

Most of us have planted a garden or lived on or near a farm. In my case, I grew up on a farm, where we raised cattle and harvested grain. My dad taught me about soil and seeds. I learned about the need for cooperation and balance between the various parts of nature - the sun, the earth, and the rain. For all farmers, life is intricately linked to the soil. I learned something about vegetable gardening from my Grandpa Heuman, **"We Harvest What We Plant."** If we plant squash, we can't expect to get corn. If we plant potatoes, you cannot expect to get tomatoes.

"We Harvest What We Plant." The same is true in our faith. And in my opinion, the best way to make sure we reap the best harvest is to plant the best seed possible. In Southern Illinois, we plant more corn than mustard seed! Drive down any road, and you will see small corn plants poking their heads above ground. I am amazed at how fast a cornstalk grows. In just a few short weeks, it will tower over most of our heads, reaching for the sky. From that small golden corn seed comes acres of strong waving corn. That is how the Kingdom of God works. Some things are certain. Jesus says the Kingdom of God is one of them. Our job is to plant the seeds of the Kingdom and then trust God to bring in the harvest. Trust is a beneficial ingredient. If we have it, we can go to bed and sleep well. Having some agricultural background is helpful when it comes to looking at the three parables of the soils and the Kingdom in the fourth chapter of the Gospel of Mark. Faith is a seed sown within the life of all human creatures. Faith is a seed full of potential for accomplishing great things for God. But unless that faith seed is nurtured and cultivated, unless that seed can realize its potential, that potential goes untapped.

This Is How It Is. Two parables about seeds today. The first one is about the secret growing from seed to harvest. The second is about the smaller seeds growing large. This is how it is with God's kingdom, God's rule. It is growing among us now. It is present with us today. But it is not yet finished. God still has much to do. So do we.

- What is my part today, this week, to build up God's kingdom, God's rule?
- What little thing can I do – think like Saint Thérèse of Lisieux – that will benefit someone else in a (surprisingly?) big way?
- How can I care for the earth so seeds and plants can prosper?

RESPECT LIFE

In the Second Reading from 2 Corinthians 5:6-10, Paul exhorts the early Church community in Corinth to have courage on their faith journey with the same goal in mind: to desire to always please Christ as we remain aware of our final judgment and eternal reward. While suffering is to be expected at times in life, we must be mindful of the life that God calls each one of us to live out. We must live in **just relationship** with each other, as equals. God does not call us to be "door mats." National statistics reveal that 1 in 3 women and 1 in 4 men in the US experience rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner, or spouse. These numbers are staggering. **Learn, Act, Connect and Pray**-Refamiliarize yourself with behaviors that are abusive by reading www.foryourmarriage.org/domestic-violence/. The U.S. Catholic Bishops have made it clear that "violence against women, inside or outside the home, is never justified. Violence in any form- physical, sexual, psychological, or verbal is sinful; often it is a crime as well." (When I Call for Help: A Pastoral Response to Domestic Violence Against Women). For abused persons, you may find help with the National Domestic Violence Hotline that refers to local sources of help in all 50 states. Call 1-800-799-SAFE (7233). For those who abuse, admit that the abuse is your problem and not your partner/spouse's. Call the National Domestic Violence Hotline at 1-800-799-7233 for information on where to find help. Abuse is cyclical. Stopping it in its tracks or removing yourself from an unsafe living environment benefits not only you, but those who love you.






Dear Friends,

Since our Holy Father, Pope Francis appointed me Bishop of Belleville on April 3, 2020, I have looked at different writings concerning the role of the bishop. I have been doing this in order to become more aware of my role as your shepherd, as well as my responsibilities to preserve union with the Holy Father and the Universal Church. One document that has been enormously helpful is "Christus Dominus" the decree on the pastoral office of bishops in the Church of the Second Vatican Council. "Christus Dominus" states:

In discharging their duty as father and shepherd, bishops should be among their people as those who serve, good shepherds who know their sheep and whose sheep know them. They should be outstanding in their spirit of love and concern for all, truly fathers whose God-given authority all obey with joyful heart. They should unite and mold the entire family of their flock so that all are made aware of their responsibilities and are able to live and work in loving communion with each other. I have tried in my first year as your bishop to take these words to heart. "Bishops should be among their people as those who serve"; in visiting over 75 parish church communities, as well as visiting parochial schools, high schools, PSR programs and hospitals, I have tried to be among you and learn more about your lives. The people of southern Illinois have been very kind in welcoming me and also opening up to me about what they are proud of about the Church and their hopes for the future.

As I begin my second year as your shepherd on July 22, I am reflecting on the past year and the different blessings and challenges. I am also wondering how to shape my ministry among you in the coming year. I feel I should continue the work of promoting religious vocations; that is a genuine priority for our diocese. I also want to engage more with ministry to those who are incarcerated and those who work in prisons; the Covid restrictions have made this very difficult during my first year.

I would welcome hearing from you about your sense of what should be my priorities in this coming year. You can write to me at my email address or at the Chancery Office. Most of all I ask you to please continue praying for me, that I be a good shepherd for all the people of our community. May the Lord Jesus strengthen us with the power of the Holy Spirit for the tasks that lie ahead of us together in the Diocese of Belleville.


