Some of you are aware that I love to cook. On Sunday, to relax, I make an effort to get every dish dirty, so they are stacked to the ceiling! I do like to experiment with different flavors and ingredients. When I was serving as a deacon, the parish was preparing for their summer picnic a few years back. Since no one would step forward to be chairman of the kitchen crew, I took it on. Most of us are familiar with the powdered mashed potatoes common at parish functions and buffets throughout the world! Just add hot water – and it's a miracle you have mashed potatoes. I decided to introduce a new recipe for the mashed potatoes that would taste like real mashed potatoes. The uproar was immediate, "Steve, this isn't how we make mashed potatoes; it will never work. It's not the right way to do it. We've never done it that way before, and I am not going to be part of doing it that way now." I persisted, with much grumbling and head shaking. Success, a massive hit on the buffet line. As many good cooks do, I keep that recipe secretly stored.

The apostle John came up to Jesus one day. "Jesus," he said, "I was walking down the road with the rest of the disciples, and we saw someone casting out demons in your name. We tried to stop him because we didn't know who he was; we tried to stop him because he's not one of us. "Stop him, Lord!" the disciples urge. If it had been today, they might have continued, "Call the legal department! File an injunction! Charge him with copyright violation, patent infringement — anything to block this scoundrel from poaching on our territory!" This is one of those situations that seems made for the phrase "Cooler heads prevailed." The cooler head in question belongs to Jesus. Some people do not claim the Christian faith who nonetheless work for the Lord. We should be attentive to the possibility of the Spirit's presence as we dialogue with others.

In our parishes, communities, schools, and even families, we have seen it before someone tries something new, and they are seen as a threat. We are creatures of habit; we feel comfortable in what we do, how we do it, and who our friends are. How many fantastic family recipes and traditions have been lost because they "go to the grave" with grandma or grandpa? Today, Jesus tells us to change how we think and "look outside the box." Thinking this way puts an end to "in-group/out-group" thinking. It puts an end, to a large degree, to us versus them. What is left for us is a common human experience. We are trying to be human in the same way Jesus was human. What we find in this world that is opposed to that project, Jesus also opposes. But what we see in our world that advances that cause, Jesus is in it.




Sacraments & Preparation


