



# From the Pastor

## 8TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (MARCH 2, 2025)

The first and third readings for this Sunday are linked by one word in particular: tree. In the first reading from Sirach (27:4-7), we find that "the fruit of a tree shows the care it has had." Then in Luke's Gospel (6:39-45), we find that "... every tree is known by its fruit." Both images connect the idea of one's upbringing and formation with their actual way of life. There lies the importance of faith, family, community, and society. All of these realities are intertwined so as to produce the fruit of our lives.

But if we left it at that, we would be missing the most important element: God. The God that we believe in is not a dormant God. It's not as though God sits passively on the sidelines watching us from a safe distance. Instead, God is One who takes the initiative, always seeking to bring about good fruit in our lives. Whether it's the gifts of the Holy Spirit (twelve of them in Catholic tradition) or various virtues (most notably faith, hope and love), God is inviting us to accept a closer communion with Him and each other. In our human freedom, we can choose whether or not to cooperate with them.

Moreover, if and when these gifts are accepted, they find a place in our hearts. And they reside within us regardless of whether or not they are being displayed in the moment. We might liken it to a concert pianist. That person has the skill to play the piano masterfully whether or not they are performing in the moment. Their skill is such a part of them that it's "baked into" their lives. We are only a few days from Ash Wednesday, the start of the Lenten season. It's a time to begin – if not intensify – the traditional practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Yet all of these practices are not simply done for their own sake; rather, they are done so that we can bear good fruit for God and His Kingdom on earth. God bless,

## WHAT IS ASH WEDNESDAY ALL ABOUT?

If there ever is a day of the year when you can spot Catholics immediately, Ash Wednesday is it. It is the one time when Catholics wear their faith on their foreheads.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent for Catholics. The ashes we receive on our forehead in the shape of a cross serve as an outward sign of our sinfulness and need for penance. The ashes also symbolize our mortality, a reminder that one day we will die, and our bodies will return to dust. The tradition of receiving ashes has its origins in the Old Testament, where sinners performed acts of public penance. It was Pope Urban II who in, the 11th century, recommended that all Catholics take part in the practice of receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday. In the 12th century, it became customary that the ashes used on Ash Wednesday were made by burning the previous year's palm branches.


## THE CRS RICE BOWL PROGRAM

No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher. Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me remove that splinter in your eye,' when you do not even notice the wooden beam in your own eye? You hypocrite! 
