#### First Sunday of Lent February 26, 2023

The Holy Father Francis' Message for Lent 2023 is entitled "Lenten Penance and the Synodal Journey". The text was presented in the Holy See Press Office on Friday, February 17. In his message for Lent this year, the Holy Father chooses the Gospel of the Transfiguration, inviting us to an experience of Lenten penance in which we are called to "ascend a high

mountain' in the company of Jesus". Like the disciples who were led by the Master to Mount Tabor, we will not be alone on this uphill journey, but in the company of our brothers and sisters. This is the reason why, Pope Francis reminds us, our Lenten path is a synodal journey. At the end of a pathway that "requires effort, sacrifice and concentration", we will arrive to the summit, where "the panorama that opens up at the end amazes us and rewards us by its grandeur".

We know we should be committed to prayer, fasting and almsgiving: What practical tips can be offered to help Catholics do so with true intention and not become too discouraged throughout the journey? I am a big fan of choosing penances of prayer, fasting and almsgiving that are less arbitrary and more intrinsic to each person's life. What I mean by this is: We often choose a penance based on how "difficult" it seems or on the kind of challenge that it might pose to us. If a penance seems like it is serious enough (but maybe not too serious), then we might choose it. But often, our penances are not necessarily connected to what we absolutely need. When considering prayer, we can ask: "In what way do I need to grow closer to the Lord?" When considering fasting, we can ask: "What do I need to get rid of in order to be more free to love and serve the Lord?" And when considering almsgiving, we can ask: "Where do I believe that I am called to give or serve?" It can be helpful to recognize how high the stakes are. For example, we can try and face the question, "What can I absolutely not have in my life if I am going to be the saint God is calling me to be?"

Living penitentially is not easy, of course. How would you encourage Catholics who will inevitably struggle over these Lenten weeks, even as they know Easter hope is on the horizon? I think that this goes back to the two elements of knowing that what we do matters to God and choosing penances that truly matter to us.

When battered by life's storms, or immersed in a dense fog of suffering and uncertainty, we may feel alone and unequipped to handle the circumstances. Yet with words that echo through thousands of years into the corners of our hearts, the Lord says to us, "Do not fear: I am with you" (Isaiah 41:10).

He speaks these words not as one who merely observes our pain, but as one who experienced immense suffering. And the very wounds that bear witness to his suffering indicate the essence of our identity and worth: we are loved by God.


Reflecting on the healed wounds of the Risen Christ, we see that even our most difficult trials can be the place where God manifests his victory. He makes all things beautiful. He makes all things new.

He is always with us. Jesus promised this when he gave the disciples the same mission he gives to each of us: Go. Go be my hands and feet to a world enslaved by fear. Go to the woman who is unexpectedly pregnant and fears the future. Go to your friend who fears reprisal at work because he takes a stand for the protection of human life. Go to your aging parent in failing health who fears being a burden. And go to others, too, for their support.

We don't need to have everything figured out. We can simply follow the guidance of Our Blessed Mother, the first disciple: "Do whatever he tells you" (John 2:5).
Walk with each other. Do not be afraid to embrace God's gift of life.

Whatever storms or trials we face, we are not alone. He is with us.

"Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20).



### **1st Sunday of Lent**

"It is written: 'The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve." Matthew 4:10

Tempted between the riches and power of this world and service to God, Jesus chose service to His Father. If we wish to truly follow Jesus, we, too, must decide to turn away from worldly power and riches and put God at the center of our lives. 

During Lent, the Christian faithful are obliged to do penance through prayer, fasting, abstinence and by performing works of piety and charity. Even outside of Lent, the bishops in the U.S. still exhort the faithful to observe all Fridays as days of penance in recognition of Friday as the day of our Lord's death and in preparation for the heavenly banquet at Sunday Mass.

#### **Fasting**

Fasting is an ancient practice whose importance can be seen time and again throughout the Old and New Testaments of the Bible. Everyone age 18 and up to their 59th birthday is obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Only one full meal is allowed on days of fasting. Two other meals, often called collations, may be taken to maintain strength according to one's needs. When combined, these collations should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals and collations is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. The obligation does not apply to those whose health or ability to work would be seriously affected.

#### **Abstinence**

Everyone age 14 and older is to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. In the Midwest, highend seafood can often be a luxury and a significant expense, especially when consumed at restaurants. While consuming such food certainly observes the "letter of the law" in regards to the obligation, in order to reap the most bountiful spiritual fruits, the faithful should ensure their intention is united to the "spirit" of such obligations.

## Sant Patrick's Day, Friday, March 17, 2023 Dispensation for the Faithful

Bishop McGovern has granted a dispensation for the Faithful for Friday, March 17, 2023. The regulation to abstain from eating meat is lifted for that Friday only. The faithful are encouraged to perform another act of Prayer or Almsgiving on St. Patrick's Day.

### **Prayer - Fasting - Almsgiving**

It is popular for Catholics to "give something up" for Lent. This is not required by the Church, but it is often encouraged as a way to detach from the things of the world and focus our attention on God and heaven. This helps a soul prepare for Easter and grow in holiness at the same time.

We owe God everything and he owes us nothing. Yet, he has given us everything and we often give very little in return. Consider showing your deep love and trust for God by giving something up that you think will be very difficult. Resign yourself to him in complete trust and let him be your guide through the long journey of Lent. If you slip and give in during the journey, the only shame comes if you abandon your sacrifice completely as if it has lost all its merit. Turn again to him who never turns from you, and ask him to give you the resolve to rise once more and push on to that great and holy Easter day.

#### Lent 2023: Be Missionaries of Compassion

Dear Friends in Christ,

As I participate in conversations about what are our priorities in the Diocese of Belleville, I frequently hear about the importance of evangelization, and the need for Catholics to live as "missionary disciples". I find such conversations beg a question or two: What does a "missionary disciple" look like? How can I live as a "missionary disciple"?

As we move into the Season of Lent, I am advocating that we Catholics live as "Missionaries of Compassion" in order to be credible and effective missionary disciples. I encourage our readers to think back to the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy initiated by Pope Francis in December 2015. The Holy Father himself was a "Missionary of Compassion" as he frequently took time on Fridays of that year to reach out to the poor, the sick and people living on the margins of society. "Mercy Friday" activities by Pope Francis included a surprise visit to people suffering from Alzheimer's disease. Such surprise visits by the Holy Father were wonderful signs of God's kingdom opening up in our world.

I invite you to join me in taking time in Lent to open our hearts with compassion for people who are hurting and suffering, many of whom suffer quietly and alone. Let's take the time to visit a person in a nursing home who has few visitors or serve a meal to the homeless. Prayerfully consider what you might do and plan ahead to accompany our brothers and sisters in their need, if possible, in person on a Friday of Lent or as you can best manage to be present.

Many years ago, Fr. Jean Danielou, SJ a French Jesuit, wrote a book: The Salvation of the Nations.

Danielou noted that: "Our Lord assumed humanity in order to penetrate it with divine life." He continued "...the purpose of the Incarnation is to bring about, by reason of the union of divinity and humanity in Christ's person, the transfiguration of our nature, through which we are liberated from what St Bernard calls its "miseria", that is, not only sin but also all the consequences of sin, ...all limitations such as death, sickness, suffering, unbalance. Christ is even at this moment bringing this transformation about in

Recognizing how the Lord in his Mercy is lifting us up, can we be slow to extend his transforming power to the poor and the hurting? Let us embrace the mission Christ is entrusting to us. Let us be Missionaries of Compassion beginning this Lent. Please join me in allowing the Lord to use us to be surprising signs of God's kingdom in our world for those who are looking and longing for the loving presence of our Lord.


