Second Sunday of Lent Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18/Phil 3:17—4:1 or 3:20—4:1/Lk 9:28b-36

Most of you know I love technology! I can set at the computer for hours and not even realize it. . In our modern, digital world, it's easy to work around the clock: our cell phones are always on and everyone expects their text messages and emails to be answered instantaneously. You might even crawl into bed with your phone, checking out your Facebook updates or playing a game to "wind down." It's safe to say that for most of us, our work and our technology can consume our days and our nights. Citizens of the ancient world saw no such conveniences, of course. They entertained themselves in other ways, usually in groups: true face-to-face fellowship at its finest. Even still, they managed to be distracted from the ways of the Lord. God wants our attention. God wants to be He who consumes your thoughts every day and every night. It might seem impossible; after all, how many of us are living in monastic settings?

The psalmist writes:

But his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night. —Psalm 1:2

He who is close to the Lord is the same one who meditates on holy things night and day. How can that translate for us, in our world, with all of our distractions and responsibilities? As we ready ourselves for Christ's death and resurrection, we should turn ourselves to prayer. Lent is a prime time for investigating God's word, spending time in prayer, and meditating on Scripture. Ask God to help you carve out more time to spend in His holy presence, and He will. Even though you may not lead a monk-like lifestyle, the more we spend time talking to God and (even more importantly) listening to God, the more our thoughts return to Him and His ways. Through regular prayer and reflection on Scripture, we become more like Him and it becomes possible to spend our days and nights

thinking godly things. This Lenten season, I invite you to join me as we dedicate more time to God through quiet times of prayer, meditation, and reflection,—Fr. Steve

Thomas Merton is one of the best known American Catholic writers of the 20th century. A convert to Catholicism, Merton became a Trappist monk at Gethsemane Abbey in Kentucky in 1941. Beginning with the story of his life and conversion, "The Seven Storey Mountain", Merton was a widely read author for the rest of his life and continues to be an influence on Catholic readers today..

Recently I read Merton's essay "Ash Wednesday" which is included in the book "Seasons of Celebration" (Farrar, Straus and Giroux New York, 1965). In the article, Merton writes about Lent as a season in which sorrow and joy go hand in hand. Sorrow is felt and expressed by the catechumens preparing for baptism, as well as by those already baptized when we each examine our lives with their sins and the need for God's forgiveness. Joy comes with the experience of the mercy of God and the realization of God's love for me revealed in the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

At one point in the essay, Merton writes about compunction, that feeling of sorrow over our actions that we realize are wrong. When I hear the word compunction, I think of someone popping an inflated balloon with a pin; compunction opens us up to the reality of what we have done, letting out any illusions we may hold onto about "what I have done or what I have failed to do". Merton continues to explore compunction by turning to the prophet Joel and the passage that is the text for the first reading on Ash Wednesday:

"Yet even now says the Lord, return to me with all you heart, with fasting, with weeping and with mourning. Rend your hearts, not your garments. Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful." (Joel 2:13)

Merton makes a good point: "Rending our garments lets in nothing but the cold." It's only the inner rending of the heart, the tearing open of the heart before the Lord that then the feeling of compunction can lead to joy because it "lets out our sins and lets in the clean air of God's spring; the sunlight of the days that advance toward Easter."

Season of Lent then is a time to bring our hearts and lives before the Lord, honestly and openly. The rending of our hearts is a "tearing away" from our old selves and sins, that we may return to God and taste his mercy. Merton notes that the purpose of Lent is not only the expiation of our sins, but also a preparation to rejoice in God's love. That is my prayer for you, the faithful of southern Illinois and for those preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil. May we each review our lives and bring before the Lord our sins and shortcomings, asking the Lord for the gifts of forgiveness, mercy and peace. Then we will be prepared to receive the mercy and gracious love of God followed by the joy of a blessed communion with God.

I especially encourage all the baptized to meet the Lord and experience his mercy during Lent by participating in the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Penance). Check the schedules for confession at your parish and make a plan to participate. Truly when we bring our sins before the Lord through the ministry of the priest, we can experience what it means to "let out our sins and let in the clean air of God's spring; the sunlight of the days that advance toward Easter."

Have a blessed Season of Lent. In our Lord. Bishop Michael McGovern





Lenten Regulations

Each year the Lord Jesus calls the entire Church to a special season of penance and renewal. As we begin this holy time of Lent, we should reflect on our need for conversion of heart, prayer, charitable works and penance.

The season of Lent extends this year from Ash Wednesday, March 2, to the Mass of the Lord's Supper, April 14, inclusive.

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.
- 2. Everyone 18 years of age


and under 59 years of age is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. The other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but altogether they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the obligation of the law is modified. Because Lent is a special season for all Christians, we should not lightly excuse ourselves from these penitential practices.
- 4. To completely disregard the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
