Message from Father Steve,

I was the self-declared "mother advocate" during my three years in the seminary. I would inquire among my fraters, "when last did you call your mom?" If it were more than one month, they would get the "call your mother" lecture from me! Keeping in contact is essential. My American brothers didn't see the need to call home; I was always inspired by those from Vietnam, Mexico, Colombia, and other countries, who used social media to stay in touch. I called my mom frequently and would always inquire, "what's new?" Mom would usually respond nothing much. Then, I would say, did you hear about (insert name) dying? Mom would say, NO! When did she die? Where did you hear that--she would ask? FACEBOOK, I would respond. I have concluded, today in scripture, we hear about the beginning of FACEBOOK, Jesus says, "See that you tell no one anything, but go, show yourself to the priest and offer for your cleansing what Moses prescribed; that will be proof for them." The man went away and began to publicize the whole matter. He spread the report abroad so that it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly."

Social media has drawn us together, but yes, it does have its downfalls. During this last election cycle, it became a place of contention, even among friends. A few months ago, I conducted an experiment. I seldom share posts, but in this case, I shared an article about a Cardi-

nal's statement that some took issue with. Within minutes, just like hornets, there were both positive and negative comments. One comment even said, "I never liked him!" It was at that moment I decided to stick to posting my Sunday night dinner! Sometimes it's just better to stay quiet, and as the old cliché says, "smell the roses."


In today's Gospel, Mark includes the short but essential detail that Jesus, amid his demanding preaching and healing, seeks out a "deserted," out-of-the-way place to pray. We all need that deserted place in which we reconnect with God and the things of the heart. That "deserted" place may be a set time for prayer every day, a walk in the woods, a quiet corner of the house or apartment, or even a bathrobe -- whatever keeps us aware of God's presence in our life and renews within us a sense of gratitude for the blessings of that presence. Close those apps, and open a good book, the Bible preferably. But mostly, "call your mother!"

The Season of Lent will begin with the ancient practice of marking the baptized with ashes as a public and communal act of penance. Ash Wednesday will be slightly different in this year when we have had to adapt our ways of worshipping and praying. Instead of ashes being traced on our foreheads by the hand of a priest (which could impact our health) we can receive ashes that are sprinkled on the top of our head. This is permitted by our rites and is an ancient biblical image. This is a fitting and safe way to continue receiving ashes as we begin Lent this year. May this be a season of grace, mercy and conversion as the Lord leads us to the celebration of His passion, death and resurrection in Holy Week.


Each year the Lord Jesus calls the entire Church to a special season of penance and renewal. As we begin this holy time of Lent, we should reflect on our need for conversion of heart, prayer, charitable works and penance. The season of Lent extends this year from Ash Wednesday, February 17, to the Mass of the Lord's Supper, April 1, inclusive.

- Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.
- Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. The other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but altogether they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed.
- 4. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the obligation of the law is modified. Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.
- Because Lent is a special season for all Christians, we should not lightly excuse ourselves from these penitential practices.
