Have you ever noticed the food left on a McDonald's tray ... Big Macs, French fries, half-eaten fish sandwiches? We Americans are obsessed with food. Put us at a buffet, and they must put up signs to make sure we don't stock up for the week! Along with our obsession with food is our focus on losing weight. We overeat the wrong thing and spend hundreds of dollars on special diets to take off the excess pounds. Enjoying our favorites foods brings us pleasure and happiness. How many of us, when visiting our favorite restaurant, always order the same thing? We feel confident knowing what we are going to get. I call it the "McDonald's Effect." I know if I order a Quarter Pounder, with cheese no matter where I go, I will get the same meal. It was this success of Ray Kroc's marketing that perfected fast food. In his book, *The Ragamuffin Gospel*, Brendan Manning points out a certain myth in our modern culture and sometimes

even in our churches. The myth goes like this: "On the journey with Jesus I can expect an irreversible, sinless future. Discipleship will be an untarnished success story; life will be an unbroken upward spiral toward holiness". Jesus doesn't promise us an easy, effortless journey in this life of discipleship. He says we're going to have to deny ourselves. And, he says we'll have to follow not ourselves — not our own inclinations and desires — but for him. Living a good Christian life is not as easy as pulling up to the Fast Food Drive up and ordering #2 without cheese. It requires work, dedication, prayer, and devotion. You may think many of us are on a spiritual diet how we seem to take in just enough nourishment to survive. But most of us would not say we are spiritually filled. Jesus Christ promises to give us bread and drink and ties it into our observances of the sacrament of holy communion. "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever, and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

**"Stop Murmuring."** Elijah is running for his life from King Ahab and Jezebel because he told the truth. He was fed by an angel of the Lord for his forty-day flight. This story is context for the third-Sunday-in-a-row conversation between Jesus and the crowd on bread of life. Perhaps, with a sigh, Jesus says: "Stop murmuring." Though what I say may be hard to believe, it is true, it is real. I Am living bread. Eat me and live for ever.

- •What do I believe concerning what looks like bread is more than bread?
- •How does eating this living bread affect my life?
- After sharing in Communion, how can I affect the lives of others?

# RESPECT LIFE

The Solemnity of the Assumption celebrates the Blessed Mother's entrance into heavenly glory. The *Catechism* explains that Mary "was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven, where she already shares in the glory of her Son's Resurrection, anticipating the resurrection of all members of his Body" (CCC, 974). Mary's Assumption into heaven reminds us that life on earth is a pilgrimage to our ultimate destination. We prepare in hope for our own passage into eternal life by the choices we make today. When we choose to love and follow God in our daily lives, we strengthen our relationship with Him, and this relationship is the true meaning of heaven: "To live in heaven is 'to be with Christ" (CCC, 1025 citing St. Ambrose, *In Luc.*,10,121:PL 15 1834A.).

We can see how, throughout her life, the Blessed Mother continually chose to go deeper into her relationship with God. She modeled how to value and respect His precious gift of human life, from the moment of conception to its natural end. In the Annunciation, through her "yes," Mary witnessed to the undeniable humanity of unborn children as she conceived and carried the Christ child in her womb. After the Annunciation, having learned that her cousin Elizabeth was with child, she went in haste to her aid. Our Blessed Mother shows us how the way we live today can prepare us, in hope, to also enter into heavenly glory at the end of our lives. Are we open to God's precious gift of new life? How do we support expectant mothers and parents of young children? Do we prioritize showing our love and care for loved ones who are ill or aging?

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

"Becoming a priest or a man or woman religious is not primarily our own decision.... Rather it is the response to a call and to a call of love." – Pope Francis, Address to Seminarians and Novices, July 6, 2013

The idea of becoming a priest can enter one's heart at any age: in elementary school, high school, college or many years after college. For Ben Baker, it started in 2019 during a spring break trip to the Holy Land with students from the University of Illinois. Baker, whose home parish is St. Joseph in Olney, graduated from the University of Illinois in December 2020 with a bachelor's degree in aero-

space engineering. At that time, he contacted the Diocese of Belleville asking to be accepted into the seminary. There currently are six seminarians in the diocese. At the request of Bishop Michael McGovern, Baker has spent this spring serving St. Joseph in Cobden with Father Uriel Salamanca, who is a missionary priest from Colombia. Baker helps however he is needed at the parish, especially at Mass. In turn, Father Salamanca has been teaching Baker Spanish and Hispanic customs and about his ministry to the Hispanic population in southern Illinois. In mid-May, Baker joined a Christ in the City mission trip to Denver, led by the campus ministry department at Southern Illinois University-Carbondale. They worked with those who are homeless in Denver. "We need to recognize the humanity in every person," Baker says. "Even if you don't know what to do when you encounter someone who is homeless, recognize them. See their humanity." His summer assignment is with his home parish in Olney.
