November 13, 2022 THIRTY- THIRD SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME Deacon Candidate Dan Laquet

When Jesus died, resurrected, and ascended into heaven He ushered in a new age in our world, the time between His first coming and His eventual second coming. By sending the Holy Spirit upon His church He has prepared and strengthened us to endure until He returns in glory.

In our first reading, the prophet Malachi tells us that "Lo, the day is coming." The prophets in the Old Testament constantly reminded the people of Israel to await the time of the Lord, when He would bring together everyone, of all nations, for judgement. It reminds us of many scripture passages that warn us to always be ready, for we do not know the time nor the place of His return.

Jesus forewarns His Apostles about the day of His return in today's Gospel passage. He cautions them about not being deceived by false prophets, and relates to them signs that will occur that will signal His approaching return. In fact, many of these signs have already occurred and are documented in New Testament writings. There are mentions of natural disasters, famines, droughts, and the eventual destruction of the Temple. Widespread persecution of Jesus' followers is taking place, including imprisonment and believers being put to death. These signs represent reoccurring events in the life of the Church, both in the New Testament and today.

The destruction of war, natural disasters, famines, and drought are as prevalent today as they were in Jesus' time. Persecution and ridicule of believers, in an increasingly secular and God-less society, is commonplace. St. Paul exhorts the Thessalonians in our second reading to use the Apostles as models on how to live their lives in a faith community. We must persevere, like them, in our faith. We are confronted with unbelievers, cultural forces, and political authorities who are hostile to God and our beliefs. The lives of the Apostles and Saints are relevant models for us today just as they were in their own times.

St. Bernard of Clairvaux speaks of three advents, or comings. The first is when Jesus took on human flesh and human weakness, the last will be when He returns in glory and majesty. St. Bernard spoke then of the "Adventus Medius," the middle coming. Jesus comes to us in the form of the Word of God, in the Eucharist, in the other sacraments, and in our interactions with others. It is vitally important that we, as a community of faith, draw strength from the communal prayer of the Mass and the Eucharistic celebration, frequent reception of the sacrament of reconciliation, and staying in prayerful communication with the Father. These acts will continue to prepare us for the return of Jesus, so that we will always be ready.

Handing On The Faith 04 November 2022

Dear Friends.

Often as a priest and now as a bishop, I meet people who ask me about how to "hand on" our Catholic faith to their children and families. Many adults realize that we cannot assume that our culture and everyday life will support the importance of believing in God or practicing as a Catholic. In fact, it seems that the culture has changed so much in the past twenty years that the priorities of many people have changed, and that faith and religious practice are not as important to many people as before.

What helps us hand our Catholic faith on to the next generation of our families? Sharing with our family the importance of our life with Jesus Christ is important if we want the spark to catch in the hearts of our children and grandchildren. Plus, we have to model the importance of living as Catholics and share things about who is Jesus Christ and why he is important in our lives if we hope that others will come to know and believe in him. For instance, because my father shared with me his interest and support for Chicago sports teams by watching many games together on television or talking about sports at the breakfast table, I knew which were his favorite teams and they became my favorite teams. On a much deeper level, it was vital that my parents both spoke with me about the importance of Sunday Mass, prayer and works of charity as well as showing me that importance by taking time for Mass together, prayer and acts of charity. I did not have to guess at what my parents believed because they talked to me openly about their beliefs and showed me what was important by how they spent their time during the week. When our family filled a pew in the parish church and each of us was kneeling next to one another praying on a Sunday morning, it made an impression upon me.

Young people are impressionable. As parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles, we have the opportunity to make a meaningful impression upon the young people in our families. If we are vague about our faith or our values, or we keep private those experiences of God that formed us, we miss the opportunity to make a positive lasting impression on our families. As we move toward Thanksgiving, share with your family why you are grateful to God. In Advent, share with them why the presence of Jesus is so important

to you. Steadily sharing your faith, praying with our youth and showing the importance of serving the Lord can be great ways to plant the seeds of faith in the hearts and souls of the young people in our lives.

Please be assured of my prayers for you and your families this Thanksgiving.
