





A blessed Easter Season!

As I am writing this column just after Easter, I am reflecting on Holy Week 2022. There were several moments that made an impression on me that I would like to share with you. All of the events I mention took place at the Cathedral of St. Peter in Belleville.

Palm Sunday was very moving as we read the account of Christ's Passion from Luke's gospel. I always listen especially for the dialogue between Jesus and the Good Thief. The Good Thief comes to faith in the final moments of his life on earth: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Notice that this is the one time in Luke's gospel when Jesus is invoked by name using direct discourse. We too are invited to call upon Jesus by name with faith.

Holy Thursday we celebrated the Mass of the Lord's Supper. We were able to perform the washing of the feet after the homily this year; I was glad that we did not have to forgo that ritual again this year due to Covid concerns. That action during the liturgy helps us recall the Lord Jesus kneeling down and washing the feet of his apostles during the Last Supper. It is very humbling to think of Jesus washing the feet of the apostles, and, in a very real sense, how the Lord washes our feet too. Jesus is willing to wash our feet many times in life. As we gratefully ponder the Lord's selfemptying love, we realize that we are meant to imitate his action of seeking the lowest place and washing the feet of others.

Good Friday's Liturgy of the Lord's Passion consists of four movements: the Liturgy of the Word including the Passion from John's gospel; the Intercessions; the Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion. The Veneration of the Cross is a moment for us to reflect on how the Lord offered his life for the forgiveness of our sins. While I watched hundreds of people come forward to venerate the cross in the cathedral, I reflected on the thought that when Jesus was dving on the cross, it wasn't the nails that held him there, rather it was love that kept him there. Love for God the Father and love for us.

The Easter Vigil was a beautiful celebration at our cathedral. The lighting and blessing of the Easter fire outside the church was a powerful sign of the resurrection of Christ, the light of the world. We then lit the Paschal candle with the Easter fire, carrying the candle into the darkened church. It was wonderful to see the people streaming into the cathedral, following the candle, extending the candles they were holding to receive the light of Christ. I was so pleased to see the number of people who came into the church for the liturgy. It was a particular joy to baptize

a young woman named Carissa. Pouring three pitchers of holy water over Carissa's head, I spoke the words: Carissa, I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. May Carissa continue living her faith in Jesus Christ and may all who have been baptized live as a new creation, sharing in the victory of Jesus Christ.
