Prayer as a Engaged Couple

A Prayer as a Young Person

Prayer While Discerning a Vocation

Lord Jesus, I have waited for a long time for this moment. I have needed time to speak with you alone and especially to listen to you. The truth, to be honest, is that you do not stop sending me messages. The problem is that I do not always want to receive them. At times I drown them out with work, people, and noise. Yet then, when your calm invitation "Follow me" comes, my heart overflows with light and peace. As soon as I hear this invitation in the depths of my conscience, my heart trembles at the thought that you have chosen me from among hundreds and thousands of young people. Your chosen apostle? Then the calling of your first disciples comes to mind and I ask myself, "And what was so special about Peter, James, John and Andrew?" Weren't they sinners like everyone else? Weren't they weak. quarrelsome, and cowardly like everyone else? Yet, you chose them. And Jesus answers me, "You did not choose me; no, I chose you!"

It amazes me to think that these poor fishermen from the Sea of Galilee did not hesitate to leave on the shore, dead forever, their fishing nets and boats to follow you. And I find it so hard to leave my family, the comforts of home, my friends, my career prospects, my personal plans, my freedom... But on the other hand, you also attract me with a special force, telling me that you are much more than any person or thing in this world. Your personality, your generosity, your tenderness, your

gentleness of heart, and the greatness of your Kingdom all attract me.

I will follow you, Lord. I will follow you wherever you go, and wherever You take me. I will go with you, carrying my cross and rising with you in order to save souls for you. Only three things I ask of you: grant me faith, grant me generosity, and grant me courage. In a word, grant me love.

God, our Creator, life is your gift to me. By Baptism, You invite me to share the gift of my life in service to others. I ask Lord, "Who will be your priest, deacon, brother, sister, missionary, lay leader? Is it I?" Give me the courage and generosity to respond to your love, to your call. Give those to the married and the single state the graces that their vocation requires. Give those you have called to the priesthood and consecrated life the graces they need to sustain them in their special calling and mission in the Church. Keep them close to you throughout their lives.
