2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time, January 16, 2022 Is 62:1-5/1 Cor 12:4-11/Jn 2:1-11

Today the Church begins Ordinary Time. There is nothing ordinary about it! Jesus begins his ministry today with the first public miracle. This miracle at the wedding of Cana wasn't planned; it happened out of necessity. A newlywed couple wants everything to go perfectly. The most significant factor I encounter with couples preparing for marriage is stress, especially the bride—those who have been there knowing exactly how that feels. Like a medical doctor, I write a prescription – a spa day! Take some time, relax, let that stress melt away. The best planning, attention to detail, and pinpointing every problem sometimes don't do the trick. This raging pandemic has caused last-minute cancelations and plenty of unwanted stress. At the marriage at Cana, Mary noticed a problem. She knew how embarrassing it would be for the newlywed couple. She asked her son, Jesus, to intervene. Today, we call it "mom-power," moms have a way of getting their kids to do whatever they want. A classic scene from "A Christmas Story" shows mom convincing a reluctant son Randy to eat by making him pretend to be a pig at a trough. Success! A wedding feast is a joyous time to celebrate a couple beginning a journey together. If all else fails, call on "mom-power!"

The Lord wants to tell us today that life is a feast. A feast? With all its troubles and miseries? Yes, a feast, if we learn to look at it with eyes of faith, if we come to see what makes life beautiful. We all have our daily cares, we may have days of mourning and problems, but the most profound reality is that we are not alone, that we have God, who lets us drink the wine of his love, God who gives us Jesus to lead us to him. Let us drink the wine of joy! Says Isaiah, God delights in his people as a groom delight in his bride. God adorns us with various gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit, Jesus performs his first miracle at the wedding at Cana. Blessings, Father Steve

- Christ is active all the time. What little and big signs of this goodness can I be part of? What signs will I rejoice in?

Christ is Life

Speaking in Rome on December 26, the Feast of the Holy Family , Pope Francis commented on how sad it is when families are seated at table for a meal and instead of dialoguing with one another, each family member is on his or her individual phone speaking with someone elsewhere. Pope Francis encouraged the members of families to put down their cell phones, to share meals, to speak to one another. By listening to one another, we can focus on "you" rather than being absorbed by "I".

As I think about the Holy Father's message, I agree that it can be a challenge to have something so simple as a family meal in which we each dialogue with one another. We need to be more disciplined about the presence and use of our cellular phones which make us instantly available to everyone, yet can distract us from the people we are seated with.

One of the qualities of Jesus I admire is the way Jesus is present to the person standing before him. The person Jesus is with at any moment, is the person who has his full attention. This to me is a reminder of the importance of living in the present moment; not caught up in the past, nor absorbed by speculation about the future. In this new year, I want Jesus to teach me his way of being with people.

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord at the end of the Christmas Season, we see in the gospel accounts Jesus clearly identified by his heavenly Father ("This is my beloved Son") and the presence of the Holy Spirit hovering over the water of the Jordan in the form of a dove. Jesus has a clear vision of his identity, and of his mission, which he loves intensely. He brings that intense love to bear on the people in the gospels (the Rich Young Man, the Widow of Nain, the Man Born Blind and the Woman at the Well to name just a few).

We, too, have received that intense love from the heart of Jesus. The first time we experience ourselves resting in the intense love of Jesus, we are in a time-stopping moment. Jesus is giving me his full attention. What can that lead to? As Pope Francis said at Christmas two years ago:

"Jesus, you are the Child who makes me a child. You love me as I am, not as I imagine myself to be; this I know! In embracing you, the Child of the manger, I once more embrace my life."

Friends, as Jesus gazes upon us with love, let us embrace him in return and with that, embrace once more our own lives as beloved children of God. Life is a gift planned and given to us by a God who loves us as we are, not as we imagine ourselves to be. Let us draw from that embrace of Jesus the courage to put down our cell phones, to share meals, to speak with one another. In embracing Jesus in the year ahead, may we embrace our own lives, forge a deeper unity in our families and grow in our conviction what we are called to protect every human life, so that each person may rest in the embrace of Jesus.




