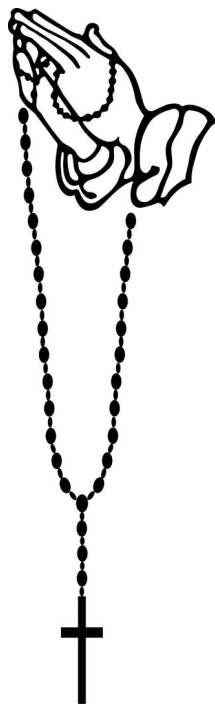

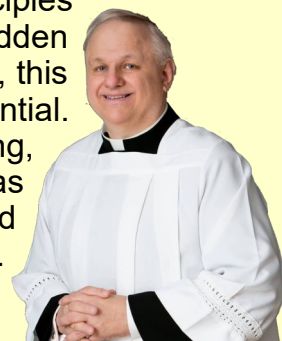

Jesus calmed the waters, and he came to calm our fears and anxiety by just saying, "Quiet! Be still!" Let us take that time in our lives to thank God for the times he has calmed the water in our own lives. Let us remember those who are suffering and need God's calming hand. May we recognize God's working hand in our lives.

The Raging Storm. Like the disciples today, we can feel as if we are in a small boat, on a deep lake, far from shore, in a raging storm. It seems like Jesus is sleeping through it all. But we know and believe, deep in our hearts, he is not. He is with us. He is in control – in his time and way.

- What is raging around me that is seeming to threaten me?
- How will I turn to Jesus, even in a chiding way like the apostles, for help?
- How can I, whom can I help as I have been helped?

RESPECT LIFE

“On that day, as evening drew on, Jesus said to his disciples: ‘Let us cross to the other side.’ Mark’s Gospel 4:35-41, illustrates the story of Christ stilling the storm on the Sea of Galilee, a sea that is known for violent wind storms amid the hills of northern Israel. Christ, is peacefully asleep on a pillow, while the disciples frantically yell at him, in today’s language, ‘don’t you care that we are going to die?’ Christ answers their pleas by calming the storm and then asking the disciples why they are afraid? Do they not yet have faith? They immediately realized Christ’s supreme authority over even the ocean, a force so fierce that no human, other than Christ, could contain. **Learn, Act, Connect and Pray**-Where in our lives, do we need Christ to take us “to the other side”? Could it be responding more generously to the cries of the poor, or to a neighbor in need? Is it taking time with a family member who you may not always agree with? Could it be taking a stronger stand for the unborn and mothers in need in our area? Whatever Christ is calling you to, know that through prayer, He will help you cross safely to the other side.

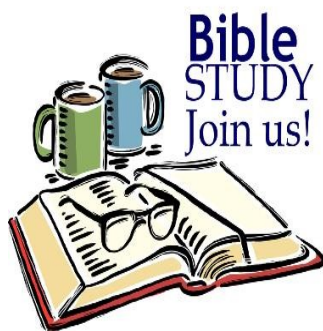

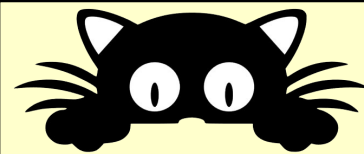

Pandemic recovery requires conversion, pope says...

ROME — Promoting the holistic development of everyone requires conversion, “and especially decisions that convert death into life and weapons into food,” Pope Francis said.

As many nations begin returning to a semblance of normal, even as the COVID-19 pandemic continues, governments and economists and citizens must act now to look carefully at what that “normal” was, judge what was good or bad about it and act to make life better for everyone, the pope said in a message June 15 to the Bratislava Forum.

The forum, sponsored by the thinktank GLOBSEC, brings together politicians, business leaders and others to focus on issues of importance for the people of Central and Eastern Europe.

To work for a better future, the pope said, an honest assessment of the past, “including the acknowledgment of systemic failures, past errors and lack of responsibility with regard to the Creator, our neighbor and all creation, strikes me as essential for the development of a model of recovery aimed not only at rebuilding what was, but also correcting the things that were not working, even before the advent of the coronavirus, and that ended up making the crisis worse.”

In looking around, he said, “what I see is a world that allowed itself to be duped by a false and arrogant sense of security based on a thirst for profit.”

“I see a model of economic and social life marked by many forms of inequality and selfishness where a tiny minority of the world population possesses most of its wealth and does not hesitate to exploit people and resources,” he said. And “I see a way of life that is insufficiently concerned for the environment.”

Urging the forum participants to act, Pope Francis insisted that promoting development must be done in a way that is centered “each person and the whole person” and “embraces the ethics of solidarity and political charity.”

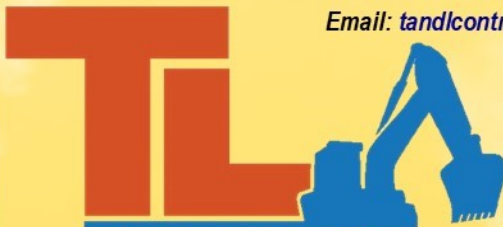
