Message from Father Steve,

Life can be challenging, but God is always good!

We often hear people say they would like a little "peace and quiet." I think we can all say a hearty "amen" to that, especially with all that is taking place in our world right now. Yet, I wanted to take a few moments to encourage you today on this thought of "peace." At times, we have wrongly concluded that peace is simply the absence of conflict of any kind, yet we forget that Jesus came into a world filled with political and moral turmoil. Yet, He was, and IS the Prince of Peace!

The gospel story begins with Jesus going with his disciples James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. He has barely entered when they confide to him their worries and concerns, petty though they may seem. Simon's mother-in-law has gone to bed with a fever. Jesus did not hesitate, he went straight away to her bed, took her by the hand, and the fever left her, and she began to wait on them. Jesus' present healing involves only a gesture - he grasped her hand and helped her up. That healing action of Jesus was enough to set the town on fire, and by evening everyone who was sick or afflicted in any way was at Simon's doorstep. Whenever people hear of a healer, there are hordes of people who seek the magical touch. What's wrong with seeking a miracle?


The Gospel tells us the crowds kept increasing; they wanted more miracles. By morning crowds were milling around waiting for Jesus, but he was nowhere to be found; he disappeared. The apostles could not understand. This was the moment Jesus should have capitalized on his popularity, yet he disappeared, and when they found him, he was alone by himself praying. Jesus needed a little "peace and quiet."

By refusing to be what the people wanted him to be: a magical Savior, Jesus was making a point that good health does not necessarily enhance the quality of life, and ill-health does not necessarily detract from it. Rather than carry on with the healing, Jesus insisted on leaving the crowds and heading off to other places to preach the good news. We can imagine it was hard for Jesus to leave the people, yet that was the Father's will revealed to him in prayer, and that is what he did. He had come not to do what the people wanted him to do but to do the Father's will. Suffering, a deep part of human existence and an essential part of estrangement from God, was also a means of purification and returned to God. Jesus did not ignore the pain but did not seek to avoid it either.

What advice would you give a man considering a vocation to the priesthood?



Thanks, Fr. Steve

Each year the Lord Jesus calls the entire Church to a special season of penance and renewal. As we begin this holy time of Lent, we should reflect on our need for conversion of heart, prayer, charitable works and penance. The season of Lent extends this year from Ash Wednesday, February 17, to the Mass of the Lord's Supper, April 1, inclusive.

- Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday. Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.
- Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. The other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but altogether they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed.
- When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the obligation of the law is modified. Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.
- Because Lent is a special season for all Christians, we should not lightly excuse ourselves from these penitential practices.


