

THIRTY– SECOND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

The epitaph of Benjamin Franklin: In one of his lighter moments, Benjamin Franklin (one of the most important Founding Fathers of the United States: author, political theorist, politician, printer, scientist, inventor, civic activist, and diplomat), penned his own epitaph. It seems he must have been influenced by Paul's teaching on the resurrection of the body. Here's what he wrote: The Body of B. Franklin, the former printer lies here, food for worms, like the cover of an old book: its contents torn out, and stripped of its lettering and gilding. But the work shall not be wholly lost: for it will, as he believed, appear once more in a new & more perfect edition, corrected and amended by its Author.

In today's gospel, Jesus is approached by some Sadducees who question him about the resurrection. Like so many of us, the Sadducees clung to their own way of thinking which led them to be religiously conservative, opposing any doctrine that did not fit into their way of thinking and living. They believed only in the present life, they enjoyed the present without any worry or concern about the afterlife and hence they questioned the resurrection. In today's gospel, they pose a tricky rabbinical question to Jesus to catch him. They attempt to ridicule the resurrection of the dead by recalling the Mosaic Law on levirate marriage, which stated that if a man dies and has no son, and therefore no legal heir, his brother must marry the widow. In this way, the continuity of the family would be guaranteed.

The Sadducees develop their example to absurdity in instancing seven brothers each of whom marries the same woman, but each of whom dies childless. Jesus in his response elevates the discussion to give a deeper understanding of

the resurrected life. Firstly, he said we should not look at the afterlife from our human and limited perspective. Life there is quite different. Secondly, since the Sadducees held only to the Law of Moses, Jesus returned to that citing the remarkable incident of Moses encountering God in the burning bush where he identifies himself as the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. When Moses heard from God, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob were long dead, yet God said "I am the God of these three patriarchs" not "I was" but "I am!" their God. So Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob still lived! So the creative power of God brings about life after death! The Sadducees became silent. Jesus had shown them that God was the God of life, and God of the living, and those who believe live forever.

Civilize It: Dignity Beyond the Debate will ask Catholics to pledge civility, clarity, and compassion in their families, communities, and parishes, and call on others to do so as well. ST. MARY'S HISTORICAL THREE CHAIN THURIBLE RESTORED.

As a gift to the Parish a parishioner has generously commissioned the restoration of the traditional three chain thurible used in solemn Liturgical celebrations.

Hidden away for decades inside a dusty closet in the Church Sacristy, it was brought out of retirement! It was used this past year as an in-

cense pot, during the Lenten Stations of the Cross. A parishioner recognized the beauty, history and importance to preserve our history and offered to have it restored. From all indications this relic dates prior to 1957.

The thurible is used in some of the key moments of the Eucharistic celebration: the beginning, before the reading of the Gospel, during the Offertory, and at the moment of consecration. During the funeral, the priest spreads the smoke of the thurible on the coffin containing the corpse to bless and purify it. Similarly, representations of the Virgin Mary and the saints are censered.

The term 'censer' comes from the Latin thus, *Thuris* "incense." This is also the origin of censer's synonym is derived: it is sometimes called 'incense'. In Latin, it was also referred to as *thymiate-rium*, *incensorium*, *and fumigatorium*.

The traditional thuribles commonly are equipped with four chains that make possible the suspension and ritual with which they are shaken on the assembly of the faithful. Three of the chains are used to hold up the thurible, the fourth also serves to raise the lid and insert the incense. St. Mary Parish has always been blessed with parishioners who give of their time, talent and treasure. This treasure of our past, will once again be used as an expression of our prayers and love of God's Church.
