



Message from Father Steve,

First, congratulations to the St. Mary-Willow Grove Softball Wildcards on their State Class 5 Championship! These outstanding young ladies had one fantastic season and were awarded the State Title in Softball. This is a prime example when two schools can combine their talents and work as a team for a common goal. Working for one goal takes us back to the very beginning. Without unity, humanity would have never achieved the incredible advancements that we now enjoy. Working together is something that you know when it's present, and you know when it's absent. When there is unity, everything runs smoothly & more gets accomplished. When there is division & lack of understanding, all you have is chaos & confusion. One of his final prayers, Jesus prayed that his followers might be at one with each other. Unfortunately, Christian communities can often reflect the opposite of such a vision by the divisions that they maintain, sometimes even in the name of the same God who calls us to oneness. If we would learn more thoroughly about and come to believe more deeply in the Love that God has for each of us, such divisions would begin to shrink.

With election day quickly approaching, we see all forms of people "preaching," unity designed to sway our vote one way or another. While some are legitimate, others cast a shadow of doubt on the world. Even today, the divisions created, run the gamut from outright racism and sexism to the subtle and perhaps not subtle ways in which the news is reported. For example, think of how war casualties are headlined: "Twenty more killed, including 10 Americans." What might happen to our view of war if such headlines were to dispense with certain nationality information? Does it matter to the widows or the orphans? Does it matter to God? Does God divide the victims of war by the flag under which they lived or fought? The national party that they support. Their religious or non-religious affiliation? Hopefully, we know down deep that it does not, but perhaps society has not yet learned to recognize such divisions' silliness and sadness. So, we continue to live the divisions rather than Love that God asks of us . Today, let's take note of what can be accomplished when we practice unity, oneness, and equality. Let us do our part to rid the world of the evil of separation and pray that we can unite under the one God, who is Jesus Christ.






