



From the Pastor's Desk

6TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

There is much that is happening here at the parishes. The men's retreat was a success with great participation from our churches. The women's retreat is less than a month away (still time to register). Religious education and youth ministry remain vibrant, and Christ continues His saving work through the sacraments which we receive. There is much for which to be grateful, and how important it is to focus on our blessings rather than our frustrations or disappointments. I want to remind everyone that the Beacons of Light process continues in full swing throughout the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. The various parish families are in differing stages in the process. In fact, there are a couple of parish families that have completed the process of becoming a single parish. For Sts. Columbkille, Augustine, and Holy Name, we are more or less at the beginning stages of the process. Much of this is due to the changeover of pastors in December last year. I am in conversation with both parish leadership and the archdiocese as to moving forward with the process.

Please know that Archbishop Schnurr has appointed me as dean of the St. Mary-B Deanery. (A deanery is simply a grouping of parish families within a geographic area under the oversight of a deanery priest.) As a result of this appointment, I will be devoting some additional time to checking in with other pastors in the deanery and offering my support.

Finally, I would like to ask if you could keep Archbishop Schnurr in your prayers. He is recuperating from a recent fall but looks forward to returning to his episcopal ministry as soon as possible.


