Third Sunday of Lent Ex 3:1-8a, 13-15/1 Cor 10:1-6, 10-12/Lk 13:1-9

April 2023

Today's Gospel reminds me of a Hollywood movie that I watched in 2001, "Life as a House," starring Hayden Christensen and Kevin Kline. It was one of those movies that fell under the radar, and few have seen. (It has adult content not suitable for all, so beware) The general theme is about a father and son, who didn't get along. After George, the father (Kevin Kline) is diagnosed with terminal cancer, he convinces Sam, his son (Hayden Christensen) to build a house together. George was a successful architect and Sam, was struggling with drug addictions. In my last year in seminary, I completed a theological reflection on this movie and despite some of the content, I found a deep spiritual message buried in this somewhat disturbing Hollywood story.

Jesus tells a parable today, "For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?' When do we give up on someone or something? How far does, "unconditional," love go? That's a story many of us have faced in our lives. Do we just "cut it down," and accept our losses, or do we persevere with the love of God? There is no easy answer. We all know that kid from our neighborhood who always had a smile, was so helpful, and never had a bad word for anyone. Then one day you see his/her name in the paper for a crime. Many crimes involve drug or alcohol abuse. Maybe you or a family member has experienced this personally — you know it's not easy. That's the message Jesus shares through the parable we hear this third Sunday of Lent. Patience, perseverance, unconditional love, and prayer are our weapons. Throughout history, God calls His people to repentance, and renewal to return to him. What is our response? Who will set God's people free?

In "Life as a House," we find Sam, extremely upset with his dad for (forcing) him to build the house. Sam says "I've been using since I was 12! You're all so unbelievably stupid, you know that? You didn't [care] about anything I did up until now! George: Well, I'll apologize for everything but today! Today, [I care]." George continues, "You know the great thing, though, is that change can be so constant you don't even feel the difference until there is one. It can be so slow that you don't even notice that your life is better or worse until it is. Or it can just blow you away, make you something different in an instant. It happened to me. Build this house with me."

Our life is a house, we live it in, add additions, paint it, change it! "He said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not you can cut it down." Blessings and Peace, Father Steve

During the opening days of Lent, there were several events that inspired me, filling me with fresh hope for the life of the Church in southern Illinois. The first was Ash Wednesday; I was at the Cathedral of St. Peter in both the early morning and the evening. I was impressed with the number of people who came to church to be signed with the ashes and begin this holy Season of Lent. I also was encouraged by the range of ages of those present; everyone eager to begin the Lenten journey that leads to the joy of the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.

The second event that inspired me and filled me with fresh hope was the 24 Hours of Mercy offered at the Cathedral on March 4-5. Sixteen priests were available over the course of 24 hours in the Cathedral chapel for the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Penance). I estimate that close to 300 people came to the Cathedral during those 24 hours to pray before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and to meet the Lord in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and receive his mercy through the ministry of a priest. It was very edifying to see people of different ages coming to meet the Lord and experience Christ's mercy and compassion.

I was also glad that the 16 priests and I were offering this opportunity together; it is so important, I think, for priests to engage in ministry cooperating with our brother priests. While many of our priests may be the sole priest assigned to their parish, active collaboration and cooperation among the clergy is a way to help strengthen and build up a presbyterate. I publicly thank all the priests who assisted with the 24 Hours of Mercy; thank you for all you did to be available for the people.

Kurt Stasiak, OSB, currently serves as the Arch Abbott of St. Meinrad Archabbey in Indiana. Twenty years ago, Father Stasiak wrote a helpful guide to hearing confessions: A Confessor's Handbook. Father Stasiak writes: "Celebrating the sacrament of reconciliation can be a significant and personal experience for both penitent and priest. And for both penitent and priest, the celebration of the sacrament can be demanding. The demands made upon the penitent need no extensive commentary: humility, courage, determination, and trust are those which immediately come to mind."


And what demands are made upon the priest who acts as confessor? Stasiak notes: "In celebrating this sacrament, perhaps more than in any other exercise of their ministry, priests want to be Christ-like. They want to 'put on the mind of Christ,' as Saint Paul says, and offer the compassion and understanding Christ offered. In this sacrament above all, priests want to be effective stewards of the Lord's grace. They want to be true 'ambassador of peace'." In reflecting on the 24 Hours of Mercy, I am grateful to God for the faith of those who came to participate in making a confession and those priests who offered this very important ministry at all hours. God bless you all!

Finally, the third event that inspired me and filled me with hope was the Rite of Election on Sunday, March 6. Traditionally, the catechumens preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil come to the cathedral on the First Sunday of Lent to be presented to the bishop who then elects them or chooses them to proceed to initiation as a Catholic through the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and the Eucharist at Easter. After two years of concerns over Covid, it was a welcome sight to see the faces of both children and adults who are preparing for baptism on April 16. We were also joined by dozens of baptized Christians who are seeking full communion in the Catholic faith, accompanied by their sponsors, family members and clergy. It was a joyful afternoon to see people, often with other family members, coming to faith in Jesus Christ and wanting to live as a Catholic disciple of the Lord.

What are the signs of life that are filling you with fresh hope so far in the Lenten journey? I invite you to look closely at what the

Lord is doing in your life and in your days, explore what God is trying to say to you or show you. When I think about the opening days of Lent 2022, I believe the Lord was showing me that our Catholic faith continues to be vibrant and alive here in southern Illinois. I thank God for those days and the people who filled them; may the Lord continue to give reasons for hope in the coming weeks, as we hear the Lord declare to each of us once again: Follow me.





RESPECT LIFE CORNER

"We often hear that the government nor anyone else should tell a woman what to do with her body. However, our government routinely enacts laws which prevent people from doing certain actions both to their own bodies and other peoples' bodies. The rescued must also rescue. The saved must also save. We cannot turn to God for mercy and be deaf to the cries of others for mercy. One of the three key Lenten activities is "almsgiving," because it symbolizes this basic truth about living our faith all year long. We are not allowed simply to look at God and thank him for rescuing us, individually. We are, rather, to let our gratitude become service, directed at rescuing others. This is the fruit of which Jesus speaks in the Gospel passage; this is the repentance he seeks of us.



Lenten Regulations


Each year the Lord Jesus calls the entire Church to a special season of penance and renewal. As we begin this holy time of Lent, we should reflect on our need for conversion of heart, prayer, charitable works and penance.

The season of Lent extends this year from Ash Wednesday, March 2, to the Mass of the Lord's Supper, April 14, inclusive.

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.
- 2. Everyone 18 years of age

and under 59 years of age is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. The other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but altogether they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the obligation of the law is modified. Because Lent is a special season for all Christians, we should not lightly excuse ourselves from these penitential practices.
- 4. To completely disregard the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.






Ukraine




