### 4th. SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME Sunday, January 29, 2023

One Sunday as they drove home from church, a little girl turned to her mother and said, "Mommy, there's something about Father's message this morning that I don't understand." The mother said, "Oh? What is it?" The little girl replied, "Well, he said that God is bigger than we are. He said God is so big that He could hold the whole world in His hand. Is that true?" The mother replied, "Yes, that's true, honey." "But Mommy, he also said that God comes to live inside of us when we believe in Jesus as our Savior. Is that true, too?" Again, the mother assured the little girl that what Father had said was true. With a puzzled

look on her face the little girl then asked, "If God is bigger than us and He lives in us,

wouldn't He show through?"

When St. Paul wrote his first letter to the Corinthian church, he wanted the members to remember the condition of their lives before they became Christians. He pointed out that most of them did not amount to much. "Not many of you were wise by human standards," Paul wrote, "not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth." In other words, they were mostly of the poorer class, not well-educated, "low and despised in the world" as Paul put it. Corinth, the city in which they lived, was a Grecian seaport on the Mediterranean. When the learned missionary, Paul, visited Corinth, he did not use sophisticated language. Jesus was the first to use language that was simple and easy to understand. Just as Paul did, Jesus related the kingdom of God simply. Yes, God is bigger than us, and smaller than us. And he does shine through, it's that simple to understand. God dwells, wherever he is welcomed.

### RESPECT LIFE



More women and girls consider abortion than we may realize. They are our relatives and friends, our babysitters, teammates, people who work with us or for us, married or unmarried. Even if someone identifies as being pro-life, the shock of an unexpected pregnancy, the devastation of a difficult prenatal diagnosis, shame, pressures, or fears may influence her to consider abortion.


If someone shared with you she was pregnant and hadn't ruled out having an abortion, would you know how to respond? The answer can be summed up in an old adage: We have two ears and one mouth, and should use them in that proportion.

Although the first instinct may be to convince her that abortion ends a baby's life, hearing facts is not the first thing she needs. Research shows that many women in a pregnancy crisis think, "This is the end of my life as I know it." To face the challenges before her, your friend needs to know you care about her for her own sake and she is not alone.

First listening to your friend will help build trust and facilitate openness. Eventually, when she knows you truly care about her and she trusts you, you can share the truth in love. You can share facts about abortion, her own intrinsic worth, and the practical help and support available so she can choose life for herself and her baby.

A truly loving approach reflects St. Paul's description of love in his first letter to the Corinthians: "If I speak in human and angelic tongues, but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal. ... Love is patient, love is kind" (1 Cor. 13:1,4).


**Sacrament of Matrimony**: The engaged couple should contact the Parish Office, six months prior to the intended date.

I am happy to announce that we are going "high tech," and have added an exciting way to get the latest updates at our parish. Many of us have chosen to use cell phones and email to communicate. Over the past five years the number of landlines continue to decline. The days of the household phone are gone, replaced by individual phones that fit into our pockets.

St. Mary and St. Lawrence Parishes have joined an exciting service that is endorsed by the Belleville Diocese called, *flocknote*. This texting and email service will provide a direct link when important information that needs to be announced. You can join different groups. For example, join the "Prayer Warriors, and receive a text when someone requests special prayers. You can join the Monday Bible Study Group, and receive updates about gatherings and cancelations. Join the Altar Society, Quilting Ladies, PTO, Knights of Columbus, Finance Council or Pastoral Council groups and you will be notified of upcoming events, meetings and cancelations.

By signing up you will automatically be placed into the general group for St. Mary or St. Lawrence Parishes. In the event that Mass is canceled due to weather or illness there would be no need to leave your home, you will receive a text message.

There is no cost to you to sign-up. You may sign-up for both parishes, and non-parishioners who wish to receive updates are welcomed to join. It's so easy to join! Using your cell phone just send a text to 84576. In the message line type: ORPHANS for St. Mary and BLACKHAWKS for St. Lawrence and follow the directions. (has nothing to do with the sports teams it just easy to remember)
