




Can You Give an Hour a Week?

Questions & Answers

Is Holy Family paying an individual or firm to execute this Capital Campaign? The Campaign, including planning, publications, etc., is being supported by professional volunteers, Holy Family staff, and a Campaign Committee, comprised of parishioners.

Has the Parish asked for quotes for Rebuild & Renew Restoration projects? We have carefully assessed the capital needs of our Parish and asked for professional contractor quotes. Although volunteers have assisted, the scope of the work now needs professional expertise for completion.

Can you use money from Holy Family's yearly budget to encompass the costs of the Capital Campaign projects? Our budget is very lean now. We have done a number of things, including personnel cuts to reflect a reduction in sacrificial giving and rising costs such as utilities.

Will the Diocese's bankruptcy declaration impact the Campaign? Parishes are separately incorporated under New York State's Religious Corporations Law and are not part of the filing. The funds raised for Holy Family's Rebuild & Renew Campaign are a restricted asset—specifically be earmarked for Holy Family projects.

Holy Family Parish did a Capital Campaign, *Reigniting Our Faith*, several years ago. Where is that money? That campaign was introduced and executed through the Albany Diocese in 2017-18. Holy Family raised \$41,000 by asking a limited number of parishioners. Those funds will now be used to assist Rebuild & Renew Campaign.

Is there an order for the importance of the projects?

Through staff, professional assessment, and volunteers, we carefully reviewed what are the more pressing needs of the Parish. Some needs are imminent, such a boiler for the Rectory, which we have been "nursing" along this winter. It was determined last Fall that it should be replaced. All of these projects will ensure quality and lasting value to our facilities for use by current and future generations.

Can my Capital Campaign Donation replace my Regular Weekly Giving? The short answer is "no." Our weekend offertory is only helping to support the day-to-day budgeted Parish needs. This is why we ask you to discern what your family can afford to pledge and why we say it is a "sacrificial" gift.

Can Holy Family reach the \$300,000 goal without my help?

Any donation—no matter how big or small—is greatly appreciated, and we can only reach our goal through the combined sacrifice of many families. Please pray about how you can participate and make your pledge as soon as possible.

Holy Family Parish Restoration Campaign

Message from Fr. Slezak:

Holy Family Parish is embarking on a Rebuild & Renew Capital Campaign to raise \$300,000 to cover several projects that need immediate attention. Additionally, other projects will allow the pastor, visiting priests or seminarians to reside at the parish. Still others will restore some of the signs and symbols that have meaning and communicate a deeper truth to us. The projects will be done in the order of urgency and as money comes in through the campaign.

Our church is special. It is and has been the center of family life for over 175 years: from the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, Confirmation, Anointing the Sick to weddings and funerals—all of those life experiences woven into the holy fabric of our faith, our lives, our church, and parish. I have been moved by the endless stories of memories and affection families have for our church. At the same time, I recognize that the last number of years have not been without its challenges. I am hoping that through our reintroduction of parish events over the past year, along with the capital campaign, we will generate a new longing for God and a desire to make the Church the center of our lives.

To embark on a capital campaign is an extraordinary effort, meant to address extraordinary Parish needs. I hope you will pray about your involvement and financial commitment. Your generosity will help ensure our priceless church and buildings are safeguarded and maintained for future generations and better position us to make disciples of Christ. Rest assured, all campaign funds are protected and earmarked to these projects and are not impacted by the Diocese's recent announcement of bankruptcy.
