A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

ear Parish Family,

We leave this world the same way we came into it... The rich man in today's Gospel learned this important lesson, because death exposed his real poverty. During his life he behaved as if he was going to live forever. Somewhere along the line, he traded doing good... for doing well. He failed to realize that what counts when we die is the person we become in the process of living.

Happiness doesn't come from having what we want, but in being content with what we have, and in who we are... in using those things to bring joy to others... and in building up God's kingdom. As the late Cardinal George said... "the only things we take from this world, are the things we have given away!" We have to be careful not to make into God, the things of God.

The Lord is telling us to set our hearts on things that last forever... to turn our attention to Heaven: Scripture says you do not know the day, nor the hour, when the Son of Man will come for you... But, when that day does come... In the evening of life, we'll be measured by the good we've done, by the love and obedience we've shown Christ... present in others, and in His Church. Today's Gospel is an invitation to take stock of your life, and to ask yourself where is your heart?... because it is there that you will find your REAL treasure, what really matters. So make sure your heart is in the right place. Because, the most important thing in this life... is the SALVATION of your soul.

Certainly, as a parish, one of our spiritual "treasures" is our beautiful 100 year-old church. Work has begun to repair and restore the damage time has done to the interior of the structure. Work on repairing our marble Altar of Sacrifice progresses and will be completed soon. By the middle of August, half of the pews in the church will be removed and taken away to be repaired and refinished. Chairs will be put in place. Once the pews are ready



to be reinstalled, new kneelers will be installed, the wood floor under the pews will be repaired and refinished, and the newly restored pews will be put in place. Then, the other half of the church will be done. The chairs DO NOT have kneelers, and so we will have to make temporary accommodations for this.

As mentioned in the appeal material, those contributing \$250 or more to the project will be included on the memorial scroll being prepared to place inside the support leg of the altar with the inscription... "With faith, devotion, and zeal for God's house, we, who have refurbished this altar beg a remembrance in all of the masses and prayers offered upon it..." All the names of those contributing to the fund to repair our church will be included on the scroll to be contained in the altar for generations to come. Donations to the Capital Fund for the repairs in our church will be received until August 11th. After that date, the scroll will be finalized and sealed-up in the altar. Additions/changes will, therefore, be impossible. Thank you so much for your generosity and timely response to the need. If you have yet to make your gift, there is still time. Contact the Parish Office or use the information found in the bulletin or on the parish website, and make your donation by August 11th.

I want to sincerely thank you for your patience, charity, understanding, and generous support to supply the necessary funding to complete the work in church. Your beautiful expression of faith and support have made it possible for us to take our part to preserve *the heritage of faith* that past generations have left us in our beautiful church.



In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring. Even so, uncertainty about the future may at times give rise to conflicting feelings, ranging from confident trust to apprehensiveness, from serenity to anxiety, from firm conviction to hesitation and doubt. Let us turn to the message of hope that the Apostle Saint Paul wished to communicate to the Christians of Rome:

Since we are justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing in the glory of God...

Hope does not disappoint, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us."

[Romans 5: 1-2,5]

Requirements for gaining the Jubilee Indulgence: [1] Performance of the indulgenced work (making a visit to the church and assisting at a liturgical/devotional celebration).

[2] Fulfill the conditions of Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion and prayers for the intention of the Holy Father (Our Father, the Profession of Faith, and a prayer to the Blessed Virgin Mary).


An Indulgence is the remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sin whose guilt has already been forgiven. An indulgence is NOT a way of buying your way into Heaven, as it is sometimes erroneously thought. The practice of "buying" an indulgence was never approved of by the Catholic Church, and the practice of it was forbidden when

various preachers attempted to do so. Salvation is God's free will gift to us. As Saint James says: "So faith, by itself, if it has no works, is dead" [James 2:17]. Receiving the Jubilee Year Indulgence is an act of faith, a response of love, a deepening of the desire within us to pursue holiness and turn from sin.



Fr. Bader's Book of the Week

The Dialogue of St. Catherine Of Siena By Catherine of Siena



St Catherine of Siena's Dialogue describes the entire spiritual life through a series of conversations between God and the soul, represented by Catherine herself. Readers of The Dialogue of Saint Catherine of Siena, will find her revelations from God as informative - and formative - as those who recognized her sanctity during her life.

The universally applicable yet intimately personal messages she received from God are as much for us as they were for Catherine. We can read God's communications to his beloved daughter with detached awe

or we can receive His messages to us through her writings.

Do you long for certainty that Divine Providence exists in the midst of our chaotic world? Does your prayer seem too dry, or too routine? Have you sought guidance for the challenges of your life from unhelpful people or things? Or has pride kept you from humble obedience to the Church? If so, The Dialogue will provide consolation, encouragement, and hope.

The Virtue of Gentleness

"Gentlefirmness" is a virtue for dealing with anger—and one that all leaders, especially parents, should develop. You've likely never heard the word before... because it is made-up. The virtue's real name is meekness, which many interpret as submissiveness or passivity. Yet, as we know Christ is "meek and humble of heart" (Mt 11:29), meekness is better defined as the habit of controlling one's anger to remain simultaneously firm and gentle.

Like most virtues, gentlefirmness is the mean between two extremes. Over-controlling anger represses the emotion, leading one to believe there's nothing to be angry about, or that it's wrong to be angry. Under-controlling results in explosive anger. Both are harmful and counterproductive.

To grow in gentlefirmness, allow yourself to experience your anger, and use it as energy to stand firm, while remaining calm. Do the things you were taught: breathe deeply; pause until you calm down; ask the Holy Spirit to guide you – and recognize that you are starting to build a habit.

Sooner than you might expect, you will find it easier to respond to anger, and you'll be practicing the Christian virtue of gentlefirmness. August: The Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart. Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The month of August is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (and not adored as the Sacred Heart of Jesus is) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life. Such devotion is an incentive to a similar love and virtue.

This devotion has received new emphasis in this century from the visions given to Lucy Dos Santos, oldest of the visionaries of Fatima, in her convent in Tuy, in Spain, in 1925 and 1926. In the visions Our Lady asked for the practice of the Five First Saturdays to help make amends for the offenses committed

against her heart by the blasphemies and ingratitude of people. The practice parallels the devotion of the Nine First Fridays in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. On October 31, 1942, Pope Pius XII made a solemn Act of Consecration of the Church and the whole world to the Immaculate Heart. Liturgical Feasts This Week...

August 5th ~ The Dedication of Saint Mary Major



First built at the order of Pope Liberius in the midfourth century, the Basilica is the largest Church in the world dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Saint Mary Major is one of

the four Roman Basilicas known as patriarchal cathedrals in memory of the first centers of the church. Saint John Lateran represents Peter's See, Rome; Saint Paul Outside the Walls, the See of Alexandria [the See presided over by Saint Mark]; Saint Peter's, the See of Constantinople; and Saint Mary Major, the See of Antioch, where Mary is supposed to have spent most of her life. Another legend gives this feast the popular name: Our Lady of the Snows. According to that story, a wealthy Roman couple pledged their fortune tot he mother of God. In affirmation, she produced a miraculous midsummer snowfall and told them to build a church on the site. The legend has long been celebrated by releasing a shower of white rose petals from the dome of the Cathedral every August 5th.

August 6th ~ The Feast of the Transfiguration



The story of the Transfiguration is recounted in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. With remarkable agreement, all three

place the event shortly after Peter's confession of faith that Jesus is the Messiah and Jesus' first prediction of His own passion and death. At His Transfiguration Christ gives His disciples a glimpse at His two natures [both human and divine]. They see, for a moment, the glory of His resurrected body, shortly before He suffers His passion and death. The Transfiguration, as it were, gives them a spiritual "shot in the arm" for what they are about to witness.

August 8th ~ The Feast of Saint Dominic



Saint Dominic was born in Spain in 1170. He was trained for the priest-hood, and became a canon of the Cathedral in Osma, where there was an attempt to revive the common life of the Apostles. In response to the Church's call for preachers to go and combat the heresies of the day,

Dominic left all things to go about the country preaching reform and adherence to the True Faith. His fellow preachers gradually become a community, and in 1215 he founded a religious house at Toulouse which was to be the beginning of the Dominican Order. His ideal was to link a life with God, study and prayer in all forms, with a ministry of salvation to people by the Word of God. His motto: contemplata tradere [to pass on the fruits of contemplation, or to speak only of God or with God].

Important Update for Parishioners: Action Required Regarding CMAA InPew Envelopes

The Development Office of the Diocese of Joliet is committed to maintaining transparency and open communication with our parishioners. We wish to provide an important update concerning the status of the Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal (CMAA) InPew Envelopes.

As many of you are aware, we encountered an unexpected challenge with UPS back in March, which resulted in the loss of 23 packages containing InPew Envelopes, many with checks made out to the CMAA. To date, UPS has been unable to locate these missing packages. In light of this situation, we strongly advise parishioners who made a gift via check using an InPew Envelope to verify their transaction with their bank.

If you find that your check has not been cashed, we recommend you take the necessary steps to stop payment on that check. We deeply appreciate your commitment to the CMAA, and we hope you will prayerfully consider making a gift to the 2025 CMAA through one of our mailings, or by making a secure gift over the phone by calling (815) 838-8515, or online at www.joliet-dioceseappeal.org. Please deduct any incurred bank fees from your gift to the CMAA.






