

He is Alpha and Omega!





RESPECT LIFE CORNER

Life is Victorious!

"Jesus Christ our King is Risen! Sound the trumpet of salvation!" (Easter Exsultet). Today is the Feast of Feasts, the foundation of all that we celebrate in our faith. By rising from the dead, Jesus did not only conquer his death; he conquered ours. He overturned the entire kingdom of death! He has opened the way to the true destiny of the human person: to be on the throne of God forever, in life that knows no end!

Because of this, we are the People of Life. We seek to apply the victory of Jesus over death to the problems of our day. We are a pro-life people, and reject the false solutions of abortion and euthanasia. Rather, we say yes to every life, no matter how vulnerable or burdensome. It is an Easter yes; it is a yes filled with hope. This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad!



Believing in Risen Life. After his death and burial, the apostles saw the risen Jesus. They talked with him. They touched him. They ate with him. These things are not done with the dead. They knew he was alive. We believe this still today because we experience his presence in many ways.

- •How do I see the risen Lord's activity still happening today?
- •How can I foster belief in the risen Lord by what I say and do?
- •How does this belief change my life, my attitudes, my priorities?

A New Tife

"But now the power of Easter has burst upon us with the resurrection of Christ. Now we find in ourselves a strength which is not our own, and which is freely given to us whenever we need it..." Thomas Merton, "Easter: The New Life", 1959

These words from Thomas Merton, the Catholic monk and writer, give me fresh hope as we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ at Easter 2022. There is so much in our world that can make us individually and collectively feel powerless, beginning for example with the invasion of Ukraine by Russia. Yet when I consider situations where I might feel powerless in solving a problem, or reconciling people who are in conflict, or motivating people to make a fresh start in living our Catholic faith, I realize that there is a power in the cross and resurrection of Jesus that is given to us, a power greater than ourselves . "Now we find in ourselves a strength which is not our own, and which is freely given to us whenever we need it..." Or as St. Paul declared in his letter to the Philippians: "I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength." (Philippians 4:13)

Perhaps the sense of powerlessness we experience most acutely is when we face the loss of a loved one, or when we face our own mortality during a health crisis. Like the women who returned to the tomb of Jesus on the first day of the week, we may feel helpless and powerless. I think of Mary Magdalene standing before the tomb, seeing the large stone had been rolled away and that the tomb was empty. Mary's reaction was shock, she imagined that someone had broken into the tomb and stolen the corpse of Jesus. At first Magdalene did not realize that "now the power of Easter has burst upon us with the resurrection of Christ." It was not that someone had broken into the tomb; rather, Jesus Christ had broken out of the tomb, broken out of the finality of death and he wants us to break out with him.

I think Merton's use of the word "burst" is perfect in describing how the resurrection is revealed to us. When I think of times in my life when I had good news to share with a family member or friends, I literally felt I was bursting with good news. The same is true for us as Christians who have met the risen Lord and now are his witnesses; we should eagerly share with others the good news that God's love is stronger than death.

Easter is the hour of our deliverance. As God led Israel out of slavery in Egypt, Jesus Christ leads humanity out of captivity to sin and death through his cross and resurrection; he offers us a share in a new way of living. We pray for the victims of the war in Ukraine, that they experience the strength that comes from our risen Lord, a strength that is greater than anything we could ask for or imagine. May the strength that comes from Christ's victory fill us at Easter and give us fresh hope as we go about the work of transforming our world, that all people can share in this new life forever.




