Message from Fr. Steve

Here is an interesting story about the American Independence. George III of England, America's enemy in the Revolutionary War, felt terrible about the loss of the colonies. It was said, in fact, that for the rest of his life, he could not say the word "independence" without tripping over it. He was an odd duck in many ways, but he had good insights. When the fighting in America stopped, King George and all his royal cronies in Europe were sure that George Washington would have himself crowned "Emperor of the New World." That's what they would have done. When he was told, on the contrary, that Washington planned to surrender his military commission and return to farming at Mt. Vernon, George III said, "Well, if he does that, he will be the greatest man in the world." There is power in giving up power, in emptying oneself. Jesus knew it, Pilate didn't.

The most visible form of "kingship," for modern society is that of the Queen and King of England. Since the 1950's Queen Elizabeth has held that title. Kings and Queens do not exist today and those that do are remnants and no longer functional. But Kings and Queens do exist in fairy tales and in stories. Indeed, when people were in need and badly off, they always started to tell stories of a king who would reign in such a way that good times would return, everybody would be happy and there would be prosperity and peace. That is so true this year, as many of us had visions of this Christmas being normal and pandemic free. A wish come true, no more mask mandates, travel restrictions, vaccinations, ventilators. This hope is what motivates us to become involved in our political system. We want to elect that person who will serve our needs, bring us the happiness and peace we all desire so much. Unfortunately, no matter who is elected our hopes and dreams and "fairy tales," evaporate and leave us disappointed and sad.

Here is a story that illustrates what is going on in this dialogue between Jesus and Pilate: An simple man was once asked by an enthusiastic young evangelist whether he had been saved, and whether he had accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior? The gentleman replied, "Why do you ask me such a thing? I could tell you anything. Here are the names of my banker, my grocer, and my farm hands. Ask them if I've been saved." Jesus could tell Pilate anything. What is important is what Pilate believes. We believe that Christ is the savior, the king of the universe, the one who came to bring salvation to the world. Let the only "king," you serve be the one who brings us peace, love and healing, Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe.


RESPECT LIFE




Saint Nicholas to Visit St. Mary School Friday, December 3rd.
