ORDINATION OF DEACONS

On Saturday June 3, I [ordained 14 candidates from the Diocese of Belleville to the Order of Deacon. Our candidates are Catholic men from the parishes of southern Illinois who have experienced the Lord's call to serve him and the Church in the ministry of deacon. Along with their wives, our candidates have participated in the various aspects of the formation program for about five years. It has been a privilege to get to know them since I arrived in Belleville in July 2020, and I look forward to developing the bond between us in the years ahead.

n the Catholic faith, Holy Orders is one of the seven sacraments. Within Holy Orders, we have the Order of Bishop, the Order of Priest, and the Order of Deacon. After the Second Vatican Council, the Church restored the possibility of a man being ordained a deacon and remaining in that order permanently. For many centuries, deacons were exclusively ordained as they prepared for ordination to the priesthood. For the past fifty years, deacons may be "transitional" (moving toward priesthood) or permanent (remaining a deacon for life). All of our 14 candidates will be permanent deacons.

The Rite of Ordination of a Deacon includes several important moments; permit me to focus on three of them. First, the candidate promises obedience and respect to his bishop and the bishop's successors. A key aspect of the ministry of the deacon is service, and that service is performed in collaboration with the diocesan bishop. The deacon receives his assignment or "mission" in the diocese from the bishop. The bishop is the overseer of the diocese and has a responsibility to send the deacons to the place or ministry that the bishop believes the deacon can best serve the Lord and the Church at this time. Obedience, whether it be a bishop who is obedient to the pope, or a deacon obedient to his bishop, requires humility and flexibility. This is especially true when a cleric must set aside his personal preferences about where to live or serve and accept being sent to a place and a people that may be new and unfamiliar to him. In all of this, we rely on the Holy Spirit to help us to say "yes" to being sent.

A second important moment in the ordination rite is when the bishop places his hands silently on the head of the candidate for a few moments. The "laying on of hands" is the unbroken gesture of ordination going back to the time of the apostles. Once the bishop has finished imposing his hands on the head of each candidate, the bishop prays over the candidates asking for the Lord's help for them. The "laying on of hands" is normally surprisingly brief, with the bishop only imposing his hands for a few moments. I think the reason for that brevity is so that the focus is on Christ ordaining the candidates through the ministry of the bishop.

The third important moment in the ordination of a deacon is when the bishop hands the Book of the Gospels to the newly ordained deacon. The bishop says: "Receive the Gospel of Christ, whose herald you have become. Believe what you read, teach what you


believe and practice what you teach." This is a beautiful summation of the mandate that the deacon has received. It is also an excellent maxim for the deacon to follow.


Please join me in praying for our candidates for the diaconate and for their spouses and families. The ordination day will be a great joy for all the people of our diocese. May God who has begun such a great work in them, bring it to completion on the day of Jesus Christ.


