Don't you recognize me?

One week down and counting! We are back in school; the students, teachers, and staff are settling in nicely. All of us were hoping for a smooth reopening and mission accomplished. Last spring, as covid-19 infection rates were dropping, we all anticipated a "back to normal" reopening. I was looking forward to being mitigation-free, mask-free! Unfortunately, it didn't happen. No matter your thoughts concerning masks, vaccines, delta variant, and state and diocesan rules, we have no choice but to follow them. Our goal has not changed; we want to bring the best education, best environment, advance their spirituality, and prepare our students for a rapidly changing world. I want to share a blog composed by one of our neighboring priests that focuses on the present situation. "What if, whenever we felt compelled to criticize the difficult and controversial decisions made by a political/religious leader, we first said (or even simply thought): "I'm glad I'm not faced with the burden of such a responsibility" OR "having to make such a decision must weigh heavily on them"? This would go a long way in building a culture of virtue rather than a culture of polarization and [division],"

"Jesus then said to the Twelve, "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." There is a story about an incident that took place during the Second World War. "Nazis killed some Jews and buried them in a mass grave. One twelve-year-old boy was still alive. He dug his way out of the shallow dirt and went around the neighborhood seeking shelter in homes. The people knew what had happened and when they saw the boy caked with dirt, they hurriedly shut the door in his face. One woman was about to do the same when the boy said: "Lady don't you recognize me? I am the Jesus you Christians say you love." The Lady broke into tears and received the boy into her home." She had made her decision for Christ. We have reasons for faith. In our best moments, we feel there must be an element in reality—an ultimate reality. Like love, faith also knows its dark moments in which we think that God is absent, maybe even "dead." We often hear these days about the need to speak truth to power. But what we find in the passage from the Gospel of John that we read today is the flip side of that. It is power, namely Jesus, speaking truth to the needy, the hungry, the lost, the tentative.

In the first reading from the Book of Joshua, we meet Joshua who had led the people into the Promised Land. Joshua asks them to choose whom they wish to serve: the God of their ancestors or the false gods of the land they now inhabit. He is more concerned with the inner battle of faith rather than his military campaigns.

Joshua knows that all choices have to be renewed, that people do not stay dedicated to a cause just by continuing to exist. Israel Zangwill observed about the Jewish tradition: "We are not the chosen people but the choosing people." Joshua himself makes clear his own choice and leaves them free to make their own. The people too renew their choice: "We too will serve the Lord, for he is our God."

RESPECT LIFE

Rosa* knew from experience the difficulties and expenses of watching a loved one die. She was totally devoted to her husband as he suffered and died from cancer eight years earlier. The idea of high medical bills, "tubes" and pain upset her, and even though she had not viewed her husband as a burden, she feared being one to her family.

Then, Rosa was hospitalized with a terrible urinary tract infection which made her dehydrated, weak and confused. Her daughter Teresa had been appointed as her health care agent. Teresa met with the medical staff, who helped her understand that the proposed treatments would not cause an undue burden to her mother. In fact, they would be temporary and appropriate care in Rosa's situation. Teresa was grateful that the medications, nutrition and hydration that Rosa was given, all through "tubes," cured her infection. Rosa is now as active as she has ever been and realizes that there are certain situations that can't be anticipated when illness comes. It's best not to refuse future care that may turn out to be very welcome.

Human life is good and to be protected. All medical decisions ought to reflect this core belief. Yet black-and-white answers to our questions about end-of-life issues are not always possible, and it can be very difficult to know how to make medical decisions. Each and every human person is distinct and unrepeatable, and each medical situation may be unique. In each set of circumstances we need to judge whether a given treatment will provide real benefit to the patient, without causing harm or other burdens that are out of proportion to the good being done.

We should each be prepared for those difficult situations when medical decisions must be made. We can safeguard our Catholic values by appointing a responsible and trustworthy person now to make decisions for us, in the event that we are incapable of doing so, either physically or mentally. It is important to be aware of the different legal or medical documents that are available or are often used to define a patient's care*

The story of Rosa (her name changed for privacy) is just one example of how important it is to reflect in advance on how we would want decisions made on our behalf if we cannot speak for ourselves. 




