Pastoral Notes

Martha? ... Mary?...

It's a rather warm summer Saturday afternoon. You're at home relaxing. You just poured yourself a favorite drink and now there you are sitting in front of the TV. Suddenly, the doorbell rings! You get up from the chair and guess who's at the door? It's some old friends from out of town who were just passing through. They didn't call first but just decided to stop by and visit for a little while. What do you do? What hospitality do you offer? Do you welcome them at the door and invite them to sit in your living room but then leave them there by themselves

for a while so you can run upstairs, straighten up the bedrooms, then put on some coffee and begin to get them something to eat...or do you invite them to sit down, talk with them, and let the other things wait a bit? That's the choice we just heard about in this Gospel. Martha did one thing...Mary did the other!

When Jesus dropped by one day to visit His good friends, Martha and Mary, it seems as though Martha's hurrying around was causing Him to feel uncomfortable. You see, with the Cross of Calvary not that far away, Jesus had come to Bethany to find a quiet space, an oasis of calm, a place to be with special friends, away from the demanding crowds and the pressures of the day - at least for a short time!

You might have noticed that both Martha and Mary offered Jesus hospitality - but in such different ways! Martha, busy with her agenda and all her details of hospitality! Notice that Mary didn't say a word, and that Martha, in her "passive aggressive manner", didn't address the problem to Mary. Instead, she tried to get Jesus involved in the conflict. Jesus, however, neither reprimanded Martha nor did He command Mary. What He did was to first recognize Martha's hospitality for what it was, and then gently let Martha know that Mary's priorities of hospitality were more what Jesus wanted at that

moment!

"Take it easy, Martha", Jesus told her. "There's time later for these other things. First of all, take time to listen to the Word of God!" Now, here was Jesus, the very Word of God, telling both Martha and Mary - and through the Gospel, telling you and me as well - "Take time to listen...to appreciate what God is telling you in your everyday life!" Every one of us sometimes gets so busy with many things. Jesus says to us, "Only one thing is required!" Perhaps we could ask ourselves every day this week, "Lord, what is the one thing You ask of me today?"

This doesn't mean that the "Marthas" of the world are not important. They certainly are. But perhaps Jesus is saying that we must never forget the correct scale of values or priorities... "to seek first the Kingdom of God before all else"! That's what Mary was doing as she listened to Jesus and paid attention to Him as an individual. In His brief comment to Martha, perhaps Jesus was teaching us that "being there" for another person is more important than just "doing for them", according to our own personal agenda.

Both Martha and Mary were interested in providing for Jesus that day but Jesus told them both, "Mary has chosen the better part and she will not be deprived of it!"

So, for this reason, Mary, rather than Martha, is held up for our imitation in this Gospel - as the example of the true disciple - "the one who comes to Jesus to be nourished on the Word of the Lord".

As we now continue celebrating Jesus' Presence with us in this Eucharist, and listen to the Lord speaking to us today, what do you suppose is the "one thing" He is asking of you - not necessarily "to do", but rather "to be"! To Be for Him...? To Be for others...? To Be for yourself...?

2022 Catholic Services Appeal

Report #7

This is now our seventh report to you regarding our parishioner participation so far in the 2022 CSA campaign. The good news is that we have now attained about 62% of our Archdiocesan goal! Anything that we collect over our target fulfilled could be used for our special parish projects in the near future.

As of this past Wednesday, July 13th, we have now received a total of \$77,421.70 in direct donations, pledges and credit cards. This leaves us with a remaining balance of \$48,438.30 yet to be fulfilled if we are to reach our parish target. So far we have received 302 positive responses from our parishioners from a parish registration of 3025 families.

Our parish CSA committee is deeply appreciative to all of you who have helped so far, but as you can see, we are still in need of a lot more assistance from more parishioners.

Please do your fair share so that we, as the St. Patrick Parish Faith Family, can do our fair share in supporting the annual operations and charitable works of the Archdiocese-- "Fueling the Mission".

Follow-Up on 2022 CSA Gift Processing!

"...To err is human...To forgive divine." This week I received the following letter from Jim Thomas, CSA Director of Mission Advancement, with his apology.

"Dear Father,

I promised last Friday that I would send a follow-up note to you after I met yesterday with our gift processing vendor. The meeting was to address the 2022 CSA gift processing delays we are currently experiencing.

riencing.

I learned that our vendor/partner has forecasted they will process the current backlog of 1,470 gifts by this Friday, July 15th. We will upload these gifts into ParishSoft immediately upon receipt. This is to say that we should be back on track with all gift processing and data uploads by close of business on Monday.

The backlog exists because of a number of factors that include a gift processing system upgrade, a gift volume and priority projection miscalculation, and the time needed to correct inaccurate forms.

Long story short, it was a perfect gift processing storm.

We do have a path forward, and I am confident it is a good one. The gift processor has committed to evaluating and updating their processes so we don't have this issue in the future. And, for our team, we will do the same. I will continue to keep you updated on the progress being made.

Please know that you and your parishioners remain in my prayers. Say a prayer for me too."

Scriptural Reflections

Further reflections for your meditation: *Gn 18:1-10a; Col 1:24-28; Lk 10:38-42*

"In the beginning of Chapter 18 of Genesis, God come to Abraham in human form, as three travelers. Sensing he is in the presence of God, Abraham greets his three guests in the singular as "Sir", or Lord, and shows them hospitality.

God has revealed Himself as a trinity of persons to Abraham. Abraham is informed that he and Sarah will receive an answer to their greatest prayer - to become parents. In the same chapter, we learn that Sarah is beyond child-bearing years and has never had a child, but Abraham trusts in the Lord and his faith is greatly rewarded.

Hospitality is also the focus of today's brief Gospel from Luke. Jesus has stopped at a village a short distance from Jerusalem. He is visiting the home of Martha and Mary, the sisters of Lazarus.

Martha and Mary have very different ideas about how Jesus should be welcomed into their home. For

Martha, he is an important guest, and she feels it is necessary to lay out a feast. Mary seems aware that Jesus will not be with them much longer and therefore she does not want to leave Jesus' feet for even a moment. Indeed, Jesus' first prediction of His death occurred in the previous chapter.

Martha is incredulous that Jesus sides with Mary, so sure is she that Mary should be serving the guest, not wasting time at His feet. Jesus favors Mary as having chosen the better part, if only by making time to be in His presence instead of being distracted by other tasks.

This is an important and challenging lesson for Martha and for all of us. We can become so busy - so distracted and overwhelmed with the affairs of daily life - that we sometimes find it hard to make time to be in the presence of God or to find any peace when we do so. Making time to go to Mass, participate in Eucharistic adoration, or pray at home requires two things - sacrificing the time and whatever else we could be doing. Abraham's sacrifice was rewarded and so was that of Mary of Bethany. We, too, seek to find that balance between prayer and labor, doing all things for God's glory and for the good of others, for God will not be outdone in generosity."

**St. Bridget of Sweden****Feast Day: July 23**

Saint Bridget or Birgitta was born in 1303, the daughter of Birger Petersson, governor of Uppland and his wife Ingeborg Bengtsdotter. She was married to Ulf Gudmarsson, who became governor of the province of Nericia. They had eight children, all of whom survived past infancy which was rare for the 12th century. One of their daughters would become St. Catherine of Sweden.

Saint Bridget was hailed as a mystic and her visions, which began in her early childhood when she had visions of Christ Crucified, made her somewhat of a Middle Ages celebrity. Her vision of the Nativity of Jesus even influenced the art of the Nativity through the Baroque era! She is said to have predicted the Vatican State. Saint Bridget's Revelations, which she dictated to Peter Olafsson, the prior at the Cistercian monastery of Alvastra near which she retired after her husband's death in 1344, were published in 1492. They have since been published in many languages and can still be purchased today.

Some of her most profound visions regarded the founding of a new religious order which would be primarily for women, ruled by an abbess, but with a separate house for monks who would serve as order chaplains. Her visions detailed everything from the abbey church to the clothing that would be adopted as the nun's habit, and how the order would be ruled. King Magnus II of Sweden granted Bridget land and buildings. The order, called the Bridgettines or the Order of the Most Holy Savior was approved by Pope Urban V in 1370.

Saint Bridget was canonized in 1391 by Pope Boniface IX and in 1999 Pope John Paul II named her one of the Patron Saints of Europe.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

July 17, 2022
16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

“Our families need to ask for the gift of the Spirit! Through prayer, even in the busiest times, we give time back to God, we find the peace that comes from appreciating the important things, and we encounter the joy of God’s unexpected gifts. Through daily prayer may our homes become, like the house of Martha and Mary, places where Jesus always finds a warm welcome (Pope Francis).” While it is necessary to attend to the details of hospitality, learning how to be present to people, experiences, and God is sometimes more important. Creating homes that are welcoming environments requires not only organization and structure but members who truly enjoy being there and celebrating life with one another.

Details can often get the best of us. While attending to details is important to success, our obsession with them can be problematic. Whether wanting to make a good impression, fear of failure, insecurity, or emotional immaturity, throwing ourselves into the “details” of hospitality can distract us from being present to those we want to serve. Conversely, focusing exclusively on being present without any attention to detail also sets our attempts at hospitality up for disaster! We need a balance of both. But creating a truly welcoming space in our homes and within ourselves requires still more.

We have to be empty of ourselves. Becoming a welcoming, hospitable person is not possible in someone focused on their own needs and desires. If the one we serve is the one who looks back at us in the mirror, then there is no space for anyone else. While Martha and

Mary had different ideas of what it means to serve, they both had the inner space and freedom to do so. They were detached from themselves. Detachment becomes the challenge to hospitality and creating a God-centered, open-hearted space in our lives. When we impulsively act out of our personal agendas, violence, abuse, pride, greed, lust, power, control, passion, and self-aggrandizement encroach upon the space needed to be present to another human being. Not only can others not find a home in us, but even God cannot find a home in us!






