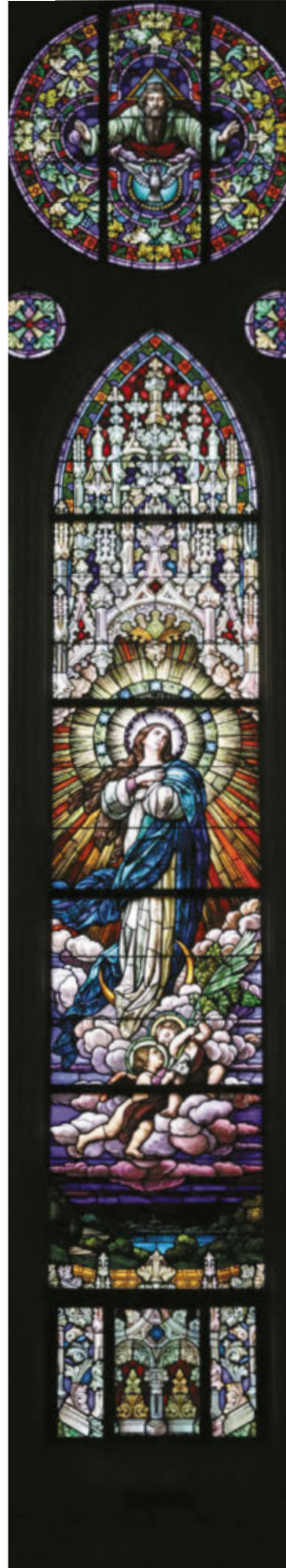
## A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Work continues on the marble in our church. The Altar of Sacrifice has been repaired, and other damage we discovered to the marble altars in our church, the Baptismal Font, and Communion Rail is also being addressed. This will go on for a few weeks. By the middle of August work will begin to repair and refinish our church pews, and the 100 year-old wood floors under the pews. New kneelers will also be installed. I'm hoping all of this work in the church will be completed by the end of September. Thank you for your generosity, support, patience, understanding, and care for our beautiful church. Monday, August 11th [at noon], the list will be finalized to include the names of all those who contributed to support the restoration of our altars. At that time, they will be permanently sealed within the altar, and no additions are possible. Thanks to all who have contributed so generously to this effort to keep our church in proper order. What a beautiful gift we are making to preserve our heritage of faith... Thank you!

How true it is... *The most important thing in life, is the SALVATION of your soul.* And, nothing, no one, should keep you from reaching the goal. Saint Mother Theresa of Calcutta once said that we shouldn't fear what others think of us when we are trying to live as faithful disciples. She said, *"in the final analysis it is between you and God; it was never between you and them anyway."* Today's readings are *"a call to Faith!"* They challenge us to be faithful, obedient, loving, and wise. That's the call to holiness we should pursue. In today's second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews we are told: *Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen.* In the Gospel Jesus tells us *to be like servants who await their master's return... Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival.* We are being invited to a surety of faith, a tenacity of faith that seeks to please God, thus making ourselves ready for His return. And, admittedly, that's not always easy.

It's difficult to be faithful to the Gospel, to be faithful to the Church when so many people around us want to compromise those truths and embrace the secular world that surrounds us. All of us struggle with this issue. It's not always easy, convenient or popular to live as a devout, sincere, and faithful Catholic. I appreciate your struggles. In truth, it can be difficult as a priest and as a pastor to uphold Church teaching when it is often met with resistance and rejection, with people favoring their own notions and desires, often reducing the Gospel, Church teaching, the authority of the Church, and Church law to merely one of many "opinions" that they are free to accept or reject. More and more I notice that fidelity to Church teaching and Church law is not a value. Instead the one who is obedient is vilified and discredited for fidelity. Living in such a secular atmosphere can cause much sorrow and fear, for all. But, the words of Jesus should give us much comfort: *Do not be afraid!*



Secularism, according to Pope Benedict XVI, is the great heresy, the great struggle, of the present age. But what is *secularism*? Basically, it's the desire and attempt to live life without reference to God, seeking to make the desires of the individual "supreme." This sort of "God-less" living creates incredible fear in the lives of individuals and nations. If, as Scripture says, *God is love*, then a world without God is a world without love. Sadly, once caught up in the error/heresy of secularism it makes it impossible to recognize the source of our uncertainty and fear. And thus, overcoming or rejecting it is impossible... save the grace of God! We know by faith that with God all things are possible! This is the battle in which the followers of Christ are forced to engage.

This is the challenge of our age. After all, *we are called to be faithful, not popular.* As the Holy Fathers have said over the past few decades, *we live in an age that is increasingly secular, unable to recognize and follow the Lord, unable to recognize the truth.* And, perhaps the greater problem is not that people are rejecting the faith, but rather, they simply do not know it. If we don't *know* the Catholic Faith we can't live it, embrace it, or love it. If we don't know our Catholic Faith — the truth of the faith, not just our interpretation of it — we can't be tenacious, strong, obedient, and loving disciples of the Lord.

I would encourage you to increase in your efforts to really know our Catholic Faith. Make sure there is a Catholic Bible in your home, and a copy of *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*. They make great gifts (and a wonderful witness of faith) for family and friends. Read them often, and seek to conform yourself to the will of Christ. Embrace the truths of our Catholic Faith: *"Take courage, do not be afraid!"* The truth sets us free, removes fear, and makes us courageous in our witness. Our parish will make the conscious effort to remain faithful and obedient to the teachings of the Church. Pope Francis consistently reminded us to be bold, courageous and faithful in our witness to the truth of Christ and His Church. I invite, challenge and encourage everyone to join us in fidelity, even when it is difficult for us to accept, and we are tempted to allow our own desires, opinions, pride, and agendas to rule our minds and hearts. It is precisely at these moments in life when we see the true veracity, meaning, and dedication to our faith in Jesus Christ. After all, *HE* is the Lord of our lives.

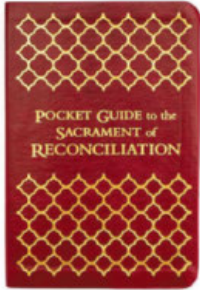
## Welcome Natalia, our new Youth Minister

## The Assumption of Mary

Pope Francis I

The dogma of faith that Pope Pius XII proclaimed on November 1, 1950, asserts that the **Virgin Mary having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory.** The Assumption "shines as a sign of sure hope and solace to the People of God during its sojourn on earth," as the Second Vatican Council puts it.

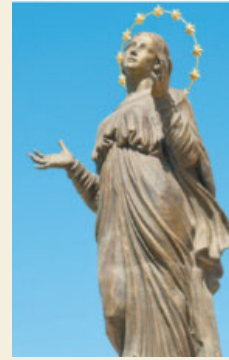
In Mary's Assumption into Heaven, we celebrate an infinitely greater conquest than the "giant step for mankind" when man first set foot on the moon. When the lowly Virgin of Nazareth set foot in paradise, body and spirit, he said, it was *the huge leap forward for humanity*. This gives us hope that we are precious, destined to rise again. God does not allow our bodies to vanish into nothing. With God, nothing is lost!

Mary's advice to us lies in her song, the "Magnificat" – "My soul magnifies the Lord." Mary aggrandizes the Lord: not problems, which she did not lack at the time. She does not allow herself to be overwhelmed by difficulties and absorbed by fears. Rather, she puts God as the first greatness of life, which becomes the source of her Magnificat. Her joy is born not from the absence of problems, which come sooner or later, but from God's presence, because He is great and he looks on the lowly ones. We are the weakness of His love. Mary acknowledges that she is small and exalts the "great things" that the Lord has done for her. She is grateful for the gift of life, she is a virgin yet she becomes pregnant, and Elizabeth, too, who was elderly, is expecting a child. The Lord works wonders with those who are lowly... who give ample space to God in their life, for which Mary praises God.

Like Mary, praise and thank God for the good things He does for us, for His love, forgiveness, tenderness and for giving us His Mother and our brothers and sisters. If we forget the good the heart shrinks. But if, like Mary, we remember the great things that the Lord does, if at least once a day we were to "magnify" Him, then our hearts will expand and our joy will increase.



## Friday, August 15th Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary *A holy day of obligation*



In 1950 Pope Pius XII officially proclaimed the doctrine of the Assumption: **The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly**

**glory.** This doctrine, which has its roots in ancient Catholic belief, shows the connection between Mary's unique role as God's mother preserved from original sin and the reality of our final resurrection in Christ.

In Her assumption, Mary was preserved from the decay of death. Mary, the mother of the Savior, is the first to share in the Lord's resurrection. She is the living model for all people whose future destiny is union with the risen Lord. Her assumption into heaven is an anticipation of our own resurrection. However, since Mary was truly the Mother of God, the Mother of Jesus, and since she was preserved from sin from the first moment of the conception within the womb of Saint Anne [her mother], it only stands to reason that she should not have to undergo the ultimate price for sin... *the corruption of the grace.* And so, She was given the glorified body of resurrection that awaits all of us at the final judgement. The doctrine of the Assumption of Mary into Heaven "completes the story" of the Immaculate Conception of Mary which we celebrate on December 8th.

**Friday, August 15th is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a holy day of obligation,** a day on which all Catholics are bound to attend mass the same as on Sunday. The obligation to attend Mass is a serious one, and according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, to disregard the obligation is seriously sinful. **Masses for the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary will be celebrated on Thursday, August 14th at 5:15pm. Masses on the holy day, August 15th will be celebrated at 6:45, 8am, 5:15 and 7pm. Let's fill the church to over-flowing!**

# 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Cornerstone laying for new SS. Peter and Paul Church: August 9, 1925

The 100th anniversary of the laying of the cornerstone of SS. Peter & Paul Church will be on August 9. On that date in 1925, the Right Reverend Monsignor Francis A. Rempe, Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Chicago, pastor of St. Clement Church, Chicago and former resident of Aurora, blessed and laid the cornerstone on the southwest corner of the church under construction. The new building replaced the church built 1864-1866 which had been destroyed by fire on June 4, 1922.

The cost of removing the fire debris, converting Wenker Hall in the school building to a temporary church, purchasing additional property, constructing the church in a Gothic style with no pillars and 2 towers, purchasing stained glass windows, bells, an organ and more came to a total of \$350,000, worth over \$6,000,000 in today's dollars. The parish of 350 raised \$250,000 with donations, subscriptions and fund-raising festivals, bazaars and picnics. Proceeds from insurance and a \$100,000 loan allowed construction to begin in April 1925.

The cornerstone inscription is in Latin and reads:

### SS. PETER & PAUL CHURCH LAYS CORNERSTONE

Many Attend Impressive Ceremony Here Last Sunday

A very impressive ceremony Sunday afternoon, August 9th, marked the laying of the cornerstone of the new SS. Peter and Paul Catholic church, which is to be completed by the fall of 1926. There was a large attendance at this service, visitors coming from all parts of northern Illinois for the occasion. Besides these out-of-town people there were hundreds of parishioners and Naperville residents present. The officiating prelate was the Right Reverend Francis A. Rempe, Vicar General of the diocese. The Reverend Rempe is pastor of St. Clements parish of Chicago, and is a former resident of Aurora where his mother still lives. He was assisted by the Reverend John Wester of Chicago, deacon, and the Rev. E. J. Brummel of New Hampshire, Ill., sub-deacon. The sermon was preached by the Right Rev. Francis Rempe, V. G., following the usual ceremonies, which consisted of the blessing of the site of the altar while the music was sung alternately by the choir and clergy in the Gregorian chant. Next the cornerstone was blessed, and while it was being placed in position the litany of All Saints was sung. Following the blessing of the foundation the sermon was preached by the Reverend Rempe, and the impressive service was closed by the singing of "Holy God". Besides the officiating clergy and the local pastor and assistant, the Rev. B. J. Schuette and the Rev. B. Laukemper, the following clergy were among those present: The Right Rev. Abbott, the Rev. Walter Fasnacht, the Rev. L. P. Hurkrans, the Rev. J. F. Hayden, the Rev. J. P. Donoghue, Valentine Kohlbeck, O. S. B. of St. Procopius college; the Rev. A. J. Neidert, the Rev. Francis Epstein, the Rev. M. Sesterhenn, the Rev. Charles Henkel, the Rev. H. Schmits, the Rev. J. E. Foley, the Rev. M. A. Schumacher, the Rev. E. P. Goodwin, the Rev. F. J. Schildgen, the Rev. P. Gall, the Rev. C. A. Knur, the Rev. A. J. Boecker, the Rev. F. J. Bergs, the Right Rev. Ed. A. Kelly, the Rev. M. Clasen, the Rev. John Ott and the Franciscan Fathers of Mays Lake, Hinsdale. During the afternoon the young ladies Sodality sold souvenir buttons with a picture of the completed church on it, and lunch was served visitors at the big tent erected in the school yard. Dinner was served to members of the clergy and other visitors in the basement of the church. The large tent was loaned to the parish thru the courtesy of the Wheatland Plowing Match Association. The thanks of the parish is extended to the people of the community of Naperville who attended the service in such large numbers. The church is scheduled to be under cover by late fall, before the heavy frosts, and the beautiful edifice is to be completed by the fall of 1926. Naperville will then have a church which will be the equal in beauty and service of any in the state of Illinois. It will certainly add greatly to the beauty of the city as a part of the big building program which is now going on locally. The new structure will replace the church destroyed by fire in 1922, and promises to be the most beautiful building of this city. The style of the edifice is of the early Gothic period. It was the wish of the

diocesan authorities that a fine Gothic edifice should adorn the very prominent corner, where in 1864 the first church was erected. The new church is to be 150 feet long and 72 feet wide, with a transept 104 feet wide. The tower measures 216 feet with the cross. The exterior will be of brick, with highly ornamented stone trimming. The interior shows no pillars which is quite unusual in a Gothic building, but there will be a groined ceiling. The plans are prepared by the architect, Herman Gaul, of Chicago, and the contracts of the mason and carpenter work are in the hands of the Bergstedt Construction company of Moline, Ill. The cut stone will be furnished by the Interstate Cut Stone Company, of Bedford, Indiana. The New City Iron Works of Chicago have the contract for the steel and iron work. The estimated cost of the building is \$285,000.

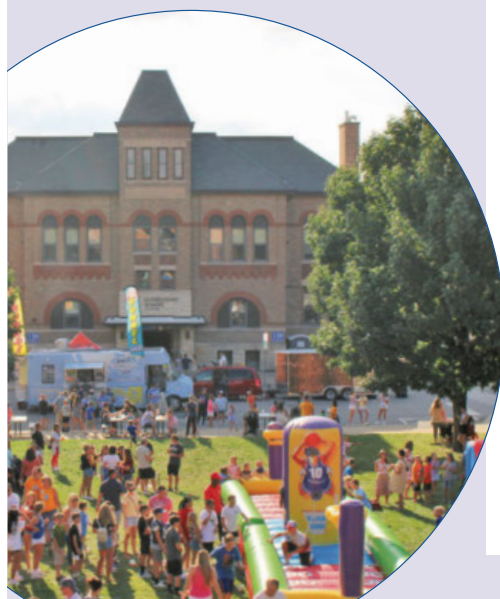

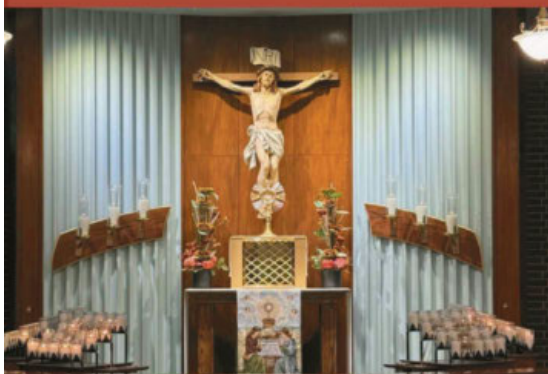

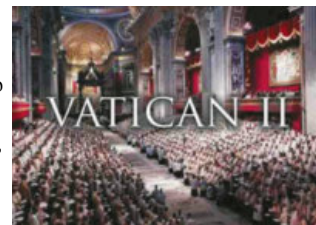
