DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY APRIL 16, 2023

A TIME magazine issue in 1984 presented a startling cover. It pictured a prison cell where two men sat on metal folding chairs. The young man wore a black turtleneck sweater, blue jeans and white running shoes. The older man was dressed in a white robe and had a white skullcap on his head. They sat facing one another, up-close and personal. They spoke quietly so as to keep others from hearing the conversation. The young man was Mehmet Ali Agca, the pope's would-be assassin (he shot and wounded the Pope on May 13, 1981); the other man was Pope John Paul II, the intended victim. The Pope held the hand that had held the gun whose bullet tore into the Pope's body. This was a living icon of mercy. John Paul's forgiveness was deeply Christian. His deed with Ali Agca spoke a thousand words. He embraced his enemy and pardoned him. At the end of their 20-minute meeting, Ali Agca raised the Pope's hand to his forehead as a sign of respect. John Paul shook Ali Agca's hand tenderly. When the Pope left the cell he said, "What we talked about must remain a secret between us. I spoke to him as a brother whom I have pardoned and who has my complete trust." This is an example of God's Divine Mercy, the same Divine Mercy whose message St. Faustina witnessed.

Who was Saint Faustina? Sister Faustina was born on August 25, 1905 in Glogowiec, Poland. From a very tender age she stood out because of her love of prayer, work, obedience, and also her sensitivity to the poor. At the age of seven she had already felt the first stirrings of a religious vocation. Helen made her first Holy Communion at the age of nine, which was very

profound moment in her awareness of the presence of the Divine Guest within her soul. She attended school for only three semesters. The Lord Jesus chose Sr. Maria Faustina as the Apostle and "Secretary" of His Mercy, so that she could tell the world about His great message, which Sr. Faustina recorded in a diary she titled Divine Mercy in My Soul. In an extraordinary way, Sr. Maria Faustina's work sheds light on the mystery of the Divine Mercy. It delights not only the simple and uneducated people, but also scholars who look upon it as an additional source of theological research. Sister Maria Faustina, consumed by tuberculosis and by innumerable sufferings which she accepted as a voluntary sacrifice for sinners, died in Krakow at the age of just 33 on October 5, 1938. On April 18, 1993 our Holy Father, John Paul II raised St. Faustina to the glory of the altars. She was canonized on April 30, 2000. St. Maria Faustina's remains rest at the Sanctuary of the Divine Mercy in Krakow-Lagiewniki.

I AM THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE

This year on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we read from the Gospel of John (John 11:1-45) at Mass about Jesus and his friends Martha, Mary and Lazarus, two sisters and their brother, who lived in the town of Bethany. Lazarus had died after being gravely ill. Martha and Mary are stricken with grief at the loss of their brother. When Jesus arrived in Bethany four days after Lazarus has passed away, Martha approaches Jesus and said:" Lord, if you had been here, my brother would never have died. Even now, I am sure that God will give you whatever you ask of him." Jesus assured Martha: "Your brother will rise again." "I know he will rise again", Martha replied, "in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her:

"I am the resurrection and the life: whoever believes in me, though he should die, will come to life; and whoever is alive and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" "Yes, Lord," she replied. "I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God: he who is to come into the world."

As we reread these words in the light of the Resurrection of the Lord on Easter Sunday, we realize that Christ calls each of us, like Martha, to put our faith in him who is "the resurrection and the life." With the resurrection of Jesus, we realize that the Lord offers us not just the continuation of our earthly life, being revived like Lazarus in John's gospel, but Christ offers us a share in his resurrection. Jesus, Risen Lord, lives in a new dimension, freed from the limits of time and space, never to experience death again. United with the Risen Lord by our faith in him, we come to believe that death will not have the last word over our lives; rather the final word belongs to Christ, and it is a word of life and invitation: "Come to me, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world."

When we reflect on the cross, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we realize that his is a great victory over sin and death. The triumph of the Risen Christ is not a political or economic victory; rather it is the triumph of God's mercy. As the apostles and disciples see that the tomb is empty and begin encountering the risen Lord, they begin understanding that Jesus died on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins, and that his resurrection from the dead testifies to his identity as Son of God. "Do you believe this?" is the question the Lord places before us. Our answer is the same as Martha: "Yes, Lord, I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God: he who is to come into the world."

My prayer for all the faithful of the Diocese of Belleville this Easter is that we will each affirm our faith in Jesus, the resurrection and the life, by accepting his gifts of grace and entering more deeply, through prayer, scripture, sacraments and service into the fullness of life with him. A Blessed Easter. Christ is Risen! Christ is truly Risen!

RESPECT LIFE




April 16, 2023: Sunday of Divine Mercy On the Second Sunday of Easter, the Church celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy. It provides an important opportunity to share Christ's message of mercy, especially with those who suffer because of their participation in one or more abortions. By the age of 45, as many as 1 in 3 women have had an abortion, and a similar number of men and family members have been involved. Many feel that abortion is "the unforgivable sin." They need to hear that, through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, God forgives every sin of a repentant heart, even the sin of abortion. In fact, Jesus' message to St. Faustina is that the greater the sinner, the greater the right to His mercy.

Saint Faustina Kowalska's diary, Divine Mercy in My Soul, tells of words spoken to her by Christ: "Let the greatest sinners place their trust in my mercy. They have the right before others to trust in the abyss of My mercy. My daughter, write about My mercy towards tormented souls. Souls that make an appeal to My mercy delight Me. To such souls I grant even more graces than asked. I cannot punish even the greatest sinner if he makes an appeal to my compassion, but on the contrary, I justify him in my unfathomable and inscrutable mercy."

Let us pray,

For those who have participated in an abortion and feel they have committed an unforgiveable sin: May they come to know the Lord's limitless mercy, and turn to Him for forgiveness and healing; We pray to the Lord: Lord hear our prayer!


