May We Open Our Hearts To Christ 28 December 2022

As I am sitting here on December 28 writing this column, I am absorbing the remarks in Rome today by Pope Francis and the Holy See press office concerning the declining health of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI. I pray each day for Pope Francis and for Pope Emeritus Benedict and invite you to join me in asking God to bless them.

Today I find myself thinking back to Christmas 2010. I was a pastor in the Archdiocese of Chicago and our parish was developing our social communications. Just before Christmas, Pope Benedict XVI was the guest speaker for a BBC radio program, "Thought for the Day." Our parish posted a video we created including Pope Benedict's short address on the BBC. Ever since then I've returned to his words each Christmas.

Pope Benedict said:

The child that was born in Bethlehem did indeed bring liberation, but not only for the people of that time and place—he was to be the Savior of all people throughout the world and throughout history.

And it was not a political liberation that he brought, achieved through military means: rather, Christ destroyed death for ever and restored life by means of his shameful death on the Cross.

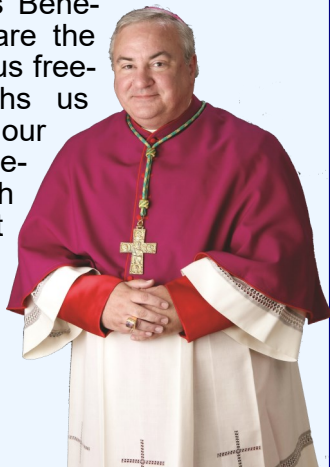
And while he was born in poverty and obscurity, far from the centers of earthly power, he was none other than the Son of God.

Out of love for us he took upon himself our human condition, our fragility, our vulnerability and he opened up for us the path that leads to the fullness of life, to a share in the life of God himself.

As we ponder this great mystery in our hearts this Christmas, let us give thanks to God for his goodness to us, and let us joyfully proclaim to those around us the good news that God offers us freedom from whatever weighs us down; he gives us hope, he brings us life.

As we move toward the conclusion of the Christmas Season and cross the threshold of a new civil year, may we open our hearts to Christ. With Pope Francis and Pope Emeritus Benedict let us receive and share the good news that God offers us freedom from whatever weighs us down: our sin history, our struggles, our discouragement. May we rejoice with fresh hearts that Christ gives us hope, he brings us life.

RESPECT LIFE



Soon after the birth of my son Charlie*, who has Down syndrome, a visitor asked whether he was "mild, moderate, or severe"—referring to his level of cognitive impairment. I knew the terminology, but the question shocked me. In my arms I held my beautiful baby boy, who defied easy categorization. Clinical labels may describe some aspects of an individual's "functioning," but they don't tell the whole story. Labels could not describe how Charlie's smile lit up a room or how the sweetness of his soul had captured our hearts so completely.

I once read an article in which a woman discussed the reasons for aborting her child with Down syndrome. The deal-breaker was watching a boy with Down syndrome at a restaurant with his parents: they had to hand-feed him a slice of pizza and wipe his face with a napkin.

This hit home for me. We weaned Charlie off a feeding tube when he was seven, spoon-feeding him and often wiping his face afterwards. I wonder how many people saw us and decided a life like his isn't worth living. Had anyone asked, I would have said, "It might look a little crazy from the outside, but he's an amazing little boy, and it's a good life."

It's like looking at a stained-glass window from the outside: the colors look dark, and you can't quite make out the figures. From the inside, however, with the sun shining through it, the effect can be brilliant. From inside our family, love illuminates our life with Charlie. What may seem dreary to others, perhaps even unbearable, is actually filled with beauty and color. We know, for instance, that Charlie worked hard to gain basic feeding skills that most people take for granted, and we are so proud of his valiant efforts.

Many parents want perfect children, and our culture is obsessed with superficial perfection. Photos are airbrushed, and social media depicts seemingly perfect lives. However, God calls us to seek perfection not in appearance or abilities, but in love.

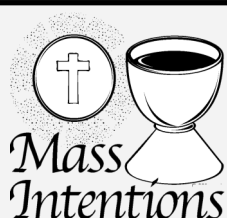
Sacrament of Matrimony: The engaged couple should contact the Parish Office, six months prior to the intended date.

Merry Christmas!

Thank you so much for all of your holy prayers, support, and patience within this first year of my priesthood! To be honest, it has been quite a wild journey settling into my parish assignment at the Church of St. Joseph in Dickinson with Fr. Justin Waltz and teaching for my very first semester at Trinity Catholic School with Fr. Christian Smith and Fr. Grant Dvorak! In this time of transition into the priesthood and back into the Diocese of Bismarck, it has meant a lot to me to be surrounded by so many other experienced and supporting priests and families!

After graduating from Kenrick Seminary in St. Louis and receiving the life-long gift of my new priestly identity in Jesus Christ in service to his holy Church, I spent the summer with Fr. Waltz cleaning, organizing, and fixing things for our new assignment together at St. Joseph. Toward the end of the summer, I flew down to Fort Washington in Maryland to baptize my new nephew Theodore at a parish in the liturgical tradition of the Ordinariate of the Chair of St. Peter. Shortly after, I began teaching High School for the first time at Trinity Catholic Schools, teaching Sacred Scripture to half of the seniors and to all of the sophomores. I also taught Latin for the 5th and 6th grade music class with Testudo - my Latin Pokémon helper - so that they could chant the Latin ordinary parts of the Mass. Once a month, I taught a dozen students how to solve the Rubik's Cube for Trinity's Great Teams program. For city-wide faith formation through the Catholic Academy, I have been involved with the curriculum and teaching of the public -school students for the four parishes in Dickinson.

A new religious presence in Dickinson has also been a great help to my priestly mission. Seminarian Colton Steiner has been substituting regularly for my classes, especially on Mondays - my day off for rest. I am good friends with Colton from our time together at the seminaries both in St. Paul and in St. Louis. Colton is also originally from St. Joseph in Dickinson, which is another great connection as he serves across town at St. Wenceslaus with Fr. Robert Shea. In addition, it has been very exciting to welcome the Handmaids of the Heart of Jesus not only to the Diocese of Bismarck but to Dickinson. I have known the Handmaids since I was in High School, and it has been a joy helping them settle into their newly renovated Convent for the city. I was honored to be the first priest to celebrate mass for them once they moved in, and I was also able to attend Bishop Kagan's official consecration of their convent altar for generations to come! A very special blessing has been the presence of my own sister, Sr. Thérèse Marie ACJ, as one of the Handmaids! I am looking forward to serving alongside my “sister” sister and the other Handmaids to help people encounter Jesus Christ!

In addition to attending various sports events, activities, and concerts, Mrs. Kelli Schneider, Colton Steiner, and I took the freshman class on a pilgrimage to St. Clement's Oratory to visit the grave of my 2nd Cousin Michelle Duppong, who is currently in the canonization process to become an officially recognized saint! I was able to celebrate mass for the students, lead them in prayer at the gravesite, and connect them with the witness of Michelle's sister Rene to inspire them to also live saintly lives.

Now that the final exams from the semester are now over and Fr. Waltz and I are finally settled into our living and working spaces, Fr. Justin Waltz at St. Joseph in Dickinson has generously sent me back to my family for my first Christmas as a priest and so that I could celebrate my first Christmas masses with his brother Fr. Josh Waltz at St. Joseph in Mandan! Right after Christmas, I am going on a 20-day pilgrimage to the Holy Land with my classmates through Kenrick-Glennon Seminary, led by my Sacred Scripture professors, Fr. Charles Samson and Dr. Stephen Fahrig. I am thrilled to be able to form my biblical imagination by the very places where Jesus walked on earth so that I can connect others more deeply to the humanity and the divinity of Jesus! 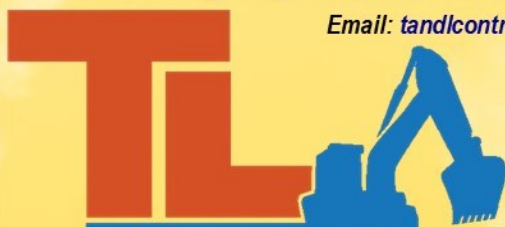
