The Importance of Conscience Protection 29 March 2023

Dear Friends in Christ,

Southern Illinois has many institutions dedicated to health care. There are a good number of hospitals, both Catholic and non-Catholic, that serve the people in our communities. Unfortunately some secular medical providers currently perform procedures that are objectionable because of their moral and ethical implications. There is a growing concern that medical staff (doctors, nurses, etc.) could experience pressure to participate in procedures at a hospital or clinic that violate the consciences of medical personnel. This week I am writing to you asking your full support for conscience protection for all medical personnel.

What is a human conscience? God creates us with a capacity to know and love him, and we have a natural desire to seek the truth about him. Fortunately, we don't search for God unaided; indeed, he calls us to himself and writes his law on our hearts to help us draw closer to him.

Conscience helps us hear the voice of God; it helps us recognize the truth about God and the truth about how we ought to live. Conscience is "a judgment of reason" by which we determine whether an action is right or wrong.

Jesus told the apostles, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." (John 14:15). We deepen our relationship with God by following him, and in doing so, we become more fully ourselves.

It is important we form our consciences through prayer and the sacraments, learning about our faith and the teachings of the Church (the Catechism of the Catholic Church is an excellent resource), reflecting on the example of people who would not violate their conscience even under pressure, and fostering friendships with people who help us to know the good and choose to do what is good.

My friends, I encourage you to learn more about how we can help health care professionals fulfill their hopes to be instruments of healing and not face pressure in their professional lives to participate in procedures such as abortions. Take the time to inform the leadership of medical institutions that you are an advocate for the staff members and want

assurances that no staff member will be expected to participate in morally objectionable practices that violate their consciences. For more information about conscience protection, see the website of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (www.USCCB.org).

Please know of my prayers for all of you as we approach Holy Week. May the Lord Jesus, the Bread of Life, bless you and your loved ones. In Christ.


In the motherhood of Our Lady, the Creator gives humanity the greatest example of motherhood for two reasons: it was the motherhood of her divine Son and it was the motherhood brought about by a woman who, was free from original sin and thus was full of grace, as the Archangel Gabriel proclaims at the Annunciation. She, as the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, is "the new Eve, 'full of grace' of the Holy Spirit, is preserved from sin and the corruption of death...." (2853). Our Lady was not only free from Original Sin but also: "By the grace of God Mary remained free of every personal sin in her whole life long." (CCC 493)

On the Cross, Jesus made Mary the mother of all, by giving her as mother to St. John the Apostle. This incredible gift is fully actualized by the ones who receive in baptism the magnificent status of adopted children of God and thus become incorporated into His divine family. At the same time her motherly heart is particularly concerned for the ones who have not received baptism through no fault of their own.

As a consequence, Mary's motherly heart has particular concern for the babies in the womb at risk of abortion. Her heart is also filled with compassion toward those children born in irregular situations and who are deprived of a proper family formed by a man and a woman committed to one another in a permanent and faithful union.
