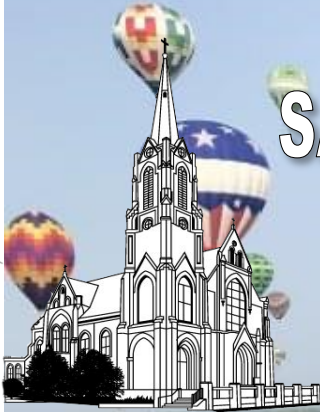

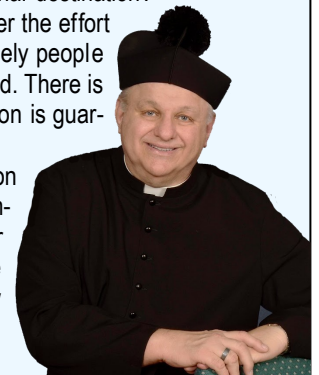
TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

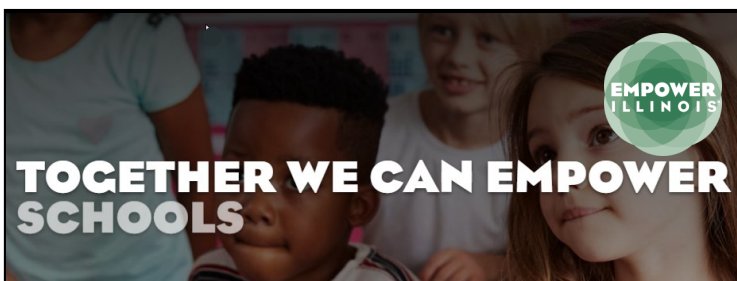
Have you ever been among the great crowd moving toward the entrance of Busch Stadium to see a Cardinal Game? At first the entrance seems wide and open to all, but once you begin seriously pushing and struggling to go in, you discover that the gate is not wide at all. The broad gate narrows down to a place where you enter one by one, and the guard says, "Hold your own ticket, please." So, Jesus describes the door to the Kingdom. It begins wide and open to all – but then comes the struggle to go through the narrow door: one at a time and hold your own ticket.

Venerable Bishop Fulton J. Sheen tells us that we will have three surprises in Heaven. The first surprise: We will be surprised to see that many people we expected to be in Heaven are not there. St. John of the Cross gives the reason why they are not there: "At the evening of our life, we shall be judged on how we have loved." The second surprise: We will be surprised to see that the people we never expected to be in Heaven are there. That is because God judges man's intentions and rewards them accordingly. The third surprise: We will be surprised to see that we are in Heaven! Since our getting to Heaven is principally God's work, we should be surprised that God somehow "went out of His way" to save us, simply because we showed the good will and generosity to cooperate with His grace. In today's Gospel, Jesus answers the question, who will be saved, when and how.

The key idea of St. Luke's gospel is a symbol of Christian life: a pilgrimage to our heavenly home. We are constantly on the way to the heavenly home. We must make sure that we are on the right way and that we are moving in the right direction. Will everyone reach their final destination? Will everyone who journeys be saved? Jesus never answers the question about the number to be saved. He stresses rather the effort to be made on the journey and that the way is narrow and not easy. Secondly, Jesus speaks about the closed door, namely people cannot take for granted that just because they are along the way, just because of set rituals and practices, they will be saved. There is nothing that definitely guarantees automatic salvation. There are neither reserved places nor favored people whose salvation is guaranteed. Yet, on the other hand, no one is excluded from heaven.

God has no favorites because everyone is a favorite of God! Heaven will be full of surprises. Many who are despised on earth will find themselves in heaven and many who considered themselves holy and better than others, may not find themselves among the chosen ones in heaven. The Jews had considered themselves the chosen ones of God and that their God was only the God of Israel. Jesus reminds them that many pagans and prostitutes will enter the kingdom of God, while many of the Jews who rejected God and his chosen Messiah, will be excluded from God's kingdom. "Those who are now last will be the first, and those who are now first will be the last."

Married Love and the Gift of Life

Married Love and the Gift of Life Getting married. What a blessed and hope-filled time. Men and women considering marriage yearn for certain things. They want to be accepted unconditionally by each other. They want their marriage to be filled with love and happiness. They want a family. The desire and ability of a man and woman to form a lasting bond of love and life in marriage is written into their nature. In the Rite of Marriage a man and woman are asked if they will love one another faithfully and totally—in short, if they will love as God loves. "Have you come here freely and without reservation to give yourselves to each other in marriage?" asks the bishop, priest, or deacon. "Will you love and honor each other as man and wife for the rest of your lives?"

Will you accept children lovingly from God, and bring them up according to the law of Christ and his Church?" These are different ways of asking the same basic question: Are you ready to accept this person, and all that may come from your union, completely? What does the Church teach about married love? Marriage is more than a civil contract; it is a lifelong covenant of love between a man and a woman. A husband and wife express their committed love not only with words, but with the language of their bodies.

So the question about contraception is this: Does using contraception faithfully affirm this committed love? Or does it introduce a false note into this conversation. Part of God's gift to a husband and wife is this ability in and through their love to cooperate with God's creative power. Therefore, the mutual gift of fertility is an integral part of the bonding power of marriage. That power to create a new life with God is at the heart of what spouses share with each.



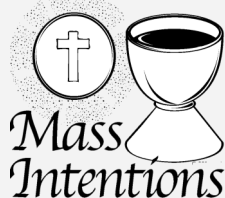
21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

UNITED STATES CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS REPENT AND BELIEVE IN THE GOSPEL

Christ began his public ministry by calling people to repentance and conversion: Repent, and believe in the gospel (Mk 1:15; cf. Mt 4:17). It is thus fitting that, at the beginning of every Mass, we are invited to acknowledge our sins in order to prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries. We confess that we have sinned, and we implore the Lord's mercy. This is necessary since we are all sinners and sometimes fail to live up to our vocation as disciples of Jesus and to the promises of our Baptism. We need continually to heed Christ's call to conversion. We trust in his mercy, the mercy that we behold in his body broken for us and his blood poured out for us for the forgiveness of our sins.

We are to approach the Lord with humble and contrite hearts and to say with sincerity: "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." 45. While all our failures to do what is right damage our communion with God and with each other, they fall into different categories, reflecting different degrees of severity. This brings us to the distinction between venial and mortal sins. Venial sins are those sins and everyday faults that, although they reflect a degree of selfishness, do not break the covenant with God. They do not deprive the sinner of friendship with God or of sanctifying grace. Venial sins are not to be taken lightly, but they do not destroy communion because they do not destroy the principle of divine life in us. Indeed, reception of the Eucharist strengthens our charity and wipes away venial sins, while also helping us to avoid more serious sins.

Pope Francis brought attention to this medicinal character of the Eucharist when he pointed out that it "is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak. He also warns us against the Pelagian error of forgetting our constant need for grace and thinking that living a holy life depends on our own force of will. There are some sins, however, that do rupture the communion we share with God and the Church, and that cause grave offense to human dignity. These are referred to as grave, or mortal, sins (see 1 Jn 5:16-17). One commits a mortal sin by freely, knowingly, and willingly choosing to do something that involves grave matter and that is opposed to charity, opposed to love of God and neighbor.

One is not to celebrate Mass or receive Holy Communion in the state of mortal sin without having sought the Sacrament of Reconciliation and received absolution. As the Church has consistently taught, a person who receives Holy Communion while in a state of mortal sin not only does not receive the grace that the sacrament conveys; he or she commits the sin of sacrilege by failing to show the reverence due to the sacred Body and Blood of Christ. St. Paul warns us that whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body. Catechism of the Catholic Church, nos. 1394 and 1395, citing Council of Trent: The Eucharist "is a remedy to free us from our daily faults and to preserve us from mortal. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself (1 Cor 11:27-29).

Deacon Candidate Dan Laquet Finishes Homiletics Week

St. Mary Deacon Candidate Dan Laquet has completed an important step towards being called to Ordination as a Permanent Deacon. Dan, along with his classmates attended a week long Homiletics Class, at St. Meinrad Seminary and School of Theology. During the week-long, class, the candidates were required to present five homilies, including one "emergency" homily with only one hour preparation.

If called to Holy Orders by Bishop McGovern, Dan will be ordained on Saturday, June 3, 2023 at the Cathedral of St. Peter, in Belleville
