


Message from Fr. Steve

We see Jesus people-watching, not at a mall, but where those who claim to be religious are gathered. Mark told us a few verses earlier that Jesus was teaching in the temple courts, and what he saw provoked him to say the things we just heard from him in the reading. Today, Jesus quietly observes as the teachers of the law go by — after seeing them, his response is priceless. He sees that many define their religion because they know the religious laws of their group. He considers how they prance around thinking themselves to be necessary, how they recite long prayers and think themselves to be religious. And as Jesus watches, he warns those around him, "Don't be like them!" Many of us have spent countless hours preparing for a career. The duteous study, mid-night oil preparing for exams, and anxiety beyond imagination. When you land that "dream job," some of us are shocked that much of what we have learned is seldom referenced. What is important is our ability to interact and work with each other.

I took my turn standing at the "square" in Red Bud for many years, collecting for the Annual Knights of Columbus Tootsie Roll Drive. The funds collected were given to support persons with intellectual and physical disabilities. The name has changed throughout my forty-two years as a Knight of Columbus, but the giving and charity have continued. To be honest, it was a dangerous prospect at times when a semi-trailer approached and overshadowed you. People were so generous, reaching for their change and dropping into the basket with a smile. Contributors from every walk of life. On some occasions, you would see an older car, usually one of those big, long Buick's approaching. Inside, a petite lady would be barely visible over the steering wheel, "grandma type," franticly trying to find some change to deposit in the basket. (You always had to look out for those drivers, in the frantic search, they sometimes swerved.) Out through the window would emerge this small hand placing coins in the basket. Usually, you would hear, "oh no, sweetie, give that Tootsie

Roll to someone else."

I am often humbled by the generosity of our parish family members. The old cliché, "God will provide," is so true. The Gospel today is, therefore, a strong challenge for all of us. Perhaps we need to be reminded that everything comes from God and that we are just managers of everything we have. Or maybe we are not yet really convinced that God provides and that He can never be outdone in generosity. Are we afraid that God will not do His part of the deal? What do Jesus' words about the woman who gave everything she had to say to us today? Probably Jesus would tell us to stand up for those who are the most vulnerable. He would say to us to speak up for those who have no way to do so for themselves. Jesus would tell us to do all we can in the system to enact laws that protect the helpless and the least and the last.






