#### 5th. SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME Sunday, February 5, 2023

Today's gospel speaks of the practical implications of being followers of Jesus Christ. Jesus uses simple images which would be easily understood by his Palestinian followers. "You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world." His listeners knew how essential salt was in those days. In fact people traded in salt as they traded in silver and gold. Salt was essential to flavour and preserve food. Its absence in food was immediately noticeable. Light too played an essential function of enlightening, guiding, and making ordinary tasks possible. What Jesus is saying through these images is that his disciples have an essential function to play in the world. When Jesus spoke of letting our light shine among men he was not speaking of parading our good works, or of attracting attention to ourselves. Our good deeds should inspire others to do what needs to be done in their own lives. Our deeds do not have to be spectacular because

even little deeds done regularly can make a difference in peoples' lives. As Christians we have a very positive role to play in the world. Shedding light and witnessing to the light not only makes people see things clearly but it also puts our own life under the spot light; we can be vulnerable and exposed. Just as salt is worthless if it loses its saltiness and light is useless if it is kept under covers, so the Christian life is meaningless unless faith is witnessed in love and concern for others. Religion is no private affair between me and my God. Our lives have to impact others and lead them to God.

In the first reading from Isaiah, the prophet speaks plainly about what is expected of the true believer. In earlier Jewish history, fasting and fast days were part of the liturgy, in which rich and poor 'humbled' themselves before God. The rich fasted and expected a divine reply in the form of greater prosperity. They asked why God. did not answer their prayer. In today's reading the prophet tells them that for fasting to be acceptable to God it must be meaningful. Genuine fast before God requires the social awareness and concern spelled out by the prophet. "Share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor, clothe the man you see naked....then your light will shine like the dawn." It is by such actions that genuine worship gives glory to God.

When Jesus told his disciples they were the "light of the world," he meant they were to be reflectors of the light of God. God is the illuminating source. God provides the light that is reflected from us. And God needs us to be reflectors of God's light to a world of darkness.

#### RESPECT LIFE



In 1971, the renowned physician and medical ethicist, Dr. Leon Kass, used this parable to illustrate the coming wave of assisted reproductive technologies, hailed by science as a final triumph over infertility; scientists were on the verge of creating children outside the womb and inside the laboratory. Dr. Kass feared that we had not given adequate consideration to the question of how this might affect the couples pursuing these methods and the children produced from them. Forty years later, we're just beginning to understand the consequences of such technologies.

When couples are unable to bear children, very often there is an understandable feeling of great loss. It is essential to note that "the Church has compassion for couples suffering from infertility and wants to be of real help to them. At the same time, some 'reproductive technologies' are not morally legitimate ways to solve those problems The inevitable result is that the child is initially treated as an object created for the parents' self-fulfillment instead of welcomed as a gift of God.

Since the advent in 1978 of IVF (in vitro fertilization), by which children are "conceived" by technicians working in labs, the floodgates have been opened to bringing about reproduction through egg and sperm donation and surrogate pregnancies. Yet these technologies are fraught with medical, legal, and moral complications that are often either unknown or too easily dismissed.

The very technologies that some believed would solve the age-old problem of infertility have, in fact, raised more questions than answers—questions about the meaning and purposes of children, and the limits and detriments of technology when it intervenes in the most intimate of human relationships. . So instead, "in love, hope, and prayer, ... let us be open to God's gift of life and love in marriage, with profound respect for the dignity of all God's children."[7]

# The Beatitudes 30 January 2023

Dear Friends in Christ,

On the Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time, as we listened to Matthew's gospel account of Jesus teaching the crowd the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:1-12a), I thought of Jesus as an artist, sketching the features of a person for a portrait. As Jesus declared: Blessed are the poor in spirit, blessed are they who mourn, blessed are the meek; it seemed to me that the person who is blessed and lives the Beatitudes first and foremost is Jesus himself. In some ways, Jesus is presenting the crowd with a self-portrait which displays the spiritual features of Jesus. These features express the mystery of Jesus' identity, an identity that is finally revealed through his cross and resurrection.

Jesus invites us to be Christians and as such to follow him and walk toward the mystery of his cross and resurrection. As Pope Benedict XVI pointed out in a homily, to the extent we accept Jesus' proposal and set out to follow him, we can participate in his blessedness. We can share in the meaning of being people who hunger and thirst for justice, be people who live with pure hearts, offer mercy and strive to be peacemakers. With the help of Jesus and only with the help of Jesus, we can live as people of the Beatitudes and become perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect (Mt: 5, 48).

Pope Francis commented on the Beatitudes in Matthew's gospel, noting that Jesus begins with the word: "Blessed". Jesus is making a proclamation of an unprecedented happiness. Beatitude... is above all a joyful discovery of being God's beloved sons and daughters. And this discovery fills us with joy. It is not a human achievement; it is a gift we receive. We are holy because God, who is the Holy One, comes to dwell in our lives (Angelus Address November 1, 2021).

Dear Friends, in the weeks before we arrive at Ash Wednesday and the Season of Lent, I encourage each of you to take time in prayer and consider the spiritual features of Jesus. When is he merciful? When is he poor in spirit? When do you see how clean and pure is the heart of Jesus? Try to write down what you noticed in a journal. My

hope is that by recognizing the features of Jesus through reflecting on the gospel, the liturgy and our daily lives, we might develop a portrait of who is Jesus. May his spiritual goodness and purity of heart draw us closer to him so that the features of his being and the pattern of his life are made present in our own lives, too.
