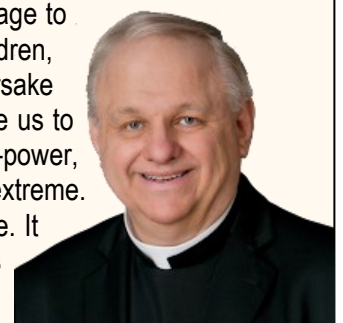

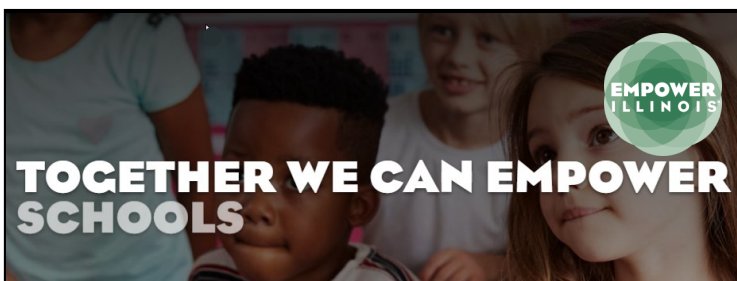
TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

We sometimes wonder why we did a particular action or what made us say things we later regretted. There are also times we question the wisdom of God when we can't figure out some happenings in our lives. In life everything has a price tag, nothing is free. It is not easy to make wise decisions, we need God's help. What price have we paid for being a disciple? Have we pondered over it? Have a discerning weekend contemplating the cost of faith!

In Luke's Gospel Jesus speaks of the cost of discipleship and dedication needed to follow Him. Jesus presented two parables. He compared the Christian life to a building project and to warfare. Jesus pointed out that before someone wants to build a tower, he sits down and calculates the cost. If he does not have the resources to finish the tower, in all wisdom, he does not begin the project. Otherwise the project will end before it is completed and he will look foolish. So it is with disciples! In the second parable Jesus points to a king going to battle against an enemy far superior to him, who must calculate wisely the consequences. He must carefully consider his chances of winning. If the risk is too high, he must surrender unconditionally or else all will be lost. Jesus points out that so it is with Christian discipleship. We have to make wise choices. We cannot serve two masters. We have to be totally dedicated or else we will fall by the wayside.

The choices we make are absolute, we cannot be lukewarm or half hearted. Jesus uses strong language to highlight the cost of discipleship: "If a man comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife, children, brothers and sisters, yes, his own life too, he cannot be my disciple." A true disciple must be ready to forsake all to follow Jesus, he has to commit himself to a life of self-renunciation. True wisdom alone can guide us to this detachment from all to be attached to God alone. This is not accomplished by will power but by God-power, the power of the Holy Spirit. The demands that Jesus makes upon those who would follow him are extreme. Christianity is not a Sunday morning religion. It is a hungering after God to the point of death if need be. It shakes our foundations, topples our priorities, pits us against friend and family, and makes us strangers in this world.

Our property had three magnificent oaks, each more than a hundred, maybe a 150 years old. One died after a long decline, and we finally had it taken down. It was so large that I couldn't reach my arms around it. So lofty it could easily be seen across the street or around the block. It was home to squirrels and a way station for woodpeckers and mourning doves, blue jays and mockingbirds. Even the occasional ill-tempered crow.

My tree was born when this land was a woodland escape for city dwellers. Its green sprout may have seen soldiers who had fought in the Civil War. As a sapling, it certainly saw veterans of the Spanish-American War. It looked down upon the first horseless carriages, and looked up to see the first airplanes buzzing overhead.

My aged sentry witnessed births and probably deaths, joy and sadness. It watched generations of homeowners rake its fallen leaves in autumn, and rejoice at its first buds in spring. My oak provided cool shade during hot, sticky summers, and stoically bore the occasional snow fall that would edge its dark branches.

It was time to say goodbye to my humbled giant. That tree and I, we have each done our duty. We've fulfilled our given roles with diligence, and honored our commitments.

We have done our best to comfort and support those who depended on us, providing hospitality to those who passed our way. We witnessed not just the changing of seasons, but the changing of eras. I look back on all that I have seen and experienced in my family and my work. The children are gone now, finding their own way. Yet we can only be responsible for our time and our place. Somewhere, perhaps nearby, a new oak is taking root, a sapling growing stronger each day. It grows heavenward, and in its time it will see new seasons and new eras.

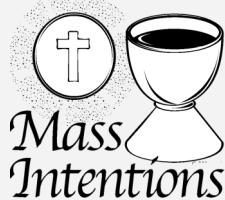
23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

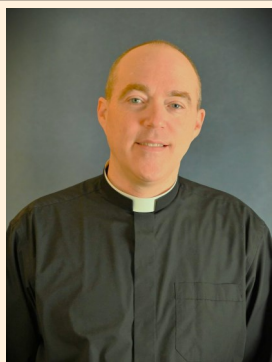

St Mary and St. Lawrence Parishes are happy to welcome, Belleville Seminarian Robert Dodson. Rob, is attending seminary at Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology, Hales Corners, WI. He will be living at the Parish during the upcoming year, as he completes his Pastoral Year.

Below is a message from Robert.

Greetings all! I pray this message finds you well. My name is Robby Dodson. I am a Theology II seminarian assigned to St. Mary and St. Lawrence parishes for this academic year (2022-23).

To start, I am what is called a second-career vocation. Traditionally, a man will enter seminary to begin studies for the priesthood when he is in his 20s. Well, I was in my 20's twenty years ago! No worries about this, however, as I will be able to bring many valuable life experiences to the Church and still have 25 plus years to serve the diocese. As things stand currently, I have three more years of seminary studies to complete before I would be, God-willing, ordained a priest. I am enrolled at Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology in Hales Corners, WI, which is located just outside of Milwaukee. (The same place that Fr. Steve attended seminary!) I have already completed three years of pre-theology/theology coursework and look forward to completing my M.Div./M.A. in 2026.

I attended high school and college down in the state of Georgia. Shortly after graduating from the University of Georgia, I obtained a job working in St. Louis to be closer to my family. I obtained an M.B.A. from Lindenwood University and have held various management positions in the retail and financial services sectors. I was also a member of the U.S. Army Reserves, serving as a psychological operations soldier. I was deployed to forward positions in both Iraq and Afghanistan. My nickname was "tank." (Ask me and I'll tell you why!)

I am an avid sports fan. I enjoy cooking. And I love reading theology and philosophy books. The 2019 Stanley Cup run by the St. Louis Blues and the 2011 World Series Championship won by the St. Louis Cardinals are two sports seasons I will never forget! I also love to follow the Georgia Bulldogs college football team. (We are the reigning National Champions!) But, for me, even more fulfilling than sharing in the victories of my beloved sports teams, preparing and sharing a great meal, or reading an interesting book is the peace and joy that comes from growing in the Catholic faith. I thought that maybe I would share all of these joys with a family of my own, however, a marriage never seemed to be in the cards. But I am quite thankful that the Good Lord Jesus has led me to follow more closely in his footsteps. You see, Christ's bride is holy Church, and his family is made up of all the faithful. Dear Friends in Christ,

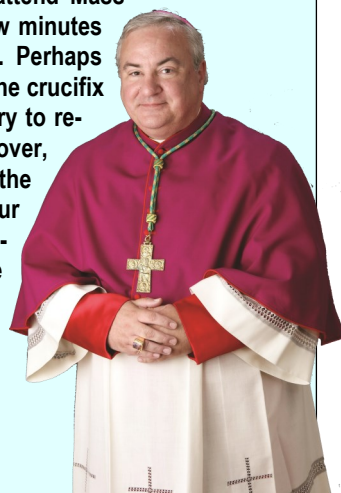
Recently in moving from the bishop's residence to the rectory of the Cathedral of St. Peter, I spent a few moments looking at a crucifix. This particular crucifix is made of wood and is light weight. There is nothing noteworthy about the design or the materials. Yet of all the things I own, it is one of the most important objects I possess.

You see, I purchased the crucifix from a religious good store in Chicago in August, 1990. I wanted a crucifix to place on the wall over my bed when I entered Mundelein Seminary and it has been over my bed ever since, in every place I have lived. Things like clothing, furniture and appliances have come and gone, but that simple crucifix remains and now has a new home in my room at the cathedral.

St. Bruno, who was a monk in the tenth century, wrote that the cross of Jesus is "the still point in our turning world." How true. While civilizations rise and fall, the cross of Jesus, where the Lord offered himself for the redemption of the human race, is the still point. All people, of every time and place can find security in the self-emptying love of Jesus crucified. No matter how tumultuous the events of life and history become, we can always rest in the profound realization that we are loved so much by God that he sent his Son to wash away our sins in his blood.

On September 14, the liturgy of the Church celebrates the Exultation of the Cross. Whether or not you can attend Mass that day, I encourage you to spend a few minutes praying before a crucifix in your home. Perhaps there is a story about how you acquired the crucifix or how long it has been in your home. Try to reflect on how the Lord has watched over, blessed and protected you. How has the cross of Jesus been a still point in your life? Thank Jesus for his love and redeeming sacrifice. With heartfelt gratitude join me praying: "We adore you, O Christ and we praise you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world."

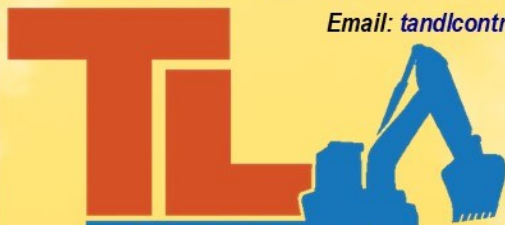
