This weekend we celebrate the Assumption of our Blessed Mother Mary. The doctrine of the Assumption teaches us, "that at the end of her earthly existence, the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken up (assumed), body and soul, into Heaven. That means, therefore, that there are two human bodies we know to be in Heaven with God at this time: the human body of Jesus and that of Mary. The Feast of the Assumption is one of the oldest holy days in the Church, with accounts of celebrations going back to the sixth century. Christians in the East, both Catholic and Orthodox, refer to it as the Feast of the Dormition of the Theotokos, or "the falling asleep of the Mother of God." The earliest printed reference to the belief that Mary's body was assumed into Heaven dates from the fourth century, in a document entitled "The Falling Asleep of the Holy Mother of God." The document is written in the voice of the Apostle John, to whom Christ on the Cross had entrusted the care of His mother, and it recounts the death, laying in the tomb, and Assumption of the Blessed Virgin. Tradition variously places Mary's death at Jerusalem or at Ephesus, where John was living.

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII, exercising papal infallibility, declared in an Apostolic constitution known as the Munificentissimus Deus that it is a dogma of the Church "that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory." As a dogma, the Assumption is a required belief of all Catholics. Anyone who publicly dissents from the dogma, Pope Pius declared. "has fallen away completely from the divine and Catholic Faith." (online resource)

In line with Mary's representation as the new Eve, St Paul refers to Jesus as the new Adam: "just as all men die in Adam, so all are brought to life in Christ." If the first reading referred to the troubled beginning, the birth pangs, so 'the end' will see a responsible son, Jesus, handing over 'the kingdom,' the world renewed and freed from every oppression to the Father. Christ is the first fruit of God's saving action, and after him, salvation is assured to all who follow him. On the feast of the Assumption, if Mary is seen as the new Eve, then she shares intimately in the fruit of the redemption and so is assumed body and soul into Heaven.

- •How can I, like Mary, look after a cousin or friend or neighbor in need of help?

# RESPECT LIFE

The Solemnity of the Assumption celebrates the Blessed Mother's entrance into heavenly glory. The *Catechism* explains that Mary "was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven, where she already shares in the glory of her Son's Resurrection, anticipating the resurrection of all members of his Body" (CCC, 974). Mary's Assumption into heaven reminds us that life on earth is a pilgrimage to our ultimate destination. We prepare in hope for our own passage into eternal life by the choices we make today. When we choose to love and follow God in our daily lives, we strengthen our relationship with Him, and this relationship is the true meaning of heaven: "To live in heaven is 'to be with Christ" (CCC, 1025 citing St. Ambrose, *In Luc.*,10,121:PL 15 1834A.).

We can see how, throughout her life, the Blessed Mother continually chose to go deeper into her relationship with God. She modeled how to value and respect His precious gift of human life, from the moment of conception to its natural end. In the Annunciation, through her "yes," Mary witnessed to the undeniable humanity of unborn children as she conceived and carried the Christ child in her womb. After the Annunciation, having learned that her cousin Elizabeth was with child, she went in haste to her aid. Our Blessed Mother shows us how the way we live today can prepare us, in hope, to also enter into heavenly glory at the end of our lives. Are we open to God's precious gift of new life? How do we support expectant mothers and parents of young children? Do we prioritize showing our love and care for loved ones who are ill or aging?

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.





I'm sorry to overload you with so much information! Please see all of the bullets below for important information.

- FREE sports physicals are on Thursday, August 12 from 5:30-6:30. Softball and baseball players should plan to arrive shortly after their games, and we will get you in. The state has added a lengthy component to the process. I have attached the form for you to print and fill out ahead of time. We will have copies at the school if you are unable to print. Please be sure that you attend with your child and that you both have masks on.
- Child protection is now completely on-line. If you have to complete the initial course, you will then also have to do the refresher course to be DCFS compliant which is a state law. ANY person having contact with students must be child protection compliant before they will be allowed to volunteer. See the attached flyer for the link and directions for the initial training as well as the renewal. Please send a copy of the certificate and the DCFS mandated reporter to the office. If you have any trouble, please don't hesitate to reach out to the office, and we will help get it figured out.
- Monday is the 1st day of school with a 2:00 dismissal. Parents of the younger students may walk them to their classroom for a very brief drop-off on Monday only. Masks are mandatory. For all other students, please drop them off at the gym doors between 7:30-8:00. After 8:00, please drop them off at the school doors on the playground side. The tardy bell is 8:15. I have attached an August lunch menu for your viewing.
- Students should have clean masks daily and refillable water bottles.
- Monday is a uniform day. Remember that K-8 must adhere to the uniform code. Shirts should be tucked in with a belt, and tennis shoes and socks are always good options. The uniform code will be enforced.
