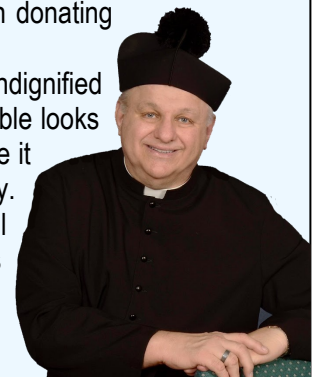

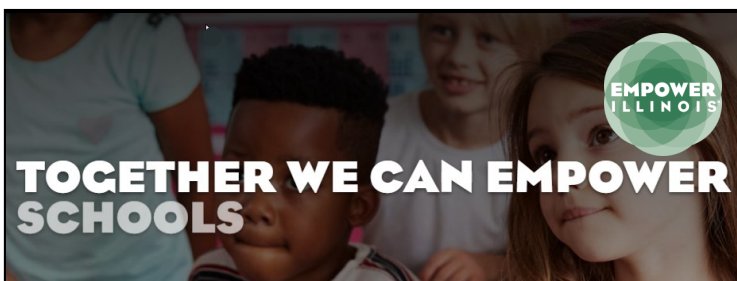
TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

A truly humble person is hard to find, yet God delights to honor such selfless people. Have you ever heard the story about the great educator, Booker T. Washington? The renowned black educator, was an outstanding example of this truth. Shortly after he took over the presidency of Tuskegee Institute in Alabama, he was walking in an exclusive section of town when he was stopped by a wealthy white woman. Not knowing the famous Mr. Washington by sight, she asked if he would like to earn a few dollars by chopping wood for her. Because he had no pressing business at the moment, Professor Washington smiled, rolled up his sleeves, and proceeded to do the humble chore she had requested. When he was finished, he carried the logs into the house and stacked them by the fireplace. A little girl recognized him and later revealed his identity to the lady.

The next morning the embarrassed woman went to see Mr. Washington in his office at the Institute and apologized profusely. "It's perfectly all right, Madam," he replied. "Occasionally I enjoy a little manual labor. Besides, it's always a delight to do something for a friend." She shook his hand warmly and assured him that his meek and gracious attitude had endeared him and his work to her heart. Not long afterward she showed her admiration by persuading some wealthy acquaintances to join her in donating thousands of dollars to the Tuskegee Institute.

In today's Gospel Jesus is at a meal in the house of one of the leading Pharisees. He notices the undignified scramble for the places of honor and is moved to comment on what he sees through a parable. The parable looks like a bit of prudential advice on how to behave at a dinner party so as to avoid embarrassment. But since it is a parable one need not take it at face value, as a piece of worldly wisdom or even as a lesson in humility. It deals rather with an aspect of one's relationship with God. God in the person of Jesus Christ is inviting all peoples to the feast. Our acceptance at the heavenly banquet will depend not on our merit or good deeds but on our acceptance of others now. Humility in a Christian sense is not a purely passive virtue; like faith, to which it is closely akin, it is highly active.

The Imperative to Respect Human Life

Stem cell research has captured the imagination of many in our society. Stem cells are relatively unspecialized cells that, when they divide, can replicate themselves and also produce a variety of more specialized cells. Scientists hope these biological building blocks can be directed to produce many types of cells to repair the human body, cure disease, and alleviate suffering. Stem cells from adult tissues, umbilical cord blood, and placenta (often loosely called "adult stem cells") can be obtained without harm to the donor and without any ethical problem, and these have already demonstrated great medical promise.

But some scientists are most intrigued by stem cells obtained by destroying an embryonic human being in the first week or so of development. Harvesting these "embryonic stem cells" involves the deliberate killing of innocent human beings, a gravely immoral act. Yet some try to justify it by appealing to a hoped-for future benefit to others.

The Catholic Church "appreciates and encourages the progress of the biomedical sciences which open up unprecedented therapeutic prospects" (Pope Benedict XVI, Address of January 31, 2008). At the same time, it affirms that true service to humanity begins with respect for each and every human life. Because life is our first and most basic gift from an infinitely loving God, it deserves our utmost respect and protection. Direct attacks on innocent human life are always gravely wrong.



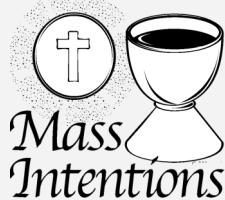
22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

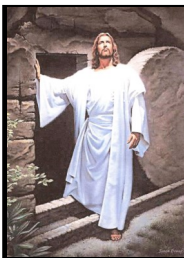

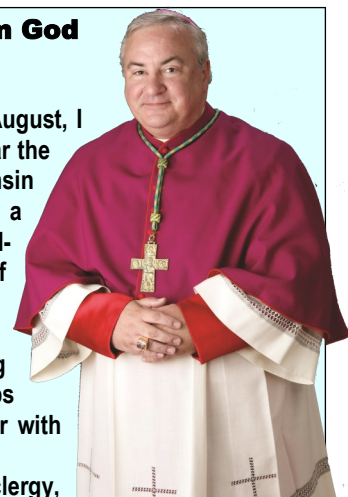

Be Still and Know That I Am God 18 August 2022

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we move into the second half of August, I am preparing to go on retreat. Every year the bishops of Illinois, Indiana and Wisconsin take five days in late August to make a retreat together. The timing does not always fit everyone's schedule but 90% of the bishops are normally present. I am looking forward to five days of spiritual talks by a Passionist priest, celebrating the Eucharist with my brother bishops and spending more time in quiet prayer with the Lord Jesus in the Eucharist.



Retreats are important for everyone: clergy, consecrated religious, lay women and men. Retreats have become very popular with young Catholics, which I think is terrific. We lead such busy and loud lives, it is vital for our spiritual life to step away from the routine, the phone and the computer and give God permission to speak to our listening hearts without the distractions we all face on a daily basis.

Three key aspects of a retreat are: thanksgiving, reflection and resolution. I try to begin a retreat with a Litany of Praise or Thanksgiving; simply bringing before the Lord all the blessings he has bestowed that I am grateful for. During each day, I try to reflect on what the Lord has done in my life since my last retreat. Where was I a year ago in my life with God, my family, my friends, and the many priests and people of our diocese? What events have shaped my life since then?

One event I will spend some time reflecting on is the passing of Father Richard Thibodeau, a Redemptorist priest. Father Richard was my Spiritual Director for four years when I was a priest in Chicago and he directed me on a five day retreat in preparation for my ordination as a bishop in 2020. Father Richard passed away in January; I will definitely spend time on retreat thanking God for Father Richard and all the good he did for me as a spiritual father.

Then in the final two days of the retreat, I attempt to formulate two or three resolutions that I will attempt to keep going forward in my life. St. Ignatius of Loyola provides three questions that can help formulate the resolutions: What have I done for Christ? What am I doing for Christ? What will I do for Christ? That third question is a good one; as you sort through different possibilities and focus on one particular thing you resolve to do for the Lord.

I'm a big believer that God gives us graces during a retreat and that sometimes it is on the final day of the retreat that God lovingly bestows a particular grace that lifts us up. A spiritual director once advised: "When you go back home after the retreat, try to keep the graces you received fresh." In other words, keep your prayer life steady and recall what the Lord said and did during the retreat.

Please keep me in your prayers next week while I am on retreat. Please know I will keep all of you, the clergy and faithful of southern Illinois, in my heart in a special way. May Jesus lead each one of us closer to him.
