

Reflection on the death of Fr. Dale,

A woman in her 80's walked into the church. The friendly usher greeted her at the door and helped her up the flight of steps. "Where would you like to sit?" he asked politely. "The front row please," she answered. "You don't want to do that," the usher said. "Father is boring." "Do you happen to know who I am? I'm his mother," she declared indignantly. "Do you know who I am?" the usher asked. "No," she said. "Good," he answered. I try my best not to "be boring" during my homilies. I have shared with the parishes that my brother Brian is known to start coughing when I go too long or get off-topic. Some of the best conversations I had about our faith were not heard inside the Church. They usually happen in some you would not except. As a teen, I was hired by my local Knights of Columbus to clean the building each week. Many times, I would forget to lock the building. I would hear this old 1950's VW microbus pull up and stop. Out would hop, Father Joe Sense, a priest from a rural church, where I lived. He would pop his head in the door, "you open.?" How can I say no to a priest, "come on in, Father!" He was always dressed in a cassock; he wore tennis shoes, and his big toe would protrude for a tear in the shoe. He was an amazing priest and a devoted fan of STAG beer (*Belleville Budweiser as it is known*). He would drink a few beers, me a soda, and we would talk and chat. The subject always seemed to drift to religion. He could bring the bible to life and explain scripture so that it was clear and understandable. He was also the chaplain at Menard Correctional Center; little did I know that I would someday be a Volunteer Chaplain at the same institution.

I particularly remember him explaining the Gospel we heard today, of the grower and vine. In his Sunday homilies, which seldom exceeded five minutes, he explained scripture so that his mostly rural parishioners could grasp it. After his passing in 1990, it was revealed how frugal Father was. We now have the Sense Residence for retired priests and a beautiful new Church, St. Mary Divine Mercy, in Ellis Grove through his legacy. Father Sense influenced my life in a way I would never expected. He helped to nurture that seed, that turned into a vine, that brought forth fruit.



you to live in me."

One of my favorite passages of scripture is the Fifteenth chapter of John's gospel in which Christ declares I am the vine, you are the branches. Jesus wants us to "remain" or "abide" in him, so that his life flows into us who are the branches grafted onto the vine, Jesus Christ. What does it mean for us to "abide" in Jesus? Abiding means being in love with Jesus; being at ease with Jesus; finding my strength in Jesus, and being ready to share with others why Jesus is in my life. Perhaps in prayer we can simply ask: "Teach me Jesus what it is to live in you, and for

The gospel passage in John also includes our Lord speaking about the vine grower pruning some of the branches. Pruning is a familiar image with both negative and positive connotations. The negative would be a dry branch, lacking the vital sap, bearing no fruit; this branch the vine grower cuts off and tosses. The positive sense of pruning is when the vine grower prunes a living, healthy branch not as a hostile act. Rather the vine grower has confidence in the branch; he expects much of the branch and knows the branch can bear much fruit.

A similar dynamic happens on the spiritual plane: often God intervenes in our lives and introduces the cross. This does not mean God is upset with us. Rather the cross "prunes" our lives, leading us to let go of what is unimportant and focus on what is essential. For instance, our lives can have too many things, innumerable interests and hobbies. When we spread ourselves too thin, when we are too widely dispersed, we will not be outstanding in anything. The cross "prunes" our excesses and we are led to chose priorities.

Christ the True Vine gives us the courage to make choices in which we set aside some secondary interests and concentrate on what is primary. Leonardo da Vinci was a great artist who made a fascinating distinction between painting and sculpting. In painting, the artist adds more to the work, more paint and color on the canvas. Da Vinci loved sculpting and noted that sculpture is the art of removing, as the artist chisels away the excess marble. Christians who are branches being pruned, understand the art of removing. The cross leads us to remove desires, ambitions, projects and tendencies that spread us so thin and do not let us finish anything.

So what will be the yield once we are pruned? What will be the fruit? Love, commitment, courage, endurance and ordinary, daily kindness and compassion. These will be the rich yield if we allow Christ's life to flow through us and enter into the experience of pruning with great trust in the Lord. May the Risen Lord help us as we allow his divine life to coarse through us, making us fruit -bearing branches to the glory of God.
