





Helmer Avenue Dolgeville, NY 13329 (315) 823-3410 "Friday itself remains a special day of penitential observance throughout the year, a time when those who seek perfection will be mindful of their personal sins and the sins of mankind which they are called upon to help expiate in union with Christ Crucified. Friday should be in each week something of what Lent is in the entire year. For this reason we urge all to prepare for that weekly Easter that comes with each Sunday by freely making of every Friday a day of self-denial and mortification in prayerful remembrance of the passion of Jesus Christ.

"Among the works of voluntary self-denial and personal penance which we especially commend to our people for the future observance of Friday, even though we hereby terminate the traditional law of abstinence binding under pain of sin, as the sole prescribed means of observing Friday, we give first place to abstinence from flesh meat. We do so in the hope that the Catholic community will ordinarily continue to abstain from meat by free choice as formerly we did in obedience to Church law. Our expectation is based on the following considerations:

- → We shall thus freely and out of love for Christ Crucified show our solidarity with the generations of believers to whom this practice frequently became, especially in times of persecution and of great poverty, no mean evidence of fidelity to Christ and His Church.
- ♦ We shall thus also remind ourselves that as Christians, although immersed in the world and sharing its life, we must preserve a saving and necessary difference from the spirit of the world. Our deliberate, personal abstinence from meat, more especially because no longer required by law, will be an outward sign of inward spiritual values that we cherish." Excerpt from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). The effective date of these regulations is the first Sunday of Advent, November 27, 1966.



As we approach the Feast of Our Lady of Fátima, we are mindful of her request for us to renew our spirit of mortification and penance for conversions and world peace. Our Lady told the children at Fatima:

"Sacrifice yourselves for sinners and say often to Jesus, especially each time you make a sacrifice: O Jesus, it is for love of You, for the conversion

of sinners and in reparation for sins committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary."

Please make a conscious effort to give up something on Fridays in obedience to Our Lady and the bishops of the Holy Catholic Church.

### **Christ Died for Our Salvation on Friday**

It comes as a surprise to many Catholics that the Church still asks us to give up meat on Fridays throughout the entire year. While it is not obligatory "under pain of sin" to give up meat on Fridays, we are still supposed to make some sacrificial act on Friday.

This week I want to include an excerpt from a statement made by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) in 1966 regarding the significance of sacrifice on Fridays. Notice how the bishops did not intend to abolish abstinence from meat, but aware that it was not much a sacrifice for many people wished to encourage people of the spirit behind the law. In other words, far from a relaxation on the rules, it appears to me, it was a way to inspire a deeper spirit of Friday penance.

"Catholic peoples from time immemorial have set apart Friday for special penitential observance by which they gladly suffer with Christ that they may one day be glorified with Him. This is the heart of the tradition of abstinence from meat on Friday where that tradition has been observed in the holy Catholic Church.

"Changing circumstances, including economic, dietary, and social elements, have made some of our people feel that the renunciation of the eating of meat is not always and for everyone the most effective means of practicing penance. Meat was once an exceptional form of food; now it is commonplace. Accordingly, since the spirit of penance primarily suggests that we discipline ourselves in that which we enjoy most, to many in our day abstinence from meat no longer implies penance, while renunciation of other things would be more penitential.

"For these and related reasons, the Catholic bishops of the United States, far from downgrading the traditional penitential observance of Friday, and motivated precisely by the desire to give the spirit of penance greater vitality, especially on Fridays, the day that Jesus died, urge our Catholic people henceforth to be guided by the following norms.
