Holy Thursday 2022

There is a Holy Thursday tradition where the faithful visit seven churches and pray at the altar of repose in each one. The tradition is believed to have begun in Rome where pilgrims would visit the seven basilicas as an act of penance.

A plenary indulgence can be obtained on Holy Thursday for oneself or for a deceased person if "Tantum Ergo" is recited or sang during adoration, or visiting the Blessed Sacrament for 30 minutes.

Tantum Ergo

Tantum ergo Sacramentum Veneremur cernui: Et antiquum documentum Novo cedat ritui: Praestet fides supplementum Sensuum defectui.

Genitori, Genitoque Laus et iubilatio, Salus, honor, virtus quoque Sit et benedictio: Procedenti ab utroque Compar sit laudatio.
