.



Saints of the Week

St. Ignatius of Loyola- July 31



Ignatius of Loyola was the youngest of 11 children of a noble family in Spain. As a young adult, his goal in life was to achieve fame and fortune. At the age of 30, he was seriously injured in a battle. During the long months of his recovery, he had the opportunity to examine his life and read about the saints. Ignatius never did anything halfway. Once he realized that God was calling him, he devoted all

of his energy to discerning God's will and then carrying it out. In search of what he ought to do, Ignatius encountered setbacks, closed doors, and even imprisonment. He was convinced that God could be found in all things, and was guided by an inner peace that comes from knowing one is doing the will of God. Ignatius developed the Spiritual Exercises, a practical guide for those who want to live a truly Christian life, and he shared them with his companions. Ignatius called his community the "Company of Jesus." Today they are known as the Society of Jesus, or the Jesuits, one of the largest religious communities in the world. Besides the three vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience, members take a fourth vow of obedience to the Pope.

St. Alphonsus Liguori- August 1



St. Alphonsus Liguori, (1696-1787) was born in Marianella, near Naples, in Italy. When he was young, he displayed exceptional intelligence and piety, earning a doctorate in civil and canon law by the age of 16. Feeling a calling to dedicate his life to God and the service of others, however, he abandoned his legal career and pursued ordination to the priesthood. He was ordained at the age of 30 in 1726.

Throughout his priestly ministry, Liguori focused on preaching missions and retreats, seeking to renew people's faith and draw them closer to the Eucharist. He frequently preached on the real presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and encouraged frequent reception of Holy Communion as a source of spiritual nourishment and grace.

In 1732, Liguori founded the Redemptorists, a religious congregation dedicated to promoting devotion to the Eucharist and the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Redemptorists' charism also revolved around reaching out to the most abandoned, including the poor and marginalized, and offering them hope through God's love and mercy.

As a prolific writer, Liguori authored numerous works on moral theology, spirituality, and Eucharistic devotion. His most famous work, "The Glories of Mary," remains a classic in Marian theology and devotion. He is remembered for his practical and merciful counsel, always seeking to lead souls to reconciliation, and union with God.

St. Alphonsus was canonized as a saint in 1839 and declared a Doctor of the Church in 1871. His spiritual writings, particularly on the Eucharist, continue to inspire and guide the faithful worldwide. As the patron saint of moral theologians, his example reminds believers of the profound love and presence of Christ in the Eucharist and the enduring mercy of God. St. Alphonsus Liguori, pray for us!

Church Pews and Floors

The pews in the church need refinishing. During the Covid shut-down, harsh chemicals were mandated to be used to sanitize the church. Because of this, the finish on the pews was ruined and must be replaced. Additionally, new kneelers need to be installed on the pews. They are more than 40 years old and are failing. Most importantly, the 100 year old wooden floor under the pews MUST be refinished. The old finish is completely worn. Sanding and refinishing the floors before further damage is done will save us the expense of completely replacing the wood floors under the pews.

The Altar


While the parish priests were performing the traditional washing of the Altars and sanctuary floor in preparation of the Good Friday Services, Father De Salvo discovered that all eight of the black marble supports/legs holding up the massive marble top of the Main Altar of Sacrifice in our church were shattered. The weight of the mensa [the top of the Altar], is too heavy to be supported by the eight marble pillars/legs of the Altar. Installed in the 1970s for the reformed liturgy, the Altar has failed.
