December 25, 2022 CHRISTMAS

It's still dark outside. Eyes are full of sleep. There's a chill in the house. (Why hasn't the furnace kicked on yet? Ugh!) Pure joy and exhilaration fill little minds and bodies (and some big ones, too!) as the morning has finally arrived – THE morning. Christmas. Sweet, glorious Christmas morning is here.

Do you remember just how excited you used to be? Do you remember how happy your children could get? Have you seen the joy on your grandchildren's faces and heard their laughter on Christmas? There is just simply nothing like it in this life. Finally receiving that fancy, expensive bike or doll set or video game system that you full well knew would probably always be out of your reach. Normal trips to the store never resulted in purchases of the coolest and most expensive things. They never did.

But on this morning, on this day, reality is somehow suspended; the normal rules do not apply. On Christmas morning magic happens...

Now, maybe some believe the experience of Christmas morning is problematic; that Christmas is more about selfishness and greed than giving. But I contend the magic of Christmas morning, with all of its dreams, all of its excitement, and all of its "stuff," is precisely right. For you see, the message of Jesus, the central meaning of Christianity, involves a great gift. It is a gift that must be RECEIVED. It is a gift that must result in great JOY and LOVE. For on this day, many years ago, a babe was born in Bethlehem, God himself! And He came to save us.

May we realize that our Christmas traditions are grounded in this gift of God from God. May we receive it with joy. Our eternal lives depend on it. May God bless you this Christmas! Thank you for being here. Pax Christi, Robb

CHRISTMAS AND THE EUCHARIST 19 December 2022

As I write this column, we are getting ready for Christmas which will be celebrated on a Sunday this year. Christmas 2022 will likely see the most crowded Sunday Masses in southern Illinois in at least three years, given how we were impacted so much by the coronavirus. I am praying that this Christmas Sunday will be for many of our faithful the rebirth of our regular practice of participating in the Sunday Mass, and that those who have lapsed for whatever reason will resume attending Mass regularly.

But it is not just a matter of trying to return to where we were at Christmas in 2019. Because even then we were seeing the widening erosion of attendance at Mass as we discovered more and more baptized Catholics were struggling with their doubts. In our communities today there are many people who have doubts: doubts about God, doubts about the Church, and doubts about the future. I am particularly mindful of the people who are baptized Catholics who express doubt that Jesus Christ is truly and really present in the Holy Eucharist. I frequently think about the Risen Christ appearing to "doubting Thomas" the apostle and saying: "Do not persist in unbelief but believe." But how do we help our brothers and sisters come to faith and believe?

As Catholics, we believe that during the Mass, ordinary bread and wine are changed and Jesus Christ becomes really present: body, blood, soul, humanity and divinity. How can we open the hearts and minds of the many people who doubt that Jesus is actually present in the Holy Eucharist? I think more people will come to believe that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist, when we, who receive Jesus in Holy Communion, change so much for the better in our lives that people can see the presence of Jesus in us through our compassion, forgiveness, generosity and selflessness. There is a deep Catholic belief that when we receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, we become what we have received. When our lives and actions reflect the vital force of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, we become the living proof of his real presence. When Jesus has obviously taken hold of our lives, and the pattern of our living is a mirror of the pattern of his life, Christ is making the miracle of the Eucharist credible through us.


Dear friends, it should not be lost on us that Jesus was born in Bethlehem, a name that means "House of Bread". It should not be lost on us that the Virgin Mary placed the infant Jesus in a manger or feeding trough, because the Christ Child would one day become the Bread of Life for humanity that is starving for communion with God. As we receive Jesus in the Eucharist this Christmas, let us then be the proof of the real presence of Jesus by our very lives; allowing God to make each one of us a living sign of the power and presence of Jesus to our waiting world.

In the New Year, we will have numerous events as part of the national Eucharistic Revival to help each of us grow in appreciation of the miracle of the Eucharist. I will be visiting each region of our diocese to give a talk on the Eucharist and celebrate Mass with the people. Watch


Sacrament of Matrimony: The engaged couple should contact the Parish Office, six months prior to the intended date.
