



Message from Bishop McGovern,

As we gather to celebrate Easter this year, the Church proclaims the gospel passages in which the Risen Christ appears to people beginning on Easter Sunday. One of the most beautiful appearances is recorded in the gospel of John in which the Risen Lord appeared to St. Mary Magdalene, who had come to the tomb and discovered it empty.

(Mary) turned around and caught sight of Jesus standing there. But she did not know him. "Woman" he asked her, "why are you weeping? Who is it you are looking for?" She supposed he was the gardener, so she said, "Sir, if



you are the one who carried him off, tell me where you have laid him and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned to him and said (in Hebrew) "Rabboni!" (meaning "Teacher"). Jesus then said: "Do not cling to me, for I have not yet ascended to my Father. Rather, go to my brothers and tell them, "I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God!" Mary Magdalene went to the disciples. "I have seen the Lord!" she announced. Then she reported what he had said to her. (John 20:11-18)

Some of you may remember that I was ordained and installed as Bishop of Belleville this past July 22, the Feast of St. Mary Magdalene. Cardinal Blase Cupich preached at the ordination liturgy about St. Mary Magdalene's faith when she met the Risen Lord. Cardinal Cupich noted in his homily:

"In the Vatican Museums in Rome, there is a tapestry designed by the great artist Raphael. The tapestry depicts the Risen Jesus actually dressed as a gardener, with a spade over his shoulder and wearing a funny looking hat to keep the sun off his face. Raphael's point is that Mary thought Jesus was the gardener because he was dressed like one and he was dressed like one to show the true meaning of the Resurrection. Christ's risen appearance involved no pyrotechnics or dazzling displays of power, but just the ordinary circumstances of a man tending to a garden, so that Mary Magdalene and all those after her would understand that in his resurrection Jesus was bringing about the new creation that St. Paul describes in our second reading (Second Corinthians 5:14-17: "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation.") The creation story of Genesis in which God walks through and tends the garden with humanity has now been rewritten. The Lord chose Mary, calling her by name because she had no ability to recognize him in the ordinary circumstances of life: a gardener creating a new garden.

It is beautiful to contemplate that in his resurrection, Jesus makes all things new. His victory over sin and death restores fallen humanity, that we can now, through God's mercy, enter the garden of Eden, the paradise that God intended for man and woman to enjoy forever since the beginning. As we celebrate Jesus' resurrection, we realize how often we encounter the Risen Lord precisely in our daily life: family meals, visits with our neighbor, and long walks with a friend, (as in the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13 -35)). Yet because of Jesus' cross and resurrection, our daily life has a new vitality and ordinary life is infused with a zest that we could not produce on our own. "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation." (2 Cor. 5:17).


