




All Invited to the NYS Eucharistic Congress

Students: Join Our Christmas Play

Here's an invite to students in grades 6-12 from our regional Roman Catholic parishes of St Joseph in Dolgeville, Holy Family in Little Falls, Annunciation in Ilion, Our Lady Queen of Apostles in Frankfort, and St. Joseph the Worker in Richfield Springs/West Winfield. If friends are students between grades 6-12 and not Catholic, but wants to participate, he or she can come too.

Join in the fun of putting on the performance of the first annual Christmas play: "The Story of the Nativity." Are you a Registered Parishioner?

In one of it's reforms, The Council of Trent demanded that dioceses be divided into territorial parishes. Trent made this demand so that there might be universal provision for the delivery of pastoral care to Christ's faithful. Historically, the closest parish is where you would register, as the local pastor is responsible for every soul that resides within the boundaries of his parish. However, people sometimes find a spiritual home elsewhere. Regardless of where you live, you should be registered at the parish where you attend Mass.

Why register? Your registration is a commitment to practice your faith. People are very transitory nowadays. Registering helps parishioners to stay rooted and to deepen their commitment in a tangible way. Registering also lets the pastor know that you are committed to the parish. It tells him, "You can count on me. I am willing to help. I won't leave the parish when I disagree with something or do not like the Mass time"

Registering commits us spiritually too. It says, "I am willing to be formed by the pastor of a particular parish." Registering is a financial commitment to the local church. The fifth precept of the Catholic Church reads: "You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church—meaning that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability." Registered parishioners support the Church first and foremost at the local level (principle of subsidiarity). The local parish simply cannot survive without committed and regular financial donors.

If you are not registered, the parish has no way of contacting you. Sometimes Catholic hospitals will ask what parish you belong to. This helps the chaplain to know who to contact in case of a sacramental emergency. In times of joy and in times of struggle, it is comforting to have the support of a faith family. Registering allows for you and your family to be counted and heard in the parish. Being included in the demographics of the parish helps in the planning for the needs of the parish. For religious education instruction and Sacramental preparation, those attending should also be registered even if you live beyond the parish boundaries.

Oct. 7th & 8th: Those with last names from **A-M** can check to see if they're registered.

Oct. 14th & 15th: Those with last names N-Z can check status. Individuals in the back of the church with the parish roster will assist you. Volunteers can also help you to register those days. You can call the Parish Office at (315) 823-3410 or request a registration from by going to our website.

N. B. It should be noted that, regardless of where you are registered, the pastor of your territorial, i.e., local parish, is responsible for your soul. Therefore, before the pastor of the parish where you are registered can perform the Sacraments of Baptism and Marriage in particular, the local pastor must grant him permission.
