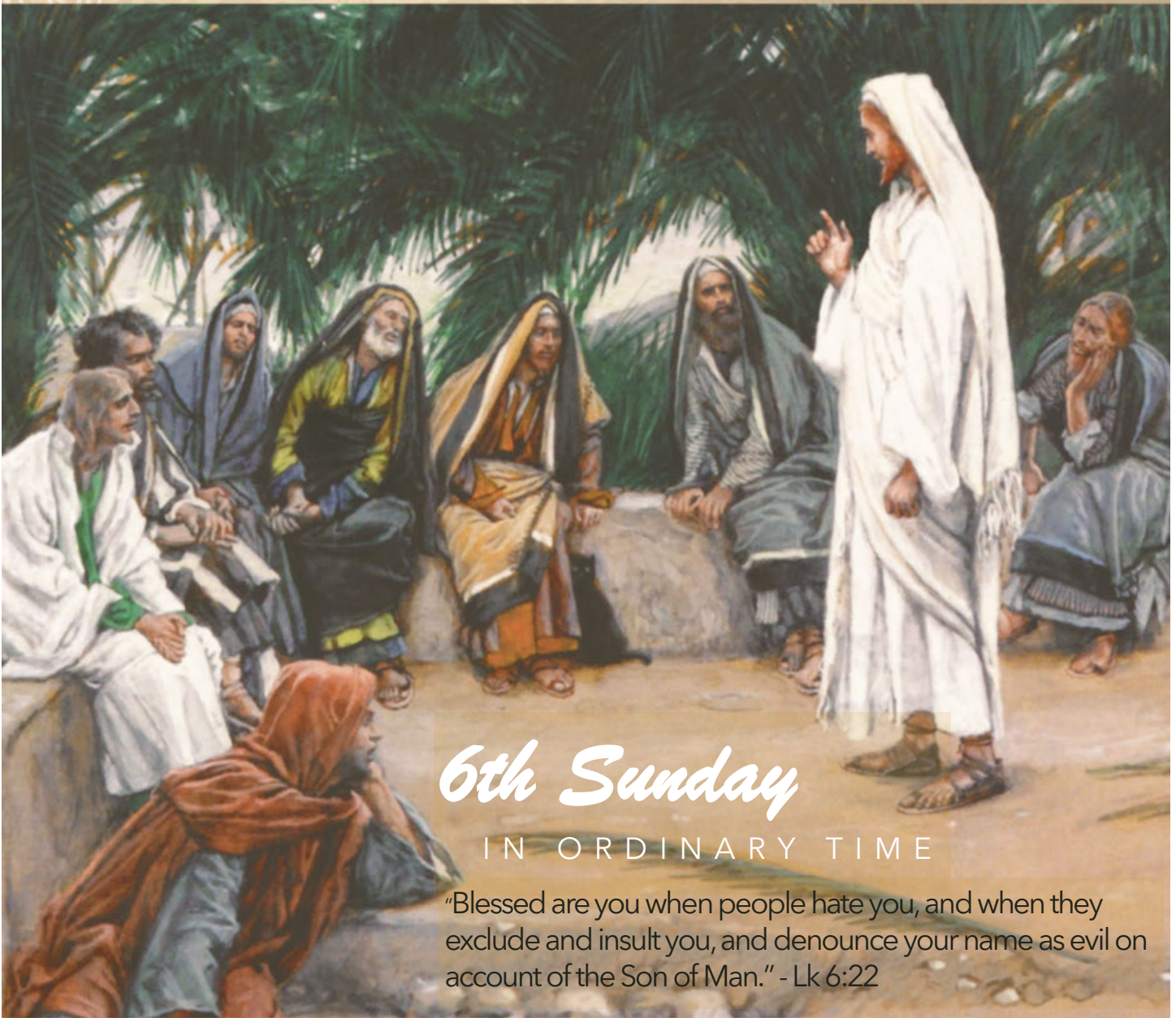

Marriage

Any engaged couple who wish to be married at St. Patrick should be a registered member at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. The couple will meet with the priest prior to marriage and will attend an approved marriage preparation program.

A couple who has been married in a non-Catholic ceremony and wish to have their marriage formally recognized by the Catholic Church can undergo a Convalidation process and have a church ceremony celebrating the sacrament of marriage.

Foot Update

Many people have been asking me about my foot. I had my post-operative appointment on Monday. Things looked good. I got to see my foot for the first time in a long time. Apparently, I had broken the bone in many places. I do not remember the doctor talking to me as I had come out of surgery. On Monday, he let me know that in hindsight, surgery was a good option as I may have had problems letting it heal normally and being active later. This whole thing happened so quickly. I was glad to hear that the choice was the right one.

What is the prognosis going forward? At the appointment, he put me in a cast. I will wear a cast for two weeks. The good news is that I am one week down as you read this. Yay! From the cast, I will graduate to a walking boot. Some of you have already told me that is an adventure in and of itself, but I do look forward to the progress. For now, I have never had a cast in my life. I do have a history of crutches for I have had several arthroscopic surgeries. I know I was younger, but I used to walk around the campus of U of M on crutches. It's kind of like remembering how to ride a bike.

The next part seems unclear to me. He said it takes 6-8 weeks to heal so the walking boot portion of my life could be another 3 weeks. I guess I will see. I seem to have avoided one scare. I did fall and land on my knee last week after Mass. If this scooter tips to the right, there is nothing to catch me. Also, I am suddenly very sympathetic to everyone who has a concern about walking on snow and ice. I have never paid so much attention to the weather, and now it seems as if it is cold, snowy, and icy every day! Anyways, thankfully I did not break my knee cap. That would have been a disaster.

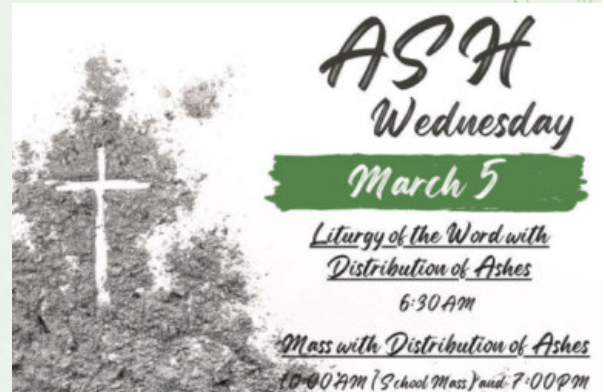
Somebody told me that this is the penalty for trying to stay fit. Years ago, my doctor impressed on me that I need to exercise for high blood pressure reasons. Part of the reason I do these things is so that I will be around for a while. It is ironic that the thing I am trying to do to stay healthy bit me. My hope is to get back to things like jogging and playing hockey.

So, for one more week you will see me scoot around the parish. An injury certainly teaches you humility and letting go. Thank you for your prayers. Thank you for the many people who have made me a meal or driven me around or offered to help me in any way. I know I have not gotten back to all who have offered, but the response is overwhelming. On Monday, I did snap pictures of the x-ray of the repair. Stop me if you are interested in seeing.

This week I learned that St. Stanislaus Kostka is the saint to whom to pray if you have a broken bone. I found a story that his brother was not happy with Stanislaus' piety, and he was treated with harsh blows from which he suffered multiple fractures. He was a young saint. He entered the Society of Jesus, but he died at the age of 17! I wish the circumstances were better, but it's always nice to learn about a new saint.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The theme of hope connects today's Scripture passages. In the First Reading, the prophet Jeremiah states, *Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is the Lord*. St. Paul professes, in his First Letter to the Corinthians: *If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all. But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep*. In the Gospel, the evangelist St. Luke presents his version of the beatitudes expressed by Jesus. With hope, for those who are hungry, weeping, and insulted for His name, our Lord proclaims: *Behold, your reward will be great in heaven*. In a world desperate for Christ, faithful stewards hope in the Lord, for He is *the Way, the Truth, and the Life* (John 14:6). In the Scriptures, Jesus encourages us to persevere in difficult times. Make time daily to read a few verses of the Bible and attend Mass regularly to find strength and hope in the Eucharist.

Welcome, Archbishop-elect Weisenburger!



Pope Francis has appointed Bishop Edward J. Weisenburger, Bishop of the Diocese of Tucson, as the sixth Archbishop of Detroit. The archbishop-elect succeeds Archbishop-emeritus Allen H. Vigneron, who has served the archdiocese since 2009.

The new archbishop will be installed at a ceremony at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament on March 18. Additional details about the installation liturgy and other welcome events will be shared in the coming days.

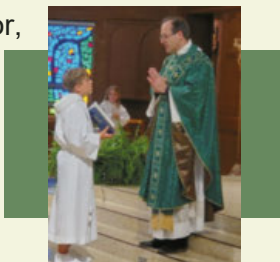

READ THE GOSPEL - The Sermon on the Plain

Luke 6:17, 20-26

TAKE TIME TO CHAT

- ♦ Who are the people that Jesus describes as blessed? Is this teaching surprising to you? Why or why not?
- ♦ In today's Gospel, Jesus is trying to teach us that true happiness comes when we rely on God. Share a time when you relied on God.
- ♦ Have you ever been insulted or laughed at? What would Jesus say about this situation?

LITURGY LINK

In today's Gospel, large crowds gathered to encounter Jesus. The same thing happens at Mass today. The people in the pews are called the "congregation," and they gather each week to encounter Jesus in the readings and the Eucharist. Count the number of people in the congregation at Mass today.

FAMILY FUN - Decorate Placemats

In the Bible, meals are an important time for relationship and faith sharing.

Use large paper (such as 11 x 17) and decorate the placemat with fun pictures, a shout-out to other family members or prayers before and after the meal. Use them for your family meal today. Consider making extra so that you can donate them to your local Meals on Wheels, nursing home, or other organizations that serve meals. For these placemats, consider offering words of hope, encouragement, and love.

FAMILY PRAYER - Prayer for Vocations

In today's Gospel, Jesus ministered to a great multitude. He needs people today to continue the work he started on earth. As a family, pray his prayer for vocations to call forth more people to serve God.

FAMILY CHALLENGE

As a family, identify one person discerning a vocation to either marriage, priesthood, or religious life. Discuss as a family one thing you can do to support that person in their journey (i.e., pray for that individual, send him/her a card with prayers and good intentions, invite them over for a meal, cover the cost of a class or supplies for a class they are taking, etc.).

FUN FACT

A Jesuit explorer who came from France as a missionary in 1666 was one of the first Europeans to name the Mississippi. He gave this vital artery of North America the name "The River of the Immaculate Conception." The entrustment of this mighty waterway to the Virgin Mary was part of the French Jesuits' mission to evangelize the Native Americans of the area.
