FIFTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Deuteronomy 30:10-14 - Colossians 1:15-20 - Luke:10:25-37


There has been a funny message circulating social media the last few weeks. It says, "after I die and they bury me, I want someone to send a text from my phone that says, THANKS FOR COMING!" I don't know about you but that would be pretty shocking, even for just a moment. Saying thank you is something we are so accustomed to doing. Thank you for holding the door, a blessing after a sneeze, a great meal, fantastic gift, or just being nice. The list can go on and on. In many cases we go about our day to day activities, saying it maybe 100 times. Whatever we are thankful for, in most cases we really mean it from the bottom of our hearts.

Have you heard the story about the elderly woman who lived in a small town in East Texas... who had car trouble on the way to the supermarket one morning? Her car stalled at a stop sign... she tried everything to get her car started again, but no luck. Suddenly, a man in a pick-up truck came up behind her and with obvious agitation he started honking his horn at her impatiently. She doubled her efforts to get her car going. She pumped the gas, turned the ignition, but still no luck... the man in the pick-up truck continued to honk his horn constantly and loudly. I love what the elderly woman did. Very calmly she got out of her car, walked back to the pick-up and motioned for the man to lower his window and then politely she said: "I'll make a deal with you. If you will start my car for me I'll be happy to honk your horn for you!"

Now, that is what you call "Rising to the occasion!" and that is precisely what Jesus did. The lawyer was "testing" Jesus... honking his horn loudly. He was trying to trap Jesus and trip Him up with a loaded question... but Jesus (as He so often did) rose to the occasion and passed the test with flying colors... and in so doing... He reminded the people back then (and us today) of what is the main precept of our faith. Thankfulness, is a great place to start when it comes to love of each other. Jesus text us today, and asks can we love like he loves, can we follow his law and word? Fr. Steve

The feast of Saints Anne and Joachim is celebrated on July 26. As the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary, they were also the grandparents of Jesus. Although there isn't much historically verifiable information about their story, what we gain from custom and tradition can provide inspiration. Tradition holds that Anne and Joachim struggled with infertility for much of their marriage and were barren for many years. It is thought by some that they were treated poorly by their neighbors and that their childlessness prevented them from fully participating in the life of the community. As the story goes, despite long years of grief, Anne and Joachim continued to place their trust in God. In depths of such sorrow, Joachim went into the wilderness to fast and pray for a child. During this time an angel appeared to both he and Anne, promising that they would give birth to a child, despite their old age, who would be known throughout the world.

Today, many married couples also bear the cross of infertility. They often feel deep grief at their inability to welcome a child into their family. Yet each couple is called, like Anne and Joachim, to continue to place their trust in God and His plan for their family. We pray for all married couples who so deeply long to welcome a child into their home. May God hear their prayers, console their hearts, and guide them on the path of peace.




Luke 10:37

Update on the Synod 28 June 2022

Dear Friends in Christ,

As the Diocese of Belleville concludes the synod process in our local church and submits a written synthesis of the meetings for use in the next phase of the synod process, I thought I would share with you in several installments an update of the synod. Today I would simply like to share with you some reflections on the synod experience.

As you know, we opened the Synod process in the Diocese of Belleville on October 17, 2021. This followed several months of an introduction to synodality and a call for frequent prayer to the Holy Spirit, asking the Spirit's assistance in the process. Over the course of months, the People of God in southern Illinois participated in the Synod in a variety of ways, including: parish gatherings, gatherings in religious communities, and on-line participation.

The initial efforts took more time than expected, requiring more information about what is a synod and what is the goal of the synod. We also learned that we had to create mechanisms for the people to participate, communicating the different options people had for live participation in their area. We also realized that concerns about the COVID pandemic gave many people pause about gathering in person, so electronic methods of contributing were important.

There was a palpable intensification of the Synod once we arrived at Ash Wednesday. More parishes began their in-person meetings during Lent and sessions were held both during the day and in the evening. Prayers for the Synod continued throughout these months, especially during the Universal Prayers in parish liturgies.

I had requested that the participants also consider commenting on the person of Jesus Christ in their lives and what the Lord means to them. This led to some very deep, beautiful spiritual sharing about the importance of life with Christ, that preceded further conversation about journeying together with the Lord and with the community of the Church.

We learned over the course of the months that our people were eager to share their faith in Jesus in the sharing format used for the Synod. People were also willing to openly share their hopes for the Catholic Church in the future. All of this took place in an atmosphere of prayerful reflection and respect for the people gathered at each session, respect for the clergy and for the hierarchy.


Some insights about the process include the clear realization that the more often we exercise synodality, the more comfortable we will become with the idea and the process. Another insight is that we need ways of continuing to communicate with the People of God the future direction of the Synod up to and including the meeting in Rome in October of 2024.

These are some simple insights about the synodal experience in the Diocese of Belleville. Next week, we will focus on the fruits of the discussion and the discernment.

Please remember to keep Pope Francis and the Synod in your prayers in the months ahead.

The Office of Diaconate Formation of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Belleville is beginning a new cycle of recruitment and preparation of men for the Permanent Diaconate. Formation of the new class for ordination in 2028 will begin with a retreat in August of 2023 to start a period of aspirancy. The initial selection process for this class will begin with a series of "Come and See" events at various parishes around the diocese August through November 2022. You need only to attend one of the Come and See, gatherings.

Potential applicants should review the schedule above for the locations and dates of these events to take advantage of the opportunity to attend and learn more about the permanent diaconate and the formation program. Applicants must be baptized Catholic men between the ages of thirty and sixty (at the time the formation program begins), active in the parish, and recommended by their pastors. 
